

MEMO FROM THE MAYOR



Excerpts from Reorganization Speech 2010

I don't think there are many people sad to see the end of 2009. Financially it was a difficult year for everyone, including the Borough. Early on in the year we received the unwelcome news that the RVSA assessment to the Borough was increased by almost \$400,000. At the same time we learned that the revenues earned by the Borough like interest on its excess funds, fees, etc. decreased by almost \$200,000

and that Schering was to be merged into Merck with the future of world headquarters here in the Borough cloudy at best.

Budget wise, the Borough's employees and department heads all pulled together and there was a minimal increase in spending. Unfortunately, even with everyone working hard together, we had a huge gap between what the Borough required and our available revenues. In 2008 we were required to use a large portion of our available surplus to plug the gap caused by the State's unprecedented slashing of our municipal aid and due to the economic conditions we have been unable to replenish it.

At the same time we were working with the architects selected to construct the new public safety building. Something had to give.

Unfortunately the plans for the new building were put on hold and we arranged for the sale of Borough-owned property at the end of North 18th and 19th Streets. The proceeds of the sale were used to help with 2009's budget. More funds are available for 2010 if necessary.

So, that's the not so great part of 2009 – financially a potential nightmare, but one which we were able to survive.

There were good parts of 2009 - quite a few of them. The Pride in Kenilworth Committee, chaired by Kassie Joho produced several successful events, including the Independence Day Fireworks and our recent Breakfast with Santa and Tree Lighting. We had a extremely successful Street Fair – one of the best since the event was begun and I think the largest by far.

The Recreation Department under Director Scott Pentz sponsored many activities for the children of the Borough. Scott is stepping down from his position as director this year and I really want to thank him for all he has done these past his six years.

I also want to commend our Zoning Enforcement Officer Robert Herbert for all his hard work. Although the position is a part-time one, he has been extremely active and proactive in the position. Very few people would be able to provide the Borough with the type of dedication that Bob has brought to this position.

All of our Borough employees deserve recognition. They all go beyond the call of duty and give us their absolute best. In that regard, I'd like to mention that our Finance Officer/Tax Collector Nancy Nichols retired as of the end of the year. We were fortunate to find Robert Ordway who will join us tomorrow as our new Chief Finance Officer and Tax Collector. I know he will make a fine addition to our crew.

Public hearings on our revised master plan should be held in the next few months. The master plan committee has worked very hard over the past nine months or so and I am very much looking forward to their recommendations and conclusions.

I am also looking forward to putting together a new web site for the Borough. I'm asking anyone who has any interest in helping with that endeavor to contact me. We have a professional to actually design the web site, but I would like volunteers to help put together content for the site. I would love to hear from everyone who is interested in getting involved. Please call our clerk, Mrs. Lipke and ask her to forward your information along to me.

I again want to thank Scott Vanek for the fantastic job he did painting the recreation building. It was truly a great effort and a beautiful job. Scott did have some assistance from Deb Vanek, Dave Vanek, Madison Vanek, Nick Maier, Joe Licwincko, Joe Kaiser, Chris Koehler, Kyle Addvensky, Erica Montero, Richard Tiemann, Mark Tiemann, Henry Koehler and Dan Ryan. Thanks to all of you for your help.

Looking forward, I am encouraged by the enthusiasm of these folks up here with me. Councilman Joho, as the head of the Finance Committee will work hard with his fellow committee members and Borough department heads to produce a budget that will take into account both the needs of the Borough and those of our residents.

Councilwoman Sosnosky will continue to work with Superintendent Ryan and his Department of Public Works employees, Councilman Klinder is again the liason to the Library and Welfare Departments and Councilman Leary will once again work with the Fire Department and Recreation Department.

I am extremely pleased to have Councilman Candarella and Councilman Pugliese back on council. Both Sal and Fred have worked very, very hard. They contribute such a great deal to this council and to the Borough and we are all very fortunate to have them.

Of course, we could not do it without the assistance of our Clerk, Mrs. Lipke. She keeps us and the business of the Borough running like a well-oiled machine.

Thank you everyone for your continued confidence. I am very optimistic for the future of our wonderful town. With folks like Scott Vanek, John Hathaway Bob Herbert and everyone else who makes this Borough the special place that it has always been, it is easy to be optimistic. Happy New Year, everyone. God bless you all, the Borough of Kenilworth and may God bless America and keep her safe.

STUDENT SUCCESS IS **NOT BY CHANCE**




the experience of viewing the strange but beautiful Welwitschia plant which is the national flower of Namibia.
