

FIREFIGHTERS TO BE HONORED AT 9/11 MEMORIAL

The New Jersey Union County Fire Chiefs will be hosting a Memorial display during the entire weekend of September 11, 2011 to honor the 343 New York City Firefighters that made the ultimate sacrifice on September 11, 2001. This Memorial will be a display of 343 American flags, one for each FDNY firefighter. They will be placed on flag poles across a grass field in Echo Lake Park, Mountainside, NJ. This park is home to the Union County 9/11 Memorial. Our goal is to honor those brave men of the FDNY and remind the public what they did on that tragic day and what firefighters do every day. After September 11th everyone was displaying the American flag to show support of our nation and the FDNY. We feel a large display of our country's flag will be a great way to remember and honor our brother firefighters on the 10th anniversary of 9/11/01.

We are seeking people to sponsor a 3 by 5-ft. flag for this Memorial. The cost per flag is \$50.00 and at the conclusion of the Memorial, anyone sponsoring a flag will receive it along with a certificate stating that the flag was flown as part of the 9/11 10th Anniversary Memorial. DAVID BREARLEY SENIORS CLEAN-UP THE JERSEY SHORE



The David Brearley High School students of Mr. Sona's and Mr. Ciborowski's Oceanography classes visited Sandy Hook's Gateway National Recreation Area in June. All of the students in these Oceanography classes are graduating high school seniors. The students toured the historical sites of Fort Hancock and the oldest functioning lighthouse in the United States. Students then went seine netting and observed the many different species that inhabit the waters of the Sandy Hook Bay and Horseshoe Bay. The David Brearley High School students then took part in a beach cleanup project. They scavenged for trash and floatables and filled-up several bags of trash. The trip was finalized with a stop at the 266-foot tall Mt. Mitchell. South of Maine and all the way to the Yucatan peninsula in Mexico, Mt. Mitchell is the highest point of elevation on the Atlantic coast. It is also an observatory and the site of Monmouth County's 9/11 Memorial which is a tribute to 147 men and women who lost their lives in the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, men and women born, raised, or residing at the time in Monmouth County.




