

DAVID BREARLEY IS BLUE AND GOLD, AND WELL READ!

In February over forty students and a dozen faculty and staff members gathered in the David Brearley Middle/High School Instructional Media Center to discuss two popular Young Adult novels.

The high school students, who had read Jay Asher's 13 Reasons Why, came to discuss the issue of teen suicide, and how effectively Asher presented it in his novel. In the novel, Clay Jensen listens to cassette tapes recorded by his friend Hannah Baker before she committed suicide. The tapes contain her messages to thirteen people in her town who played a role in her fatal decision, including the narrator Clay. The Brearley students discussed what they liked about the book, but most importantly, they discussed how it changed the way they see and treat each other at school. Several teachers, a guidance counselor, and the school's social

worker led the lively discussion.

The middle school students eagerly piled into the IMC and were ready to discuss Suzanne Collins' dystopian science fiction novel, The Hunger Games. Panem is a country in a place once known as North America; its privileged rulers in the Capital enjoy luxuries unknown to masses in the districts, such as hot water and a steady supply of food. After a failed uprising by the districts, the Hunger Games were created to serve as an annual reminder of the Capital's power. For the Hunger Games, two teenagers are chosen from each district, and sent to fight to the death in an arena. The students enthusiastically discussed the characters and unexpected twists of the story, and made predictions for the sequels. Many students are reading book two of the series for our next discussion, and are anxiously anticipating book three, which will be

released in August.

The book discussions, held twice a year in the past few years, have been expanded to four dates this school year, and are sponsored by the David Brearley Accreditation for Growth (A.F.G.) Reading Committee.

Zachary J. Kozak is the latest Kenilworth teen to earn Boy Scout's highest honor, the prestigious rank of Eagle Scout. Only about 2 percent of the boys that join Scouting make Eagle. He was honored by his family, friends and the community at an Eagle Court of Honor on January 20th at the Kenilworth VFW. Zachary thanked everyone who helped him on his trail to Eagle, "Thank you everyone who gave me support and kept on urging me forward until the day that I could call myself an Eagle Scout".

Zachary started scouting at the young age of seven. His father, John Kozak, was Pack Leader for the time Zack spent as a Cub Scout. He advanced through Tiger, Bobcat, Wolf, Bear, Webelos, and achieved the Arrow of Light. Immediately after graduating to Boy Scout Zachary joined Boy Scout Troop 83 led by Scoutmaster John Kozak and is generously sponsored by the VFW. Zachary's first position in the troop was Senior Patrol Leader and he

remained in that position for one year. He advanced through Scout, Tenderfoot, 2nd Class, 1st Class, Star, and Life and received Eagle on October 10th 2009. He earned 26 merit badges while on camping trips and at meetings. During his time in scouting Zack has served as Senior Patrol Leader, Assistant Senior Patrol Leader, Patrol Leader, Quartermaster, and Junior Assistant Scoutmaster.

Zack was a student at St. Theresa's for seven years. He played on the basketball team in 8th grade and played baseball for four years. He now attends David Brearley HS, played football freshman year and is currently on the Swim Team. Zachary attended Trooper Youth Week in Sea Girt NJ June 6th to June 13th. He graduated after getting a taste of what a State Trooper has to go through to be able to wear the uniform. Zachary is also certified in CPR and is a proud to be a regular blood donor. He plans to go on to college and return to Sea Girt in order to become a State Trooper.

Zachary's Eagle Project

My Eagle project consisted of two parts. The first part was to create a WWI Victory Garden behind the historical Nitschke House. The second was to create a tabletop display of the garden's contents and the history behind Victory Gardens. In both World Wars Victory Gardens were used by ordinary people just like you and me to help support the war that was raging all over the globe. Europe was especially in need of support. With the turmoil all around them vital supplies of food were becoming harder and harder to get to the besieged trenches and starving civilians. Farmers in America were being lured by high paying factory jobs rather than farming their own land causing problems with getting food overseas. Victory Gardens helped change that by relieving the stress on farmers by creating simple easy to grow plants in their backyards. By doing this civilians could help win the war and show patriotism by helping the fighting men abroad.

The tabletop display was by far the most time consuming part of the project. Gathering information online and ensuring that it was accurate and from the time period was a tedious task. I went on several websites and found information on the importance of War Gardens and about what types of plants were used. I then printed out the information and pictures of crops and placed them onto the large display, I then laminated it and the hard part of the project was done, or so I thought.

One hot day towards the end of the summer of 2008, several scouts and I set out to dig out the gardens base. Upon the first shovel we realized that this would be no easy task as we gazed at the unusual amount of rock in the dirt. We took shifts digging and piling the large rocks off to the side. After two hours of hacking and shoveling we were able to make out what seemed to be a suitable garden. We then dug out nine rows for the different plants and called it a day. Unfortunately, the garden would not be planted until the start of the next summer due to the rapidly cooling weather, When the weather finally became suitable to plant the scouts and set off once again to finish what we had started. By this time the dug out area was covered in grass, not a bad sign but the grass did have to be removed before anything could be planted. After some landscaping work we gently planted the seeds in the small dirt rows, watered them and prayed that they would grow, Thankfully within a few days the plants were growing. I continued to maintain and water the garden for the following months and by the end of the summer was beginning to produce edible vegetables. I then attended the Nitschke House's Flag Day ceremony where I presented my Eagle Project and provided information about the garden to curious guests. I was proud of what I had accomplished and to see that people appreciated the work we had done. Overall it was a great experience and was well worth the time and energy everyone put into it.

Fordham University professor James T. Fisher will do a reading from *On the Irish Waterfront: The Crusader, the Movie, and the Soul of the Port of New York*, his recently published social history of the Manhattan, Brooklyn and Hoboken docks, at 7:00 PM on Monday, March 22, at the Kenilworth Public Library. 
