

# 2011-2012 PROPOSED SCHOOLS BUDGET

After almost three months of gathering information and reviewing requests from administrators, supervisors, and teachers, Mr. Gonnella and I constructed a preliminary budget for review by the Finance and Facility Committee of the School Board. During these second-step budget meetings, the Committee members reviewed, line-by-line, each section of the budget with seven members of the administrative team. This step of the budget process began in January and was completed in March. Along the way, the Kenilworth School Board had to get the budget preliminarily approved by the Union County Executive Superintendent. His approval of our budget was based on meeting the state mandated 2% cap on last year's expenditures and a fair tax burden to be placed on the residents of Kenilworth.

At its March 23 Public School Board meeting, Mr. Gonnella presented this final budget to the public for review and to the entire Board for their approval. Last year, you may recall we lost almost a million dollars of state aid and then upon the defeat of the school budget by the registered voters of Kenilworth, our budget was further reduced by the Borough Council an additional \$650,000. This caused the Board and Administration to cut teaching positions, middle school and freshman athletic programs, cocurricular activities and charging parents for the previously free Pre-School program.

This year we were the beneficiaries of an almost \$200,000 increase in state funding and additional aid for our Choice Program. This, of course, was good news to our administration and School Board. With this information, the Board

put the finishing touches on the 2011-2012 School Budget prior to the March 23 meeting. This new budget provides for an increase in expenditures of about 1.78% (less than the state mandate) and a zero percent increase in school taxes for the average home owner in Kenilworth. The additional state funding referred to previously was utilized to reduce the tax burden on the Kenilworth residents.

Both the Kenilworth School Board and Administration are proud of the proposed 2011-2012 School Budget and, hopefully, the residents of our community will appreciate all of the time and effort that was spent in its development. Along with providing a safe and secure learning environment, the mission of our three schools continues to be providing a quality educational experience for each and every one of our students.

Should you have any questions about the proposed School Budget, please send either Mr. Gonnella or me an email and we will be sure to provide you with an answer prior to Election Day – April 27. Voting polls will be open between the hours of 2:00-9:00.

# 9/11 WTC STEEL COLUMN ARRIVES IN KENILWORTH

On February 24, 2011, the Kenilworth Fire Department took delivery of a portion of a steel column that was once a part of the World Trade Center. This artifact from one of the most tragic days in U.S. history will serve as a constant reminder of September 11, 2001, when 2,572 people, including 343 FDNY Firefighters, and Kenilworth residents Sgt. Robert Kaulfers and John J. Tobin, were tragically killed.

Months ago the Port Authority NY/NJ began offering remnants of the World Trade Center to appropriate groups to create monuments to those who lost their lives on that fateful September morning. Once assured that the steel artifact would be properly displayed and honored, the Port Authority released the column to the Kenilworth Fire Department.

lent to the KFD by Ed Pastor of Ed Pastor Excavating in Kenilworth, KFD members left for Hanger 17 at Kennedy Airport. Port Authority personnel loaded the 1,062-lb, 9-foot long, 36-inch high, 17-inch wide, 3/4-inch thick column onto the trailer. The column was covered with an American flag and transported to the Borough. Members of the Kenilworth Fire Department with several pieces of fire apparatus, along with Kenilworth Police Department patrol cars, met the WTC steel on Galloping Hill Road and escorted it to the front of Borough Hall, then on to Kenilworth Fire Headquarters. There, after paying honors, the steel column was unloaded and placed inside the apparatus bay next to KFD Tower Ladder 3.

The Kenilworth Fire Department has now On the morning of February 24, using a trailer begun planning the best way to create a



permanent memorial to honor all it represents. # A COOL ANSWER TO RECOVERY AT TRINITAS

During a recent visit from Florida to see hearts have stopped, been restarted through relatives and friends in Roselle Park, New Jersey, Alfred Colucci experienced a cardiac arrest that made him an excellent candidate to receive the latest treatment using therapeutic hypothermia at Trinitas Regional Medical Center. His remarkable recovery is attributed to the protocol that involved cooling his body temperature to 91 degrees.

Nicknamed "Code Frosty," the protocol involves staff in key areas, including the Mobile Intensive Care Unit, the Emergency Department, Intensive Care Unit, Respiratory Therapy, Pharmacy, Anesthesiology, and the Cardiac Catheterization Lab. For patients such as Mr. Colucci, therapeutic hypothermia relies on the interaction of staff members in these departments who work rapidly to cool the patient in order to preserve brain function in the first minutes following a cardiac arrest.

"Therapeutic hypothermia, which involves bringing a patient's body temperature down to 91 degrees, is recommended for patients whose

CPR, and who remain unconscious," explains Trinitas Advance Practice Nurse Debbie Durand. "Therapeutic hypothermia helps to prevent damage to the brain which is dependent on a steady supply of oxygen from the heart. Since many patients do not even survive the original cardiac arrest, we want to give those that do every chance to maintain good brain function. If the supply of oxygen to the brain is interrupted, various processes can cause damage to brain cells that may result in an inability to communicate or interact with others. By chilling the whole body, we can slow brain damage or even prevent it from happening," she continues.

Therapeutic hypothermia begins in the field where Trinitas paramedics are equipped with icepacks and cooled IV solution. En route to the Emergency Department, work begins on the patient so that valuable time is not wasted. The process then continues in the Emergency Department where the patient is wrapped in a specialized vest and leg coverings.

The care of the patient continues while he or she is under sedation. For the next 24 hours, the patient is kept cool and cared for in the Intensive Care Unit. During this time, the patient's normal body functions are monitored and ultimately, the patient's body temperature is gradually warmed and returned to normal level.






