

GATEWAY REGIONAL CHAMBER OF COMMERCE NAMES WINNERS AT 2012 MAYORS DINNER

The mayors and government officials of Union County held court at the annual Mayors Dinner of the Gateway Regional Chamber of Commerce Thursday, March 26, at the Newark Airport Marriot Hotel. Common themes included the state's 2 percent property tax cap, high store occupancy and area development.

Award winners were:

- Joseph Menza of Hillside as Mayor of the Year for his perseverance in promoting city interests despite significant opposition;
- Chris Cotter of Summit as Business Administrator of the Year for making Summit a business-friendly town;
- Police Chief Eric Mason of Cranford as Public Safety Official of the Year;
- Scotch Plains Mayor Nancy Malool as Speaker of the Night for her light-hearted poetry, accompanied by bongos.

The collective overviews of the county's municipalities included: the challenges and successes of meeting the state's property tax cap; Fanwood and Westfield retaining 100 and 90 percent store occupancy during the recession, respectively; Linden moving forward with development of 108 acres of former General Motors property; Rahway's continuing expansion of facilities dedicated to the arts; New Providence allowing alcohol to be served in restaurants; and more than 1,000 new jobs coming to Hillside due to business development.

"Each year the mayors' presentations reflect the issues towns and cities throughout the state are facing," said James Coyle, Gateway president. "While the night is light-hearted and fun we hear both the realities of economic pressures and the pride in addressing these challenges. Municipal government always is demanding and often thankless. Once each year we try to say thanks."



THE DIARY OF ANNE FRANK

A special viewing of the 2008 movie adaptation of "The Diary of Anne Frank" has been arranged by the Kenilworth Historical Society for Thurs., April 19, 2012, in observance of Holocaust Remembrance Day. The general public is invited to attend the viewing, which will begin at 7 p.m. at the Kenilworth Seniors' Center, 526 Boulevard, Kenilworth, N.J. Admission is free.

The two-hour film, which is being shown in cooperation with Darlow Smithson Productions Ltd., has won international acclaim for its authenticity and accurate interpretation of Jewish teenager Anne Frank's life in hiding from 1942 to 1944, during the World War II German occupation of the Netherlands. Drawing on exact passages from the revered diary that she wrote from a secret annex in Amsterdam shared with her family and others, the movie portrays the humanity, tolerance, courage and will to live for which Anne Frank is universally recognized.

From the time that "The Diary of Anne Frank" was first published more than 50 years ago, this unique literary classic has become one of the world's most widely read books and has served as the basis for several plays and films.

TOUCHDOWN CLUB AWARDS SCHOLARSHIPS






(above, l-r) Coach Scott Miller presents Michael Christian with the Bob Taylor Touchdown Club Scholarship.











DAVID BREARLEY MIDDLE/HIGH SCHOOL, NJ STATE COUNCIL ON THE ARTS **FUNDED MOSAIC PROJECT**

"Acceptance, Tolerance, Forgiveness...These Are Life-Altering Lessons" is the quote by Jessica Lange that was chosen as the theme of the latest mural project to be done by the students at David Brearley Middle/High School. Inspired by an anti-bullying assembly, a group of middle school students asked their language arts teachers to help them create a visual antibullying statement. With the assistance of the art department, teachers and students are transforming a school hallway and courtyard into an inspirational environment that includes a mosaic wall, columns and an 11-foot mosaic tree sculpture, all filled with positive messages written by the students.

This is the second mosaic installation to be undertaken by the David Brearley Middle/High School community. Last year, a 68-foot mural was constructed in an upstairs hallway in an effort to establish a stronger identity for the middle school which had recently lost its sports and extra-curricular activities due to budget cuts.

Throughout both of these projects, middle and high school students and teachers have worked together, which has established strong bonds between them. They have been guided by wellknown Philadelphia mosaic artist Julie Deery, whose involvement has been made possible through Artists In Education Residency Grants funded by the New Jersey State Council on the Arts.

David Brearley Middle/High School has been

the recipient of five of these AIE Grants. All of them have been written by art teacher Janice Marsili, and orchestrated with the help of fellow art teachers Cindy Perez and Stephanie Petrakos. High school science teacher Melissa Ferraris is the Acting Administrator for the grants, and financing of materials for the projects has been provided each year through sales of an art student-made product which is marketed and sold by the business students under the guidance of business teacher Cheryl Kress.

Past AIE Residency Grants have included the publishing of a Kenilworth Community Cookbook illustrated with student etchings of the town's restaurants and food stores, a calendar/planner including pictures of key locations in town taken by the school's photography students, note card sets silkscreened with images of Kenilworth residences, as well as the more recent mosaic projects. Last year's undertaking was chosen to be a Best Practices Grant by the New Jersey State Council on the Arts, and photos of the mosaic mural are on the cover of the Artists in Education brochure, as well as in the flyer describing the organization's summer Artist/Teacher Institute.

The latest David Brearley Middle/High School mosaic installation will be unveiled at the school's annual art show on May 10, 2012 beginning at 7:00 PM. Refreshments will be served, there will be a 50/50 drawing, and student art work will be on sale.

BOE 2012-13 ANNUAL SCHOOL BUDGET OVERVIEW

At the March 26, 2012 public budget hearing, the Kenilworth Board of Education adopted the 2012-2013 annual school budget. The budget acknowledges both the concerns of the taxpayers and the children of Kenilworth; providing increased programs and educational opportunities while calling for no increase to the current expense tax levy. The budget takes into consideration the needs of both the Harding Elementary School and David Brearley Middle/High School programs and facilities.

Dr. Scott Taylor, Assistant Superintendent, Kenilworth Public Schools

The district's annual budget is a blueprint that reflects the community's goals for its schools. It addresses academics, extra-curricular activities and enrichment programs, special education, and support services such as busing, cafeteria and business operations.

An enriching educational and social environment is offered by the Kenilworth Public Schools. Our students are offered a broad range of educational opportunities seen at the finest schools in our country.



This year, due to the unstable economic future of the State and Nation, the district continued to reduce costs to non-instructional programs as a means to meet the mandatory budget cap and limit the tax impact to the community while maintaining essential educational programs for the students of the school district. Assisted by an increase in State Aid, the budget is considerably below the State mandated 2% budget cap, and as a result there is no need for further voter consideration in November 2012.

Some budget highlights include:

- No increase in the Current Expense Tax Levy.
- The employment of additional elementary teachers to maintain class size.
- Increased emphasis on Basic Skills Instruction to improve test scores.
- One of the lowest per pupil cost in Union County K-12 districts with enrollment of 1000 to 3500.
- Budget submitted at \$674,218 below the State Mandated Budget CAP.
- Expenditure increase of 2.30% above 2011-2012 adjusted budget.
- Establishment of an educational academy at the Brearley Middle/High School for high achieving students.
- Total anticipated expenditures: \$22,754,627

The Board of Education is committed to continuing to pursue the best education possible for the diverse group of young people in the district. A good public school system is a vital component to a successful community and must meet the needs of all of its students. The Board of Education feels that they have accomplished that this year and looks forward to implementing the 2012-2013 budget.
