CLARK RESIDENT GIVES THE GREATEST CHRISTMAS GIFT OF ALL

On the day he met Kristi, the woman who would become his wife, John Burk thought he was meeting up with a friend to discuss business over lunch when he headed to a local restaurant.

But his friend didn't show for their meeting, so John struck up a conversation with the brown-eyed bartender. One thing led to another, and he asked her out. For their first date, they went to a Jimmy Buffet concert. It was the start of a relationship that would span two decades.

Together, Clark residents John and Kristi Burk had a good life, which included their daughter, Sharon. While Sharon was young, Kristi worked as a lunch aide at her school, a job that combined Kristi's background in the food service industry with the ability to be near her daughter. Later, when Sharon was older, Kristi became a waitress.

John, a mechanical engineer, traveled frequently for work. Sometimes, Kristi would be able to join him, usually at the beginning or end of a trip. Together, they were able to see the world, visiting places like Hong Kong, Korea and Bulgaria.

There were challenges, too, like when Kristi was diagnosed with breast cancer, which she beat not once, but twice. Through it all, though, she remained the active, fun-loving woman with whom John had fallen in love.

But on Christmas Day 2010, tragedy struck.

John, Kristi and Sharon were celebrating the holiday with Kristi's family when Kristi went into cardiac arrest. She passed away just weeks before her and John's 20th anniversary. John realizes how heartbreaking it sounds, to lose a

wife and mother on Christmas, but really, he says, he found comfort in the fact that the whole family was together.

His sister-in-law insisted on driving him and Sharon home; it was during that drive that a call came from the Lions Eye Bank of New Jersey, asking for John's consent to donate Kristi's corneas. Although John had heard of the Eye Bank before and even had some friends who had been donors, he didn't know much about cornea donation itself. He and Kristi had talked about organ donation, though, so he knew that she was in favor of it, and that she had signed up on the Donor Registry when she renewed her driver's license. He told the caller yes, Kristi could be an eye donor.

In order to determine whether somebody is eligible to donate, the Eye Bank must ask a number of questions pertaining to the person's medical and social history. The questions are very personal in nature, and donor families sometimes find them difficult to answer. For John, the interviewer's sensitivity made a huge difference.

"The interviewer could not have been better," he recalls. "For me, that made it a little bit easier."

After Kristi's donation, John received a letter from the Eye Bank, letting him know that her corneas had helped give somebody a second chance for sight. Receiving this news cemented in his mind that he had made the right decision.

"It was so fulfilling," John says. "It made us feel so good that we were able to help someone keep their sight or get it back."





"MANAGING HOLIDAY TEMPTATIONS" By Lauren Purdy, R.D. • ShopRite of Clark

The holidays are a time for celebrating with family and friends, which usually means enjoying home-cooked meals and delicious sweet treats. Along with that holiday cheer can come a few unwanted extra pounds. Although the average holiday weight gain is one to five pounds, it can add up over the years. Instead of depriving yourself of your favorite holiday sweets, try a few recipe substitutions and healthy eating strategies that can help you enjoy holiday dishes without all of the guilt. For healthy holiday eating strategies: Prepare, Be Aware and Share.



Plan a smaller breakfast and lunch to allow for a few extra indulgences at the holiday party. Don't skip these meals altogether, just plan for less. Bring a healthy dish to the party so you know you'll have something to fall back on.

Don't pick – grab a plate and sit down to enjoy your meal. It's easy to overeat when you are grazing at the buffet line. Practice portion control – sample small amounts of your favorite foods and try not to eat until you are overstuffed. Fill up on good-for-you foods first like cut fruit, crudités, and shrimp cocktail. Focus on friends, not the food. Enjoy fun times with friends and try not to stand near or focus too much on the buffet.

There may be lots of delicious desserts at the party, but choose your favorite one to enjoy instead of picking at all of them. Or, simply share a portion of dessert with a friend to cut down on calories. Prepare a healthier dessert idea and bring it to the party. If you plan on making a dish for your next holiday party, try the recipe modifications below.

Instead of this, try this:

Whole milk Evaporated fat-free (skim) milk, fat-free half-and-half Whipped Cream Whip chilled evaporated skim milk or use low-fat whipped topping Sour Cream Fat-free sour cream, low-fat or fat-free greek yogurt Mayonnaise Low-fat or fat-free mayonnaise, fat-free plain or greek yogurt Cream Cheese Reduced fat or fat-free versions (do not use fat-free for baking) Ricotta Cheese 1% cottage cheese, part-skim or non-fat ricotta **Butter or shortening** Butter: light soft-tub margarine or use a combination of ½ butter and ½ unsweetened applesauce. Shortening: regular soft tub margarine. Stick margarine Reduced-fat soft tub, squeeze or whipped margarine (Whipped margarine cannot be used in baking. Reduced-fat and fat-free margarine cannot be used in baking or frying.) Oil (in baking) Equal amount of applesauce or double the amount of plain yogurt Sugar Reduce sugar by 1/4 and increase cinnamon, nutmeg and/or vanilla.

Use sugar substitutes according to package directions.

involves the entire school and staff, as well as parents. Each marking period, the staff is asked to nominate a student they feel has demonstrated an extraordinary act. The staff matches their act with a trait or characteristic the staff tries to model and teach to the students each day. A

"Making a Difference" is a program that committee reviews the nominations and prepares for a celebration. The student's parents are made aware through a letter that their child has been nominated and that he or she will be presented with a certificate. The nominated student is kept in the dark until the morning of the announcement. The families and staff meet before school for the celebration. The principal then introduces and explains in detail why the student was nominated. The student is then given a certificate and a special button to wear with pride. The "Making a Difference program" provides wonderful moments for teachers and families to be a part of something important.






LEGENDS OF THE COURTYARD

GIFTED & TALENTED STUDENTS BEGIN DESIGNING BEDROOMS



KUMPF GIRLS' SOCCER TEAM MEETS RUTGERS WOMEN'S SOCCER PLAYERS


