

There are four broad initiatives the district has implemented to support curriculum and instruction:

- 3. Professional learning community development.
- 4. Personalized student learning plans.

These important initiatives are being sustained with federal and district funds and are being supported with professional development targeted to help teachers effectively bring the programs into their classroom. Superintendents, building administrators, supervisors, and teachers are all being held accountable for being sure the initiatives are in place and are purposefully aimed at promoting student achievement.

Of course, curriculum effectiveness and imitative implementation are only as successful as the professional support provided to all the stakeholders. Professional development in the form of one to three-year institutes and academies will be individualized to meet administrator and teacher needs. Our New Teacher Institute will involve all first-year teachers in workshops and one-to-one meetings to assure their success. The Kenilworth Technology Academy will guide faculty toward using technology in dynamic ways so as to promote excitement and high levels of student engagement in the classroom.

The school district's dedicated and highly professional faculty is part of the greater Kenilworth community of learners that shares the same goal- to better the social, emotional, and academic lives of the wonderful children it serves. 


### **OFFICIALS MEET GOV**

## **FIVE STUDENTS EARN AP SCHOLAR AWARDS**

Five students at David Brearley Middle High aligned with the same high standards expected School have earned AP Scholar Awards in recognition of their exceptional achievement on AP Exams.

The College Board's Advanced Placement Program® (AP®) provides motivated and academically prepared students with the opportunity to take rigorous college-level courses while still in high school, and to earn college credit, advanced placement, or both for successful performance on the AP Exams. About 18 percent of the 1.8 million students worldwide who took AP Exams performed at a sufficiently high level to also earn an AP Scholar Award.

AP is accepted by more than 3,600 colleges and universities worldwide for college credit, advanced placement, or both on the basis of successful AP Exam grades. This includes more than 90 percent of four-year institutions in the United States. Research consistently shows that AP students who score a 3 or higher on AP Exams (based on a scale from 1 to 5, with 5 being the highest) typically experience greater academic success in college and higher graduation rates than students who do not participate in AP.





# TOUR OF NITSCHKE HOUSE TO PROVIDE **GLIMPSE OF LIFE IN EARLY 1900s**

Kenilworth's historic Oswald J. Nitschke heirloom gardens; to sample a popular early House (c. 1880) at 49 South 21 Street will be open to the general public on Oct. 16 and Oct. 17 during Union County's annual heritage festival, "Four Centuries in a Weekend." Tours of the 19th-century home of Oswald J. Nitschke, who served five terms as Mayor of Kenilworth in the early 1900s, will be given between the hours of 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Oct. 16 and from noon to 5 p.m. on Oct. 17. Light refreshments will be served. Admission is free.

The Kenilworth Historical Society saved the Nitschke House from demolition in 2003 by moving it to its present location and is restoring the historic site for transformation into a "living history" museum and cultural arts center. The project was recognized by the State of New Jersey with a 2008 New Jersey Historic Preservation Award.

The Oct. 16-17 guided tour of the Nitschke House will take visitors back in time to the early 1900s, when Kenilworth was first developing as an independent community. A "living history" program will feature an enlightening, entertaining demonstration of interesting early 20th-century cookware, kitchen implements and culinary practices. Visitors also will have an opportunity to observe recent progress that has been made in restoring the interior of the house; to see newly rendered conceptual drawings for the museum's planned second floor exhibition rooms; to view a premiere exhibition of local post office artifacts and historic postcards; to meet one of the community's earliest postmasters (portrayed by a local historical interpreter); to view the Nitschke House

# **KENILWORTH LEAF COLLECTION**

Your Cooperation Is Greatly Appreciated.

Leaf collection will commence on or about November 1st, 2010. All leaves must be raked to the curb by December 12th for final removal. Our final pass will be made the week of December 13th. Leaf removal and disposal is a huge undertaking, the successful completion of which is dependent upon the cooperation of each homeowner.

Starting December 13th, 2010 through January 2011, all leaves must be placed in a covered 32 gallon trash receptacle and may be placed at curbside for pick-up. Leaves will not be picked up after January 31st, 2011.

Leaves must be raked into the street, leaving a space between the curb and leaves to allow for drainage Residents who do not wish to rake their leaves to the curb may put them in a covered 32 gallon trash receptacle placed at curbside. Do not rake leaf pile(s) onto streets where they will impede traffic or cover any painted street markings, i.e., crosswalks, stop-bars and lettering.

Leaves MUST NOT CONTAIN branches, shrub clippings or other foreign matter. DO NOT RAKE LEAVES INTO OR ON TOP OF STORM WATER CATCH BASINS. In addition, do not bag leaves for street pick up.

Three working units will be collecting leaves within individual districts in an orderly, predetermined pattern. Adherence to these patterns is the only effective method of assuring a fair and successful operation. Residents shall not rake their leaves into the street immediately after the collectors have passed. As always, all leaves will eventually be collected. Therefore, REPEATED TELEPHONE CALLS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS WILL NOT GET THE JOB DONE ANY FASTER. Residents who live along the Boulevard and Michigan Avenue should be aware that their curbside leaf removal is done by the Union County Department of Public Works.

In order to prevent the possibility of fire, do not park vehicles on leaves piled in the street.
