## **IRISH BUSINESS ASSOCIACTION MEETS AT MOLLY MAGUIRE'S**

The Irish Business Association (IBA) of New Jersey will hold their next meeting/networking event on August 20 at Molly Maguire's Irish Pub & Restaurant at 1085 Central Avenue in Clark from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Non-members are welcome. The cost is \$20 for members, \$30 for returning non-members and no charge for first-time non-members.

The IBA is an association of New Jersey business professionals and business owners launched in March 2008, committed to promoting business relationships and personal interaction within the Irish-American business community in New Jersey, based on a shared heritage. The IBA is part of the Gateway Regional Chamber of Commerce, the largest business association in the New York/Northern New Jersey Region, comprising 14 regional and local chambers. With 1,200 members, the Gateway Regional Chamber of Commerce has a 95 percent retention rate, the highest in the country.

The IBA is returning to Twin Brooks Country Club in Watchung for their 2013 Annual Golf Outing, to be held Thursday, September 19. The IBA held the event at Shackamaxon Country Club the last two years but opted to return to the rolling hills of Twin Brooks for 2013, according to Brian Reilly, president of the business group.

"We thought Twin Brooks and its green hills was more akin to the rolling countryside of Ireland and we think our guests will love the venue," Reilly said.

The cost of the outing is \$225 per golfer and \$800 for a foursome. The day includes golf, lunch, a cocktail hour, dinner and door prizes. The IBA is co-hosting the outing with the Irish American Cultural Institute and half the proceeds will go to the institute.

The golf outing marks the next event in a busy 2013 calendar for the IBA, according to Reilly. The group held its St. Patrick's Day celebration in March, followed by its annual awards dinner in June. At that dinner Al Nunan, principal banker at Wells Fargo, was named Man of the Year for his past and present support of the IBA; Deirdre Shea, owner of the Shea-Jennings School of Irish Dance, was honored as Woman of the Year; and Paul Davis Restoration of Union and Essex Counties was named Company of the Year.

In July the IBA welcomed veteran Irish American entertainment writer Mike Farragher of the Irish Voice and author of the bestselling book, "This Is Your Brain on Shamrocks2: 50 Shades o' Green." Next, the IBA will hold its September 17 meeting at Blackthorn Irish Pub & Restaurant in Kenilworth, where Farragher and the restaurant will hold a "Halfway to St. Patrick's Day" event to support the Love/Hope/Strength Foundation, a music-centric cancer charity committed to increasing the bone marrow databases for cancer victims and their families. It will feature Farragher reading, singer/songwriter Patrick Clifford singing and Irish step dancer Keri Smith.







# **ROBINSON MUSEUM ANNOUNCES FALL SEASON**

The fall season is fast approaching for the Dr. Wm. Robinson Museum in Clark, NJ. Starting in September, we will be holding several fun and educational events not far from your home. The museum is located at 593 Madison Hill Road, where it has stood since 1690. It was built by Dr. William Robinson, who emigrated here from Scotland, and was lived in by several families until being renovated into a Living Museum in the early 80's. Most of the original framing remains and can be seen inside, along with the original river stone foundation. The main floor boasts a beautiful reconstructed working hearth with a beehive oven and a large summer beam which is hand cut, weighs approximately 2,500 pounds and supports the third floor. On the third floor you can see the timber frame that supports the roof and also how it was marked for assembly before it was secured together with wooden pegs. We also have an herb garden in the yard where you can learn about different herbs and how they are used as medicine, in food and many other uses.

Our events start with an open house on Sept 15th from 12-4pm where you can take pictures and a guided tour of the house. All of our open houses are free admission. On October, 5th from 6:30 - 10:00pm join us and New Jersey Paranormal for a night of investigating to find out who still visits the museum after dark. For an admission fee of \$5 you can join a 45 minute paranormal investigation. Bring your camera and recorder; you never know what or who you may discover. Tickets will be available shortly for advance purchase, visit our website for more information. October 19th and 20th we will be joining the Union County Office of Cultural and

Heritage affairs and other historic sites in Union County for a weekend of tours and events. At the Robinson house we will be entering a "Time Warp" and going back in time to explore 1855-1899. Visiting us will be President and Mrs. Lincoln along with soldiers from the Civil War. We will be cooking for you on the fire and also sharing with you the local history happening in this area during that time.



On November 17th we will have another open house from 12-4pm where you can tour the house and ask questions. We end our fall season with our 6th Annual Holiday Celebration on December 7th and 8th featuring free pictures with Santa, hearth cooking, and a presentation on 17th Christmas Celebrations in England and the New World.





## CLARK BOE HIRES NINE NEW STAFF MEMBERS AND A NEW CONTENT AREA SUPERVISOR

At the August 6th Board of Education meeting, the Clark Board of Education approved the hiring of nine new staff members along with a new content area supervisor. Superintendent of Schools Kenneth Knops dedicated his Superintendent's Report to introducing and highlighting the credentials of each newly hired staff member to the Board of Education and to all meeting attendees.

Knops initially introduced Ms. Yuri Diaz, a six year Spanish teacher at the high school, as the new content area supervisor for Language Arts and Humanities. Ms. Diaz received her Bachelor of Arts Degree in Latin America Civilization and Culture Studies from Rutgers University and subsequently received two Masters Degrees, one in Foreign Language Education and one in Educational Administration, from Rutgers University. She leaves the classroom to begin her new assignment as Grades 6-12 Content Area Supervisor of Language Arts and the Humanities.

After this the next staff member introduced was Nicole Arpino, who had filled in a year-long maternity leave as School Psychologist for the elementary schools. With the resignation of a school psychologist, she was hired as a fulltime, tenure track psychologist for the child study team.

Also hired by the Board of Education and introduced by Superintendent Knops were new Valley Road School Kindergarten Teacher Kim Belverio, Frank K. Hehnly School Third Grade Teacher Ashley Guarino, Valley Road School Fifth Grade Teachers Kelly Williamson and Bryan Lowe, Frank K. Hehnly Music Teacher Meghan Bowers, Frank K. Hehnly School Special Education Teacher Nina Sincropi, Carl H. Kumpf School Science Teacher Danielle DeFalco, and Arthur L. Johnson High School Teacher Loredana Skirde.

Commenting on the new hires who will be joining the District next month, Superintendent Kenneth Knops remarked, "We are delighted with the quality of our new staff members and look forward to their contributions in their respective positions. We held a rigorous interview schedule, interviewing as many as 60 candidates for our elementary positions, we have hired outstanding staff members who will continue our educational mission to provide Clark students with a cutting edge education."


