

## **KENILWORTH LAUNCHES NEW WEBSITE**

When the New Jersey Taxpayers Association (NJTA) in conjunction with the New Jersey Foundation for Open Government (NJFOG) put out a call for a local government entity to become a role model for government transparency on the internet, Kenilworth Mayor Kathi Fiamingo stepped right up.

In return the Borough of Kenilworth received a new website, kenilworthborough.com, designed at no cost to the Borough.

The website went live in July and there are many records visitors can freely search and download, the Borough will continue its efforts to place all public records on the site in a timely manner. The site includes official Borough documents along with helpful links to other services.

The website was designed by computer programmer Mike Pierone of Lattice Designs and features a unique program designed by Pierone that enables the viewer to search every field in the Borough's check registry. The program also allows the user to create charts of the data. For example, if someone wanted to compare how much business went to a certain vendor year by year they can just click on an icon. It is also possible to compare expenses from year to year. Another click can show how much was spent on a particular item from year to year.

Pierone is an open government advocate and a board member of NJFOG. He volunteered his time on this project in hopes that once Kenilworth set an example of how government websites should be done, the thousands of other public entities across the state will follow. The two good government groups plan to use the Borough of Kenilworth site as a showcase for best practices in open government.

Mayor Kathi Fiamingo whole heartedly embraced the idea of using Kenilworth as a model for government transparency. Pierone was given access to 12 years of the borough's check registry to load into the site's database. According to Pierone, the only problem with this feature on

the new site is record keeping consistency. Different employees and officials through the years kept records in their own way, they recorded things differently. Pierone said historically there was no standard for keeping public records, not just in Kenilworth but in every local government he researched.

Pierone adapted many of Kenilworth's records. The plan is for all records going forward to be uniformly formatted and place on the website in a timely manner. The public will still need to use New Jersey's Open Public Records Act (OPRA) to retrieve documents not yet available on the site. Requests for public records can be made through the site: kenilworthborough.com

The Kenilworth Police Department, in conjunction with the Union County YWCA, is looking for volunteers for the Domestic Violence Response Team (DVRT).

The DVRT consists of civilians from surrounding communities who respond to the Police Department to speak only with victims of domestic violence and offer available services and guidance to the victims. All of this is done in a secure and confidential setting at the police department.



# **KENILWORTH LIBRARY BOOK GROUP** TO CELEBRATE TEN YEARS OF READING AND DISCUSSION

All past, present and future members of the Kenilworth Public Library book discussion group are invited to attend the tenth anniversary of the book group's founding with a celebration that is scheduled to begin at 6:15 PM on August 21 in the library's activity room. All attendees are requested to bring a food or beverage item to be shared with others for a pot luck dinner on the evening of the celebration. Rather than discussing a particular book, attendees at this event will be encouraged to share their memories of the group, including answers to such questions as favorite and least favorite book group books and favorite book group memory.

According to Library Director Dale Spindel, the library's book group met for the first time on August 5, 2002 with six people in attendance to discuss Tell Me a Riddle, by Tillie Olsen but when the group met for a second time on October 22 to discuss Tulip Fever, by Deborah Moggach, 24 people showed up. Since then, the group has averaged between 12 and 15 attendees per meeting, but with larger crowds coming out for such special events as the visit from Jonathan

Safran Foer, the author of Everything is Illuminated and Extremely Loud and Incredibly Close in November 2006. Spindel anticipates another milestone celebration when the group meets to discuss its 100th book in December of 2013. Also according to Spindel, at least three people who attended the group's first meeting are still participating on a regular basis although she wants to stress that she is also always delighted to see new faces.

# REFLECTIONS OF A JOURNEY TO EL SALVADOR

those 30% that have jobs, the average salary for an El Salvadorian is somewhere between \$1500-3500...A YEAR.

During our week in El Salvador, we worked at two different locations: Las Delicias and Zaragoza. I spent the majority of my time in Las Delicias. We did a bunch of different things...everything from building a house to playing with the children to digging ditches. My favorite part of the entire week was playing with the kids though. Whether we were at the orphanage, day care, or just at a work site, the kids were the happiest people I have ever seen in my life, despite the fact that they had nothing. I saw them day after day greeting me in the same clothes that they wore the day before. They had mud and dirt on their feet, because some of them didn't even have shoes. Most of the kids that I saw had one meal a day (which consisted of a tortilla, a little scoop of rice, and a small bit of stew). The only reason they got this meal is because of a program started by Sister Gloria from the Handmaids of the Sacred Heart of Jesus who hosted us for the week. These sisters spend their lives trying to help the El Salvadorian people.

I will continue raising money and seeking donations so I can send things to the people of El Salvador like shampoo, soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, toys, clothes, and anything else I can. These people have very little. What if you didn't have electricity...or enough money to buy food for your family for even one meal a day...or you had no shoes but had to walk to school every day? For just \$300, I am able to buy 500

The second is a quote by Mother Teresa, "If we have no peace, it is because we often forget that we belong to each other." We are not just Americans and El Salvadorians; we are all people on this earth and we are all equal.

> El Salvador has changed me, and I want to continue to change them. Spreading the awareness only goes so far, so I need your help to take action.
