

This annual Graduation Food Drive is a great way for Brearley's graduates to say thank you to the Kenilworth community. It is also a another example of the David Brearley Middle and High School students' concern for, involvement in, and dedication to their Kenilworth community.

This year's winner of the Class of 2012 Graduation Food Challenge was the David Brearley Middle School's graduating 8th grade class. Congratulations to the Bruins! All of the food collected was donated to the St. Theresa's Food Pantry in Kenilworth, New Jersey. 



The third and final performance of the 2012 season of The Bard on the Boulevard will be Hudson Shakespeare's August 16 presentation of Cardenio, a lost play that has been attributed


ADULTS AND CHILDREN INVITED TO LIBRARYFEST




THE GALLERY ON THE BOULEVARD TO SHOW **PAINTINGS OF DOREEN VALENZA**
