

## **KPD ANNOUNCES CHANGES FOR FINGERPRINTING**

Non-criminal fingerprinting is performed by the Detective Bureau for Borough residents only. There is a \$25.00 fee for fingerprints. The applicants must furnish the appropriate fingerprint cards. The majority of fingerprinting for State application purposes is now done through MorphoTrak, including firearms applications, liquor licenses, school or Borough employment, etc. Please see your employer for details.

Fingerprinting will now be done by appointment only on Thursdays from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m. at the Detective Bureau. Remember to bring your fingerprint cards, a legal form of identification and the appropriate fee for the service. The only form of acceptable payment is a money order or certified bank check made payable to the Borough of Kenilworth.

The Nixle Community Information Service allows the Police Department to create and publish messages to be delivered to subscribed residents instantly via cellular phone text message (SMS) and/or email. Notifications can also be accessed online at Nixle's web site at www.nixle.com

Messages may include traffic updates and road closures, Amber Alerts, and emergency storm and flood notifications, as well as other relevant safety and community information.

## WHAT TEACHERS ARE DOING ON THOSE DAYS OFF

Dr. Scott Taylor, Assistant Superintendent, Kenilworth Public Schools

The school district has made a concerted effort to elevate the quality of teaching in all content areas and in all grades. What's more, the school's Local Professional Development Committee and administration team has worked hard to install consistent and universal instructional practices across the board so that every child in Kenilworth is treated to the same rigorous and effectively implemented program.

To these ends, Harding and Brearley Middle-High School teachers have been maximizing the time accorded to them when Kenilworth's children have half or full-days off from school to learn and practice the most current research-proven strategies to our avail. Last January, I published an article in Kenilworth Life about the district's professional learning community program. Kenilworth's cutting-edge approach to teaching educators about best practices has been recognized throughout the state as a model way to keep teachers in the learning mind-set while they study the strategies that work (not the practices that are only theorized to work).

Teachers have been working in small groups to study specific instructional practices during each of the six half-days provided. This year, 22 teams of teachers have read about, practiced, and piloted programs related to such topics as: arts and music integration using a recognized approach called Brain Gym, the identity of the middle school as a specialized learning environment for the "tween" child, a social-emotional skill building plan called Responsive Classroom that would be included in every elementary child's classroom routine for 20

minutes daily, and the link between nutrition and student achievement.

Beyond their monthly studies, teachers are provided a full-day in February so they can participate in workshops that directly support the district's Initiative Plan (I strongly encourage readers to download the Initiative Plan from the district's website by going to www.kenilworthschools.com and clicking "Departments," and then "Curriculum, Instruction, and Professional Development"). This year's full-day worth of professional development experiences engaged teachers in workshops with such titles as: "NJASK Test Preparation Without Tears," "Drowning in Information, Starved for Knowledge: Evaluating Internet Resources," and "More Writing... Less Grading: Introduction to the Collins Writing Program."

Rest assured those days, when our district's children are home from school, are spent very wisely. Our teachers are spending every minute of this time learning and applying the instructional tools we've identified promote student academic, social, and emotional achievement. Studies of high performing educational systems in other countries such as Finland (see the December 12, 2011 New York Times article titled "From Finland, an Intriguing School- Reform Model") point out that teachers who spend at least 10% of their weekly time on professional development are more successful in the classroom. The Kenilworth School District is mindful of these effective models and vigilantly monitors the type of support its teachers need each year.

## **SNOW ORDINANCE**

On December 14, 2011, the Borough Council adopted a new ordinance restricting parking on Borough streets during and after a snow event. Effective on January 1, 2012, during a snow fall and for 24 hours thereafter, there is no parking permitted on the odd-numbered side of the streets in the Borough or in municipal parking lots to permit the Borough to clear them.

Cars parked in drive ways must be no less than one foot from the edge of the street pavement. Cars parked on the street must be no less than 4 inches from the curb or street edge. No one may attempt to reserve a parking space by placing any type of material in the street. No one may throw snow into the street and vehicles may not be parked in any manner which would restrict or prohibit removal of snow and ice by the Borough.

The ordinance was adopted as a result of the blizzard of 2010 when streets were virtually impassable for days after the storm. The police, fire department and DPW reported that with cars parked on both sides of the street it was impossible to get plows and emergency vehicles through. All of those departments asked Council to adopt an ordinance which would alleviate these problems.

Borough residents must take note of the new ordinance and abide by the parking restrictions. If possible, vehicles should be parked off the street to allow those without off-street parking the opportunity to park their vehicles.

The fines for failing to abide by the ordinance range from \$150.00 to \$1,000.00. For more information about the ordinance, please request a copy from the Borough Clerk.

She also said that I should call her at the end of the year and let her know if we fell short of our goal so that she could make up the difference.

Although the library did receive many generous donations, we were also aware that 2011 was probably not the ideal time to be undertaking even a modest fund raising campaign, what with difficult economic times as well as the added insults 2011 brought to Kenilworth in the form of Tropical Storm Irene

and the freak October snow storm. While very grateful for those donations we did receive, we also fully understood the many reasons why others were not able to participate.

As I imagine it was for everyone else, it was with a huge sigh of relief that we at the library finally said goodbye to 2011.

So you can also imagine my surprise when, not quite two weeks into the new year, I received another phone call from Jackie Fidurski, this time wanting to know if the library had reached its fund raising goal; she was more than a little miffed that I had not already called to let her know that we had come up short. A few minutes after that, Jackie appeared at my office door with another check, this time in the amount of \$2,025. For those of you not interested in doing the math, I will tell you that Jackie's total contribution came to \$2,775 or 34 times 75.

When I asked Jackie what we could do to thank her, she asked me to write a letter to the editor, so here it is, along with a huge THANK YOU, JACKIE! Kenilworth is very lucky to have you.

## **BLACK HISTORY MONTH CELEBRATION FEATURES "SONGS FROM THE FIELDS"**

The History and Significance of U.S. Slave Songs/Spirituals. Guest speaker: James (Jim) E. Thomas of the U.S. Slave Song Project Inc.

The history and significance of U.S. slave songs, also known as spirituals, will be the focus of the Kenilworth Historical Society's Black History Month Celebration on the afternoon of Sunday, Feb. 19. The general public is invited to attend the event, which will take place at the Kenilworth Seniors' Center, 526 Boulevard, Kenilworth, N.J. Light refreshments will be served starting at 1:30 p.m., and the program will begin at 2:30 p.m. Admission is free. In case of snow, the celebration will be held on Feb. 26.

The featured presentation, "Songs from the Fields," is appropriate for all age groups. It will be given by James (Jim) E. Thomas, founder and president of the U.S. Slave Song Project Inc., a non-profit organization dedicated to educating the public about authentic U.S. slave songs, or spirituals. Thomas will discuss the fascinating body of original, inspirational American folk music that, from 1619 to 1865, enabled African-American slaves to secretly communicate with one another, teach their children, record their history and heal their pain. He will review the various types of spirituals and their significance, explain the "secret codes" within them and sing passages from the authentic slave songs. Some of the music that Thomas highlights in his presentation will be sung by members of Kenilworth's Union Baptist Church, First Baptist Church and other local congregations.

Parking and entrance to the Kenilworth Seniors' Center are located at the rear of the building. For further information, please call 908-709-0434.

Thomas founded the U.S. Slave Song Project Inc. in 2005 and has given presentations on the subject at various venues throughout the United States and other parts of the world. Thomas was founding director of the American Red Cross Chorus in Washington, D.C., in 1976, and he continues to serve as a leadership volunteer for the American Red Cross. He additionally has recruited and directed military choirs in Vietnam and Germany.


