

I would first like to thank the second grade students at Harding School for helping make the Borough beautiful by growing vines from sweet potatoes. It was a great deal of fun to visit the children at school and hand out the sweet potatoes. Before the end of school their teachers will bring them to the Boulevard to plant the vines that they have grown in the planters. I am so looking forward to seeing the beautiful vines that they have grown become a part of the planters that the Beautification

Committee will be planting in the next few weeks.

We are still looking for sponsors for the planters, including anyone who would like to donate funds towards the cost of the plants, or who would like to help keep the planters watered and weeded throughout the spring and summer. # **HELPING TO KEEP KENILWORTH BEAUTIFUL**

Second graders at Harding School are helping beautify their community through science. They are cultivating sweet potato plants which make a beautiful vining plant. The science project was the brainchild of Olga Hacket who works in the Harding School cafeteria and is also the chair of the Kenilworth Beautification Committee.

Mayor Fiamingo was on hand on April 18th to visit the 2nd grade classrooms and help Mrs. Hacket hand out the potatoes to the excited students who then prepared them to sprout. When ready, they will be planted in flower pots and planters along the Boulevard where the children can watch their science project grow throughout the summer.

The Borough of Kenilworth is looking for sponsors for their flower pots and planters along the Boulevard. The pots and planters will be filled with flowers in the second week of May. Financial sponsorship of the small pots is \$35. Financial sponsorship of the larger planters is \$100. 



# LIBRARY BOOK GROUP TO DISCUSS MR. PEANUT, BY ADAM ROSS

The book discussion group of the Kenilworth Public Library will meet at 7:15 PM on Tuesday, May 22, in the library's activity room to discuss Mr. Peanut, a debut novel by Adam Ross. The plot focuses on the dilemma of Daniel Pepin, a happily married man who is considered the prime suspect in his wife's unexpected death. The book requires readers to contemplate whether it is ever really possible to know someone completely and to also consider whether murder and marriage are more interrelated than one might think. According to its book jacket notes, "Mr. Peanut is a police procedural of the soul, a poignant investigation of the relentlessly mysterious human heart – and a first novel of the highest order." 

Additionally, "Braille and Audio Reading

Download" (BARD) provides digital audio access to more than 20,000 unabridged books, including current best sellers. The majority of items available through the kiosk are also available to visually or physically disabled patrons with home internet access.

State of the art digital audio players with easy to use features are also available to eligible library users at no cost. 

# KENILWORTH PUBLIC SCHOOLS: MAKING SCHOOL CHOICE WORK FOR THE ENTIRE COMMUNITY

New Jersey has kept pace with the national movement to provide families with a "menu" of K-12 education options. The school choice movement began in the late 1990s, and the state started its own program in January 2000 when the New Jersey legislature created the Interdistrict Public School Choice Program (school choice program) as a five-year pilot program designed to explore whether public school choice would provide a viable educational option for the state's students and their families by offering flexibility in selecting a public school program that best meets the needs of an individual student. Since the expiration of the pilot in 2005, the New Jersey Department of Education has maintained the program at the same level as it had achieved at that time. In June 2010, the legislature established a permanent Interdistrict Public School Choice Program. Under the school choice program, interested New Jersey school districts apply to become choice districts, opening seats into which they will accept nonresident students at the expense of the state.

The Kenilworth School District was among the first group of pilot districts to accept non-resident students. At that time, Kenilworth's board established a policy to only accept Union County non-resident students into its Choice Program. Approximately 20 students are granted admittance to join the Seventh Grade each year. If space allows, additional students are invited to join the Eighth, Ninth, or Tenth Grades. Choice students are provided all of the same opportunities as Kenilworth resident students

once they become members of the Brearley Middle-High School community.

Choice students have contributed positively to the Brearley Middle-High School in at least three ways. As representatives of other communities in Union County, choice students have fostered cultural diversity. Kenilworth residents have opportunities to interact with young adults from all religious, ethnic, and racial walks of life. Choice students have also contributed to the academic success of the middle-high school. Several have graduated as salutatorians and valedictorian, and their standardized assessment scores are among the highest in the school. Finally, it is thanks to the choice program that the Kenilworth School District has been able to offer a myriad of special programs due to state-funded "Choice Aid." The revenue afforded by the Choice Program has led to numerous instructional equipment enhancements and has allowed the district to expand its curricular offerings to all of its students.

There are 71 school districts approved as choice districts for the 2012-2013 school year. A list of these districts by county may be found by going to nj.gov/education/choice/districts. To support the continued growth of the program, Governor Christie has dedicated an additional \$14.2 million for the Interdistrict School Choice program in the FY 2013 state budget in response to the positive feedback the administration has received from participating districts.
