FIFTY YEARS OF SERVICE AT THE CLARK PUBLIC LIBRARY

An exciting year is in store at the Clark Public Library, as the 50th anniversary of the opening of the public library in Clark is celebrated. Formed by referendum in 1961, the library has grown exponentially from its small storefront location on Lincoln Boulevard. It moved to its current location in 1966. The collection, which started with less than 600 books, now holds over 100,000 titles and multi media. Today, the library has meeting room facilities with wi-fi access, study rooms, a computer training lab, and a dedicated teen area. The library is valued by the community, as witnessed by 126,000 patron visits in 2010.

To ensure many more years of exceptional service, the Clark Public Library is undertaking a fundraising campaign in honor of the fifty year celebration. Patricia Anderson, Library Director commented, "While the Township of Clark funds the library for its operating costs, there are capital expenses and growing technological needs that place upward pressure on an already constrained budget. We are undertaking a significant fund raising task in order to continue the many fine programs and services enjoyed by preschoolers, teens, adults, seniors and business people."

Monies raised will be used to provide children's programs and services, purchase books and audio-visual materials and to upgrade the computers and servers. All gifts are tax deductible and checks should be made payable to Township of Clark - Library 50th Anniversary. Checks may be mailed or dropped off at the library.

Plans are underway for a celebration of the Library's 50 year milestone on Sunday, October 23rd at 2:00 p.m. Further details will be available in September and the public is welcome to attend. 

ANNUAL BACK TO SCHOOL PROJECT ST. JOHN THE APOSTLE FOOD PANTRY

St. John the Apostle Food Pantry is housed in the basement of the McGuinness Center (the former convent) located on Valley Road in Clark/Linden, NJ. Rahway and Winfield Park are in close proximity.

The St. John's food pantry is a partner agency of the Community FoodBank of New Jersey, located in Hillside. The agency in contracted to service Clark, Linden, Rahway, Roselle, Cranford Winfield, parts of Elizabeth and Newark. Depending on the weather the pantry services 650 – 700 clients a month.

Being a partner agency of Community FoodBank gives the pantry access to a cost effective means of providing food, for instance \$300 typically can purchase \$1,000 worth of food through the network. They also receive grants from the Community FoodBank and rely heavily on donations from parishioners.

St. John The Apostle Church donates the space and pays the electricity bill, the pantry has to keep several large refrigerators and freezers going. The pantry has to defray the cost for a rental truck and gas to pick up the food in Hillside and bring it back to the Pantry.

The Pantry was founded in 1991 by a former teacher Genevieve "Jean" Murphy, a resident of Winfield Park. Jean stayed involved with the pantry until her death in her 80's.

The current Director, Mary Ann Fiorillo, joined Jean in 1993, she remembers "I planned on helping out just a few hours a week but quickly wound up taking over the whole kit and caboodle."

Jean found a deep need in Winfield Park for a pantry, especially amongst the senior citizens. When Mary Ann took over as Director in 1993 there were about 60 clients. She started getting the word out though the church bulletin, newspaper articles and eventually a website. The Community FoodBank featured St. John's as one of the up and coming food pantries in their newsletter. Now Mary Ann estimates the pantry serves 300 families, 700-800 mouths to feed through 3 separate programs.

The Pantry still runs a satellite program in Winfield Park Recreation Center on the second Tuesday of the month from 10 a.m. -2 p.m. They service about 70 clients there, Mary Ann explained "It's in memory of Jean, and because many clients in Winfield, most are seniors, struggle with transportation."

On the third Tuesday of the month, the Pantry administers a state program at the Clark Recreation Cafeteria, 430 Westfield Ave. Clark is a shared program. They offer space and cooperation with volunteer staff. Nancy

Raymond, Clark's Health Officer, helps get the word out about the pantry, has the room set up, and solicits collections that can be dropped of at the Health Office. This month she put out a call for school supplies, the need changes almost monthly, baby items, cleaning items, soup and sandwich drives (any non-perishable you can make a sandwich with).

Because the pantry has run short of toys for Christmas distribution, Nancy set up the program "Christmas in July" a box will be located in the municipal building where new toys can be dropped until December.

Mary Ann has been married to her husband Tony, the assistant director, for 47 years, they lived in Cranford for most of those years, then moved to Orlando, FL for about 4 years and then settled in Rahway, in 1991. The couple are retired, but act as unpaid government workers. Maryann taught for 20 years in the Hillside School District mostly 1st grade, then for a short time at St. Agnes in Clark. Tony was in car sales, he joined Mary Ann at the pantry 7 years ago.

Through their contract with the Community FoodBank, the Pantry has an obligation to be open to the public 10 hours a week, however, St. John's, asked them to be on call for emergencies. They are on call 24/7.

Aside from distributing food, Mary Ann estimates she spends 35 hours a week processing paper work. Tony spends countless hours coordinating the pick up and delivery of the food, including the rental truck. It's a Herculean shopping trip. Several times a month the food has to be picked up in Hillside and brought back to St. John's. It then has to be organized it into several different refrigerator/freezers, then the truck needs to be returned to the rental company.

Mary Ann is always hunting through dollar stores for sales on items to stock their many programs they offer along with food, like the back to school program. She estimates she spends probably 10 hours a week minimum at

Sam's Club and the Restaurant Depot. The pantry distributes food 2-3 times a month and on holidays such as Easter, Valentines Day, Fourth of July, Back to School, Halloween, Thanksgiving and Christmas.

The Pantry is assisted by about a dozen volunteers, some are also generous financial supporters; several are retired Hillside teachers who worked with Mary Ann. The pantry is also assisted throughout the year by St. John's Boy's and Girl's Scout troops and confirmation candidates who need volunteer service hours, CCD students as well as St. John's students. The Pantry is always looking for young people to help with tasks such as assisting the elderly to carry their bags to the car.

Mary Ann says everyone that comes to the pantry is treated with dignity and respect by the volunteers, and that 99.3% of the clients are wonderful in return. She said "Everyone is unfortunate, we are all struggling in this economy, they just hit on bad times."

Because the Pantry can't fit everyone in their space inside, clients patiently line up outside the door waiting their turn, some sitting on folding chairs. The wait could be up to an hour. One week it was so hot the pantry served popsicles.

The Pantry administers three separate programs, based on what the state and federal government provides and what the Pantry can afford to supplement it with, once a month a client typically receives, 2 bags of non-perishables and 1 bag full on non-perishables.

About 60 Clark residents are served at the state program administered at the Clark Recreation Building, mostly senior citizens. Anyone with questions can contact Nancy Raymond, Health Officer at 732-428-8405.
