BOOK GROUP TO DISCUSS A VISIT FROM THE GOON SQUAD

The book group of the Kenilworth Public Library will meet in the library's activity room at 7:15 PM on Tuesday, November 13 to discuss the 2011 Pulitzer Prize winning novel A Visit from the Goon Squad, by Jennifer Egan. Also the winner of the 2010 National Book Critics Circle Award for fiction, this novel focuses on the lives of Sasha, a troubled young woman working for a record executive and Bennie

Salazar, an aging former punk rocker who is Sasha's current employer. Participation in the book group is free and open to all members of the general public, age 18 and older, including people who reside in communities other than Kenilworth. Because space is limited, preregistration is requested. Copies of A Visit from the Goon Squad will be available for check out at the library's circulation desk.

LIBRARY SHOWING WORKS BY REKNOWN PHOTOGRAPHER

The Gallery on the Boulevard at the Kenilworth Public Library will present "Close Friends," a showing of works by Larry Gianettino (1956-2002) from October 30 through December 28. Gianettino was a contemporary American photographer whose curious eye continues to instigate childhood memories as well as nightmarish dreams; he has left a legacy that is sure to accommodate and captivate both child and adult alike.

Larry began his adventure in Newark, New Jersey, photographing the strange, but mundane. His early series included dirt, dead weeds, traffic signs, faceless subjects and anything else that intrigued him. This fascination later lead to a degree in Fine Arts from New York University in 1979. His first

one man show was at the Newark Museum where he occupied an entire floor with prints devoted to the history and preservation of the cherry blossom in all its glory. His later escapades were commandeered by cheap childhood toys, many of which were obtained from gumball machines and 5 & 10 cent stores. His lens was hijacked by tiny focal points on these miniature toys, many of which are no larger than one inch. The magnification of tiny points stimulates the mind to reconsider the simplest of perceptions.

In continuing his impact on the photography world, his sister Cynthia Goldrick has undertaken the mission of continuing his legacy through shows and donations throughout the country.

SCHOOL DISTRICT TARGETS THE INTERESTS AND NEEDS OF ALL STUDENTS

The David Brearley Middle-High School launched two programs this year that target young adults' specific learning requirements and career interests. The Alternative Classroom Experience (ACE), one of the new programs, helps adolescents recover high school credit they may not have acquired during the regular school day. The other newly implemented program, the Kenilworth Scholars' Academy, enrolls Grades 7-9 students looking for a "university-level" experience with a focus on science, technology, engineering, mathematics and art fields (STEM-A). Both learning experiences address the needs of two

student populations who often go underserved in school districts around the country.

ACE students are provided a three-hour window of time after regular school hours during which they use a sophisticated online learning system called Acellus. These highschoolers work at a personalized pace through a given course of instruction. Teachers, counselors, and administrators provide support throughout the sessions, and Acellus evaluates student responses through an interactive environment so that courses can be customized to the needs of each individual. Acellus couples comprehensive assessments with targeted video instruction in areas where deficiencies are identified. Parents can check on student's progress in real-time from home or from work. So far, the feedback from students has been very positive and more participants have joined the program than were expected.

Students in Seventh Grade looking for an academic challenge and, though early in their maturity, showing specific career interests

entrance to the selective Kenilworth Scholars' Academy. This program serves students in Grades 7-9 and will, over time, provide a very rigorous course of study for middle and high school students through graduation from Brearley. While working in very challenging classes, Academy students will also partake in frequent field trips to such locations as New Jersey Institute of Technology and the New Jersey Center for Science, Technology and Mathematics at Kean University. Guest speakers will visit the Academy to share their professional backgrounds and engage students in critical conversations about issues related to the STEM fields. In their last year at Brearley, Academy students will take part in weekly mentorship experiences that will have them working alongside professionals who represent their specifically chosen career interest.

The by-product of the implementation of the ACE and Scholars' Academy programs is the creation of smaller and more intimate learning environments that provide Kenilworth's children and adolescents with the highly individualized academic, social, and emotional attention they deserve. Plans for expanding ACE and the Scholars' Academy models are already underway as Brearley gets set to open the Kenilworth Arts Academy in 2014-2015. 

THE FIRST ENGLISH SETTLEMENT OF NEW JERSEY A GLANCE BACK AT THE FIRST PERMANENT ENGLISH SETTLEMENT, 1664

Henry Hudson landed his ship "Half Moon" on the shore of New Jersey in 1609 and claimed the land for Holland. Dutch settlers settled Paulus Hook, now Jersey City, New Amsterdam (New York City) and Staten Island, New York.

English settlers on Long Island, New York, seeking a land where they could have freedom of religion, speech and self-government also desired to live in this area. They applied to the Dutch Governor, Peter Stuyvesant for permission to do so and were rejected.

March 12, 1664, English King Charles II gave





his brother the Duke of York absolute power to govern the land between the Delaware and Connecticut Rivers. The Duke sent Colonel Richard Nicolls with four ships and 450 soldiers to New Amsterdam to seize the Dutch settlement, claim the area for the English, and rule the land as deputy governor.

August 1664 Nicolls sailed his fleet into New Amsterdam waters, disembarked, met with Stuyvesant and demanded Stuyvesant surrender the fort. Dutch citizens saw the situation as surrender or be killed and told Stuyvesant to surrender. August 27, 1664, Stuyvesant lowered the Dutch flag and went home to Holland.

English soldiers took over the fort and offered the Dutch settlers very good terms for living on their land if they swore allegiance to the Duke of York. Nicolls became a deputy governor and renamed New Amsterdam, New York, in honor of the Duke.

Duke of York Gave Lord Berkeley and Sir George Carteret a Gift

On June 23, 1664, the Duke of York gave his two good friends a deed to all the land between the Hudson and Delaware Rivers. He called the land, New Cesarea or New Jersey. Sir Georg Carteret had defended the Isle of Jersey during the British civil war for the Duke, who was very pleased with actions taken by Carteret.

The Duke did not realize when he gave this gift of land to Berkeley and Carteret that he had already sent Sir Richard Nicolls with four ships

and 450 soldiers to subdue the Dutch Fort at New Amsterdam and govern the people remaining on that land.

Deputy Governor Nicholls

Nicolls had his men circulate information throughout the colonies under his command. He directed the colonial settlers to "set out a town and inhabit together." He guaranteed religious freedom, self-government and self-taxation.

Settlers of this new land which he call Albania, had to purchase the land from the Indians after they received a land grant from the governor. Eight families were needed to create a new town and the settlers could choose a name for the town. On group from Jamaica, Long Island, New York, applied for land along the Arthur Kill Waterway, which became present day Union County, New Jersey.

September 24, 1664, the Long Island men met with the Indians to purchase land between the Raritan and Passaic Rivers. The Indians accepted "Twenty fathoms (120 feet) of trading clothes, two coats, two guns, two kettles, ten bars of lead, twenty handfuls of gunpowder, plus 400 fathoms (2,400 feet) wampum shells, to be paid within one year.

In the spring of 1665, families settled areas of New Jersey. The colonist near the Arthur Kill Waterway, Elizabeth River and its West Branch were mostly Puritans. Today's Kenilworth was part of the first permanent English settlement in New Jersey which became Elizabeth Town.

I ran into this guy and he tells me he is running around the world trying to be the first to do so following the Guiness Book of World Records rules. His name is Tom Denniss and according to hiswebsite, tomsnextstep.com since starting in Sydney, Australia on December 31, 2011, he has run about 8000 miles.

This run is expected to take nearly two years, and will cover over 29,000 km. Tom will be raising funds for charity as part of the effort. In simple terms, the event will encompass running the equivalent of 700 marathons in 700 days.

Tom began in Sydney at the Opera House, and will be finishing at precisely the same place. He will be heading in a predominantly easterly direction around the world until he arrives back in Sydney. He will be running on every

continent other than Antarctica, and will be crossing the Rockies and the Andes, running in latitudinal extremes, and crossing deserts.

He has a support crew accompanying him for the duration of his journey. His wife, Carmel is "driving the course" and chronicling the trip.

Guinness World Records has defined the criteria for officially achieving the world record for the "Fastest Circumnavigation of the Earth on Foot". The record is unclaimed to date. There are, however, a few other runners who are currently involved in similar runs.


As of mid October, 2012, He completed the New Zealand leg and most of the US, chalking up over 13,000 km, or more than 300 marathons. The North American leg will be the longest, and concluded in late October.
