## STUDENTS FOR SOCIAL CHANGE LAUNCHES NEW CLUB

We vow to stand in the gap for women who were silenced by sexual assault & abuse. No more excuses. November 25th is the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women. #wearorange #studentsforsocialchange #thisisusweareone." This statement went public only a few days before the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women in North Plainfield High School. Instagram photos, tweets on Twitter, morning announcements, snapchats, and emails throughout the town were all the ways this new and determined group had decided to publicize not only this one important day, but gave a heads up to North Plainfield because these boys and girls are ready to start a change.

"The Students for Social Change club is for students to empower themselves and each other by confronting issues of social inequality within the school and community," says Nora Leary when asked about this new club. Every Friday, students are asked to think critically about the attitudes and assumptions that are present in their environment and to in turn educate and raise awareness within the school. Students are asked to think about issues concerning race, gender, and class inequality in such a way that they gain confidence in themselves as advocates for change. "Last spring, we [Nora Leary, Argie Kantilierakis, Jane Heinzelmann and Cara Colabelli] recognized a number of gender/social issues in our classrooms. We discussed ways to address these problems and developed the Students for Social Change club as a potential solution. Our goal for the club is for our students to raise awareness concerning issues of social justice within the school. By the end of the year, we would like for the students to choose a specific cause for which to raise awareness in the school and even fund-raise for this particular cause," explains Leary.

Because the Students for Social Change club is so diverse, there are more perspectives and opinions leading to more ideas for the club. Throughout the year the Students for Social Change club plans to continue raising awareness as successfully as they did for the Elimination of Violence Against Women. The members of Students for Social Change also plan to hold many

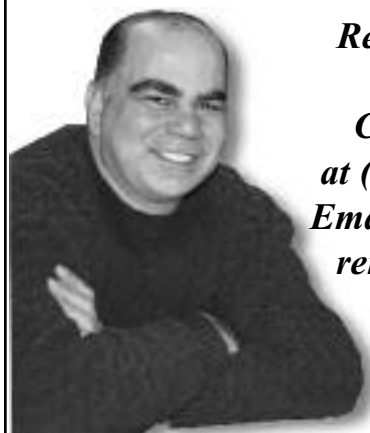

## SOMERSET COUNTY BAR FOUNDATION “MAKING A DIFFERENCE”

Each year the Somerset County Bar Foundation presents a variety of awards to community programs. This year \$250.00 was presented to the D.A.R.E. program in North Plainfield

Resistance Education, has been taught in North Plainfield since 1990 and by Detective Eric Fowler since 1996. The program used by Detective Fowler is the "Keeping It Real" program which is taught to fifth grade students at Somerset School. The program runs from January to April and culminates in a "graduation" where the students read essays and receive gifts provided by Municipal Alliance and Youth Services.

"I have taught 4500 kids and hope that I provided them with the essentials to lead healthy and safe lives," Detective Fowler stated. Mayor Michael Giordano, Jr. and Lieutenant Gerard Clyne were also present to receive the award. The funds for the awards presented by the Somerset County Bar Foundation come from the annual Legal Runaround and the UCare program offered by Unity Bank.

Apruzzese High School Mock Trial Competition, Law Day/Court Night Program, 5K “Legal Runaround”, Bikes4Kids, and a dinner with a basket raffle. The Foundation uses a portion of the proceeds from the fundraisers to support the Raymond R. Trombadore Scholarship and local non-profit organizations such as Legal Services, Middle Earth, Project DARE, Community Hope, S.T.E.P., Court Appointed Special Advocates, Alternatives, Inc., and Central Jersey Housing Resource Center among others.

The Annual 5K Legal Runaround is the major fundraising event for the Foundation. The event features kids dashes, a 3K poker walk and a USATF sanctioned 5K run through the streets of Somerville.
