

# 10TH STREET LIVE TO HOLD RIBBON CUTTING AND OPEN HOUSE

Saturday, April 14th 2012 will witness the grand opening and ribbon cutting ceremony at "10th Street Live" in Kenilworth. The newly renovated venue, located at 104 N. 10th Street, has made fast progress in establishing itself as the premier spot for "Music, Food, & Drink" in the area. Kenilworth Mayor Kathi Fiamingo will perform the honors of cutting the ribbon.

The bar formerly known as "Apples" was purchased over the summer and given a complete facelift from top to bottom. Construction on "10th Street Live" was completed in November, and little by little the surrounding community has come into its doors to experience first hand the plan to transform the establishment from another local bar to a full service pub and grill that caters to many different demographics.

There is a deep respect and passion for the arts within the facility. In 2009, the owners at 10th Street Live opened "Soundwaves Recording Studio" in Union, which has been host to creative projects from many areas of the arts. "Little Steven" Van Zandt chose Soundwaves to launch his video project "Fuzztopia," which over time has hosted over 50 bands and songwriters. Most recently, Hollywood Records artists "Allstar Weekend" completed production on an upcoming EP.

Soundwaves also features rehearsal studios that are booked solid on most nights. The artists had a constant gripe: "there is nowhere around here to make an honest buck doing what we love." The purchase of "Apples" was made in response of this desire.

There are four partners in this venture, all of which are lifelong residents of Cranford and Springfield. Bobby Vetter and Steven Blau have been in business together for the better part of a decade. Their other businesses are in construction and delivery services respectively. Tommy Stratton and Kevin Bryan were brought into the mix at the inception of the Soundwaves project. They came in as music industry

veterans, spending their coming of age traveling around the world performing and recording albums with their band "Socratic." Their insight into the music business, combined with the business experience of Vetter and Blau has emerged into a truly unique and productive partnership. They also strive to have a family-oriented attitude in all of their decisions, oftentimes relying on their seven collective children and families when deciding how to move forward. This philosophy has gone a long way towards providing the community with a positive place to spend time, and the reception from the community has been nothing but positive since the project began.



# A MAJOR STUDY SHOWS TEACHERS INFLUENCE MORE THAN JUST ACADEMIC LEARNING

A January 6, 2012 New York Times article titled "Big Study Links Good Teachers to Lasting Gain" highlighted the important points of a major new study, the likes of which have not been seen since the late 1960s, that shows just how much of a positive impact good teachers can have on children's growth. The study concluded that elementary and middle-school teachers who help raise their students' standardized-test scores have a wide-ranging, lasting positive effect on those students' lives beyond academics, including lower teenagerates and greater pregnancy matriculation and adult earnings.

This study tracked 2.5 million students over 20 years and was conducted by Raj Chetty and John N. Friedman of Harvard University and Jonah E. Rockoff of Columbia University. The researchers concluded, "Overall, our study shows that great teachers create great value."This value is as much the propensity for good teachers to improve social and emotional habits as they do academic growth. In other words, the better the teacher, the more likely the child will mature as a confident, independent, and productive adult.

impact of this study. One of the district'ssix long-term initiatives focuses squarely on cultivating great teachers. Who we hire matters, but how we develop our talent matters just as much. This initiative calls for high-quality professional development. Six half-days and three full days of targeted training have only the most experienced and noted practitioners and scholars in our field facilitating workshops. On February 16, 2012, two noted professors from New Jersey City University (Dr. Christopher Shamburg and Dr. Laura Zieger) led our teachers into the new frontier of instructional technology. Kristine Gibson, widely recognized throughout the state as an expert on standardized test preparation, showed participantshow they could calm their students' fears and promote the stamina they'll need when they take the NJASK and HSPA exams in the spring. Bob Fitzpatrick, the 2007 National Association for Sport and Physical Education Teacher of the Year), engaged the entire district physical education team in a workshop all about personal wellness titled, "Lifetime Fitness Skills to Improve the Quality of Your Teaching."

The bottom line is that our community's Kenilworth's school district recognizes the schools recognize the power of great teaching

and its leaders are cognizant of the need to take our talent to a world class level by providing them world class professional development. There are few quick fixes that can help children evolve into happy and productively independent adults; the most basic and fundamental asset we have with which to improve the lives of our students is our faculty.

Prior to joining Girl Scouts of the USA, Brooks was employed by Motorola as director of customer advocacy, training and technical publications. Previously, she held various executive positions with AT&T.

Brooks holds B.A. degrees in English, advertising and communications from Michigan State University in East Lansing, Mich., and a master's degree in organizational management from the University of Phoenix. Additionally, she completed the Duke University Fuqua School of Business Advanced Management Program.

Brooks is a recipient of a Garden State 2012 Woman of the Year award for Youth Leadership and Development. She is a member of the Newark Regional Business Partnership: Somerset County Business Partnership; Newark Goodwill Works! Business Advisory Council; Liberty Science Center Women's Leadership Council; and Champion's Board for the Garden State Girls STEM Collaborative Project (the N.J. offshoot of the National Girls Collaborative Project). Spindel ten will not be allowed admission to the Kenilworth Public Library unless they are accompanied by a responsible adult or designated teenaged babysitter. Previously, library policy restricted attendance by unattended children to those under the age of

According to Library Director Dale Spindel, the change in policy was instituted out of concern for the safety of Kenilworth's children. She pointed out that many parents who instruct their children to come to the library after school may not be aware of the fact that members of the library staff are not responsible for keeping their children from leaving the building, even if specifically requested to do so by a parent. Said Spindel, "While a small number of younger children may be sufficiently mature to handle being in the library for one or more hours after school gets out, there are many others for whom it is difficult at the end of the day to submit to another hour or two of sitting quietly and doing homework, especially when they know that no one will stop them from walking out the door and wandering the Boulevard." "By raising the age for unattended children to ten, the Board of Trustees wants to make it absolutely clear to parents that the library should not be regarded as a practical alternative to after school day care for children who are young enough to require a




(above, l-r) Author Frank Verde chats with Library Director Dale about publishing his first three books.
