

## STUDENTS RECOUNT VIETNAM WAR FROM VET'S FIRST HAND EXPERIENCES

Mr. Robert Jeans visited David Brearley High School recently to make a presentation to Mrs. Westbrook's United States History Year Two classes on the Vietnam War.

Bob Jeans is the Commander of the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post #2230 -Kenilworth Veterans Center. Mr. Bob Jeans is also a veteran of the Vietnam War and served in active duty from 1968 to 1970. He received numerous awards and medals during his years of service including: Two (2) Bronze Stars, Distinguished Service Medal, Purple Heart Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Combat Infantry Badge, Two (2) Presidential Unit Citations, and a National Defense Citation.

He brought all of these metals and awards to the presentation. He very proudly displayed and explained all of them to his student, faculty, and administration audience. He also displayed a large map of North and South Vietnam and explained the geographical aspects of the war and several of its major offensives.

He is a true hero, patriot, and also a tireless volunteer. He routinely gives back to his country and his community through his work at the VFW Post #2230 and through his informative presentations and discussions with today's students. His presentations and discussions enlighten today's youth about the sacrifices that men and women have made and continue today

to make for their country and for freedom. He discussed some of the horrors of war; the political and historical differences between now and during the "Cold War" years; the differences between American and Vietnamese cultures, beliefs, and civilizations; and the historical significance of the Vietnam War.



## **HOW DOES TEMPERATURE AFFECT PARTICLE MOTION?**

#### This article was written by 6th graders Conchetta Aronowitz and Katrina McCarthy

Sixth grade students from St. Theresa's School in Kenilworth, New Jersey, know the answer. With the help of their science teacher, Mr. Moore, they were able to put their knowledge to the test. The students put red dye into hot, cold, and room temperature water. They then observed the movement of the dye in the different temperature waters for two minutes. They came up with the conclusion that particles move faster in warmer waters than in cooler waters. In the hot water the dye moved extremely fast throughout the cup. In the cup with cold water the dye moved slowly, in a way that they could see it gradually move. The dye in the room temperature water moved faster than the cold water, but not as fast as the dye in the hot water. This was an exciting experiment for the students and there will be many more to come.
