I would first like to thank all of the young adults who took part in the Borough's annual Youth in Government Day on May 25, 2011. Rajiv Dave. This is one of my favorite meetings. It provides the participants with a small glimpse of what the governing body does.

SEPTEMBER 11th MEMORIAL IN PLANNING STAGES

Through the combined efforts of Mayor Fiamingo, Chief Grady, the Kenilworth PBA, the Kenilworth Fire Department and Rescue Squad and the Veteran's of Foreign Wars Post 2230, the tenth anniversary of the attack on the World Trade Center will be commemorated with a new memorial to the three individuals from the Borough who were killed in the attack.

Instrumental in both the design and the installation of the memorial are Bob Vesselli of Vesselli Landscape & Design and Dave Kokai of Dave's Landscaping. "Bob and Dave are donating a great deal of their time and expertise to this project and it cannot be completed without them", said Bob Jeans, Commander of the VFW Post 2230. When Commander Jeans was asked by Chief Grady to become a part of the planning committee he immediately thought of both Bob and Dave. "I was thrilled that Bob and Dave agreed to help", said Mayor Kathi Fiamingo, "We absolutely could not have afforded to do this project without their help and I just can't thank them enough."

Included in the design will be a three foot portion of a steel beam from the twin towers at the Trade Center which was given to the Kenilworth Fire Department as a result of their responding on the day of the attack. "The KFD is proud to contribute this piece of history to the Borough's memorial", said Chief Lewis Giordino. The Department plans to incorporate a larger piece of the beam in a monument to be established at the Fire Department building at a later date.

Sgt. Robert Kaulfers, Mr. John Tobin and Mr. John Ueltzhoeffer each had significant ties to the Borough of Kenilworth when their lives were cut short by the terrorist attack on the World Trade Center on September 11, 2001. Both SgtKaulfers and Mr. Tobin were living in the Borough at the time of their deaths. John Ueltzhoeffer was born and raised in the Borough and his father, John, was a member of Borough council from 1976-1984.

The Pride in Kenilworth Committee is accepting donations to defray the costs of the



memorial. All checks should be sent to Pride in Kenilworth Committee, 9/11 Memorial Project, 567 Boulevard, Kenilworth, NJ 07033. "All donations are welcome", said Mayor Fiamingo, "We know that all the residents of Kenilworth will want to help with this Project. If everyone donated even a small amount we would be able to completely cover the costs of this project."






FUNDRAISERS FOR A DAVID BREARLEY STUDENT IN NEED!



PROVIDING WORLD CLASS CAREER ACADEMIES IN KENILWORTH

Four career academies are slated for launch in 2012-2013 in the Kenilworth School District. Each school "within" the larger high school will serve approximately 15-20 students whose fouryear Brearley High School career will culminate in an immersive senior year program that will transition them to a college or university level program.

The David Brearley Middle School Academy of Math and Science will engage Sixth to Eighth Graders in integrated learning experiences that will provide them initial exposure to engineering and research careers. The David Brearley High SchoolSTEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) Academy, the Academy of Sports Management and the Academy of the Arts will provide Ninth to Twelfth Graders who have targeted their career interests, small and immersive learning environments taught by the district's own specialists.

Academies will be career focused. Students will connect the real world to everything that happens in the classroom. Academy curricula will emphasize real-world applications whenever new concepts are introduced and each program will be crafted to show students how their studies will lead to a career in their respective field.

Students will be educated in smaller class settings as they interact with peers in intimate learning communities with those who have similar interests. Each academy will house approximately 15-20 students, and they will develop learning partnerships with their teachers Dr. Scott Taylor, Assistant Superintendent

with whom they will work all four years of their academy experience.

Global awareness will be a theme of all of the academy programs. Students will use technology to serve the global community and will work with researchers, practitioners, and peers from around the world by using videoconferencing tools and social media to develop their early careers in the context of global demands. Service learning will be a foundational component of this program. Students will use electronic tools to help people around the world, using the skills they acquire throughout their academy studies.

Field experiences, including mentorships with professionals, will be one of two senior year capstones to the four-year academy sequence. Senior academy students will participate in a field mentorship and will shadow selected professionals, working side by side with them for one semester. Students will be exempt from "seat time" in certain classes during their senior year so they may go off-campus to fulfill the work experience requirement.

A second senior year capstone will have all students building higher knowledge while accumulating college credit. Academy students will be enrolled in college-level classes that support their career-focus and can lead to a full semester of higher education credit. Partnerships will be developed with regional colleges and universities to provide Brearley Academy students will additional resources and opportunities that support their career pursuits in science, technology, math, and engineering, as well as sports management and the arts.

One of the keys to the success of the David Brearley Academies will be having the high school and local businesses foster relationships that would have our senior students working in local offices, shops, and service providers in the area. 




