FOOD PANTRY ASSISTS KENILWORTH FAMILIES

Summertime is a difficult season to keep food pantries stocked and St. Theresa's food pantry is dangerously low and needs to be replenished to continue to meet demands.

Across the nation food pantries find that the Holidays, beginning with Thanksgiving, bring the largest quantities to the pantries, but summer months when donations slow down, bring in the most clients. Many of them have children, who might be fed with free school lunches.

Mary Michitsch, president of Social Concerns, the nonprofit group that runs the pantry within St. Theresa's Church, feels that due to the downturn in the economy and soaring food prices the need to feed the hungry has been greater than ever. The pantry services mostly Kenilworth residents, but no one is turned away.

No appointment is necessary to make a donation. Nonperishable goods and gift cards to any supermarket can be left in the Crying Room in the Church on Sundays. Monday through Friday donations can be dropped off at the Rectory during business hours 9 am - 5 pm. Supermarket gift cards and checks made payable to St. Theresa's can be mailed to Social Concerns c/o The Church of Saint Theresa, 541 Washington Avenue, Kenilworth, NJ 07033.

If you are in need of food you can contact the Rectory at 908-272-4444, they will arrange for a volunteer to meet you at the pantry.

The identities of people who receive assistance from the pantry are kept confidential. Names and contact information aren't required to receive assistance. Mary Michitch stresses "when you walk out of here, nobody knows you were here".




HUNDREDS OF NEIGHBORS TURNED OUT FOR NATIONAL NIGHT OUT BLOCK PARTIES

The Kenilworth Police Department participated in National Night Out on Tuesday, August 5th. According to Police Chief William Dowd, National Night Out is held throughout the country on the first Tuesday in August. He said it is an opportunity for neighbors to get together informally and talk about security related topics with not only their neighbors, but with police officers and members of the Kenilworth governing body also.



Kenilworth residents held six block parties, which was a record turnout for the Borough. The parties were held on Clinton Avenue, Cross Street, N. 16th Street, N. 11th Street, Commonwealth Road and on Via Vitale. Detective Jim Grady, who is the Borough's School Resource Officer, organized the block parties with the residents. Det. Grady stated that getting together is also intended to send a message to the criminal element that crime will not be tolerated in the neighborhoods. Det. Grady was joined by Detective Sergeant Tim Dowd in visiting the block parties, speaking to the people in attendance and handing out crime prevention brochures. Also visiting all the block parties that evening were Police Chief William Dowd, Mayor Kathi Fiamingo and Police Commissioner, Councilman Fred Pugliese. The three visited each party and spoke to the residents about items that affect their quality of life, such as speeding in their neighborhoods, door-to-door solicitors coming to their homes and a variety of other topics. Mayor Fiamingo stated she was pleasantly surprised by the large turnouts for the block parties and she enjoyed going to all the parties and speaking to the residents informally. This was Mayor Fiamingo's first National Night Out as Mayor and she is already looking forward to next years festivities.







The trip is being arranged and escorted by Progressive Travel of Union, N.J.


