

#### DAVID BREARLEY ENFORCES ANTI-BULLYING, ANTI-CYBER-BULLYING, AND INTERNET SAFETY

On October 27th, 2011 Sergeant Michael Hoose from the Union County Prosecutor's office came to the David Brearley Middle/High School and orchestrated an interactive and multimedia school-wide assembly on bullying and the safe and appropriate use of today's available technologies. The many faces, definitions, and disciplinary actions for bullying were presented, discussed, and shared.

Sergeant Hoose and the Kenilworth Schools believe that if we are supplying young adults with social media and the technology to participate in it and with it, then we must also share the responsibility of teaching them how to use it properly and positively. Sergeant Hoose challenged the David Brearley students to create a "No Bullying Zone" and to closely and personally monitor and maintain it. He also encouraged all David Brearley students to build a caring, compassionate, and supportive school where all individuals can feel safe and valued.

#### HOW WILL TRENTON'S NCLB WAIVER REQUEST IMPACT KENILWORTH?

New Jersey became one of 11 states to request that the federal government waive its regulations on school achievement that are part of the No Child Left Behind law. The Department of Education defined the three principles to guide reform efforts in the state if the waiver application is approved by the Obama Administration:

- 1. The new national standards for math and language arts (Common Core State Standards) will be implemented in all of the state's schools by September 2012 and a new national assessment developed by the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) Consortium will replace the current standardized testing system.
- 2. A new accountability system will replace the current "Adequate Yearly Progress" measure. The new system will identify three tiers of schools' progress based on student achievement measures as defined by student's growth from year to year and attainment of certain proficiencies. Schools will either be identified as Priority Schools (the lowest achieving schools), Focus Schools, and Reward Schools (the highest achieving

3. The evaluation process of teachers' and principals' performance will be modified by a number of criteria, including their ability to influence student achievement.

Kenilworth's schools have already begun to align its curricula with the Common Core State Standards. Its sixth to seventh grade math programs are following Common Core curricula and new textbooks will be provided to students in 2012-2013 that support the Common Cores. All of the district's K-12 language arts and remaining math programs will be aligned to the Common Core Standards next September.

The district is prepared for the new accountability system. A new internal assessment tool called Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) has been adopted to help teachers determine student's growth rates in language arts, math, and science. And, Harding and Brearley schools' teachers have already proven they help student's grow academically. For instance, a two-year trend analysis of Sixth Graders showed that 16.9 percent of the student body moved from the "Partial Proficiency" category to the Proficiency category on the

language arts section of the NJASK (the state standardized assessment used to measure progress), and another 25.2 percent of Sixth Graders showed the same growth in math.

Teachers and principals are currently evaluated using a very comprehensive tool that focuses on several "domains" governing instructional effectiveness, management skills, and assessment techniques. The district's central office administration team is confident it will be able to adapt its current evaluation process to fairly measure teacher and principal effectiveness while meeting its state compliance obligations.

The school system has imposed its own standards that exceed the Department of Education's expectations and will continue to focus solely on accomplishing one thing: helping Kenilworth's children grow into productive, independent, thoughtful, and caring citizens.






