FAMILY FORMS SISTERS OF CANCER SURVIVORS FOUNDATION

The Pink SOCS (Sisters of Cancer Survivors) Foundation officially became a 501(c) 3 public charity in February 2008, but they started raising money for cancer several years earlier. The Foundation began as the Pinkham family's attempt to actively fight back. At that point, 4 of the 9 Pinkham sisters had already received a breast cancer diagnosis. In 2005, a small group raised \$38,000 in their first year of participating in the Avon Walk for Breast Cancer, \$57,000 in their second year and along with other fundraising efforts have raised over \$300,000 to date.

The Pinkham family can trace their roots in Clark back over 60 years. Edwin and Veronica (Ronnie) Pinkham raised their family of eleven children in Clark. Edwin was involved with the initial construction of the VFW of Clark, where he later served as a commander. He was also a president of the Clark Pop Warner during the 1960's. Ronnie is known for her active participation in the Girl Scout program run out of Saint John the Apostle. Their fourth son, Jeffrey continues to reside in Clark. The family is large with 34 grandchildren and 9 great grandchildren, and ever expanding. They hope that the future is brighter for them and a cure is found. To date the family has experienced the despair of diagnosis and relapse more than once, as well as the sadness of loss when their father Edwin succumbed to Non-Hodgkin's lymphoma in 2003, and two sisters to breast cancer, Joanne Vargas in 2009 and Bette Ann Pinkham in March of 2012.

Throughout their journey, they've had the good fortune to be able to count on their family for support but also had the sad realization that cancer is a significant financial burden even for people that are insured. It is the hope of the Pink SOCS Foundation that they will be able to assist those families who are in need of financial support as a result of any type of cancer, because they know first hand that diagnosis is stressfull enough, without the added concern of monetary resources.

Their mission is to improve the lives of families in their

communities that have been affected by breast cancer as well as all other forms of cancer. They raise money by holding charity functions and through receiving contributions. They then directly donate these funds to families in need that have been affected by cancer. The organization offers two scholarship awards, the Joanne Vargas Memorial Scholarship and the Bette Ann Pinkham Memorial Scholarship. Donations are also given to research facilities to help find a cure.


RACE RESULTS IN SUCCESSFUL FUNDRAISER

The Achilles Freedom Team of Wounded Veterans is an extension of the Achilles process of physical strengthening, building confidence, and generating a supportive community, the program was adapted to the specific needs of wounded members of the U.S. military. Program participants receive training as well as use of specialized adaptive devices, such as hand-crank wheelchairs. While the goal is to enter and complete a marathon, the program stresses "achievable accomplishment," encouraging participants to begin by training for a lessdemanding competition, such as the Hope and Possibility race.

In honor of her brother Cpl Luigi "Louie" Marciante Jr., Enza Jacobowitz continued her ongoing commitment to the Achilles Freedom Team of Wounded Veterans. This was her fifth year participating in the Hope & Possibility 5 Mile Race in Central Park, NYC. In those five vears her team has raised over \$150,000 and endowed thirty handcrank wheelchairs.

Joe Renna, Publisher of Clark Monthly, ran in the race and solicited \$10 donations from readers for an opportunity to guess which place he would finish out of over 4,000 runners. The closest guess received \$1,000 in gift certificates generously donated by local restaurants.





tournament in Hamilton Township where they lost the first game to Section 3 champions Nottingham 3-0. The boys then came back with a win by defeating Brick Town. The sectionals came to an end for the Bombers with a loss to Colts Neck.

With the sectionals behind them, the next stop for the Bombers was Cooperstown Dreams Park, a week-long tournament of 104 all-star teams from across the country. 

This coming September the Carl H. Kumpf School in Clark will be implementing the new cutting edge Progressive Mathematics Initiative (PMI) as the vehicle to deliver the middle school mathematics program. The PMI was developed by New Jersey's 2006 Teacher of the Year, Dr. Robert Goodman, and has realized a good deal of success in places it has been implemented. The program is technology based, and is taught from a Smartboard, with students collaborating on problems and communicating their responses through responders.

As part of the implementation of the program, Carl H. Kumpf School Principal Jennifer Feeley has been outfitting each of the rooms designated for PMI instruction with Smartboards and responders and arranging for all middle school mathematics teachers to receive three day training on PMI.


