PROUD TO BE AN AMERICAN DAY

Kawameeh Middle School held their annual Proud To be an American Day. The event is organized by teacher Ed Graf to show the students that they should be patriotic and be proud of their country. This year's honorees were Wayne Russo, a 9/11 victim; Nilton Cacoilo of Union, a marine who passed away; and Fred Stockham, winner of the Congressional Medal of Honor from World War I who is buried in Hollywood Cemetery. Additionally, a wreath was presented honoring the fallen men from Union who were killed in the Vietnam War.

Kawameeh Middle School raised \$3,000 through soliciting donations, conducting bake sales and by hosting a charity dinner at Cafe Z Restaurant. The funds will benefit wounded veterans serviced by the Thomas Jerome House. In addition, \$3,000 was raised for Chris Bartosh, a graduate from Union High School who contracted cancer due to his service in the Marine Corps., just like his best friend, Nilton Cacoilo.
