

### **LIBRARY'S "BARD ON THE BOULEVARD" PRESENTS: MACBETH WITH A STEAMPUNK TWIST**

Something wicked this way comes: technology. the Kenilworth Public Library and the Hudson Shakespeare Company present a new twist on Macbeth, directed by Noelle Fair. The third and final installment of the "Bard on the Boulevard" series will be presented at the David Brearley High School football field (14th and Boulevard in Kenilworth) on Thursday, August 22nd at 7:30pm. In case of excessive rain or heat, the performance will be moved to the library at 548 Boulevard.

This revolutionary performance of the "Scottish play" will incorporate the gothic style known as "steampunk:" a fashion and convention staple combining Victorian dress with sci-fi tropes of gears, machinery and



### **GOALS 2013-2014: IT'S ALL ABOUT THE KIDS**

Dr. Scott Taylor, Superintendent, Kenilworth Public Schools (@KenilworthSuper)

The Kenilworth School District is on its way to improving student performance. Tiffany Moutis (Assistant Superintendent) and I, along with the district's building leadership team and with input from the Board of Education have established three core goals that will guide everything we do in our schools through 2013-2014. Each of these goals is purposed to do one thing- help our community's children grow academically, socially, and emotionally.

Goal number one will be for us to stimulate students' intellectual growth, and we will use the New Jersey Department of Education Performance Report as a guide to determine progress. You can download the Performance Reports by going to the Superintendent's Page located on the district website. The four Performance Areas of focus will be Academic Achievement, College and Career Readiness, Student Growth, and Graduation and Post-Secondary preparation.

Goal Number Two will have school teachers and leaders providing each child with an individualized learning experience. This will mean expanding our Brearley Academy program by preparing for the implementation of the Kenilworth Academy of Art in 2014-2015 and continuing the successful Alternative Classroom Experience and Personalized Student Learning Plans. At the classroom level, teachers will continue to receive training on ways to differentiate instruction to accommodate the various learning styles and abilities children, adolescents, and young adults bring to Harding and Brearley Middle-High Schools. We will heed the mantra that "education is not the piling on of learning, information, data, facts, skills, or abilities - that's training or instruction - but is rather making visible what is hidden as a seed" (Sir Thomas More, Sixteenth Century author).

Goal Number Three will target the relationship between the Kenilworth community and the school district. An all-out effort will be made to bring parents, local business owners, and civic leaders into the decision-making fold. We will start by leveraging the Superintendent's Community Advisory Committee to identify concerns that need to be heard and resolved. We will continue our relationship-building efforts by using electronic tools such as the Honeywell Instant Alert system, Twitter, and our district website to consistently communicate news and vital information on a regular basis.

These three goals should be a part of the community's regular conversations on ball fields, in local stores, and in parents' homes. Keeping close watch on these goals will help us elevate the Kenilworth Public School District to "world class status."
