
Dear Mayor Fiamingo:

We have been living in Kenilworth for over 35 years and never witnessed this nightmare. Our home is on the north side at the Cranford border. During Hurricane Irene the water was like a river in front of our home, rushing in the front and back door and kept rising filling up our family room and going up the stairs to our living room. We had to evacuate the premises as the water was coming in so fast we were afraid for our lives.

We could not have survived this nightmare without the outstanding help of all the special people in our town and would like to take this opportunity to thank you for all your help. Police Chief Grady, Fire Chief Giordino and Department of Public Works Superintendent Ryan. Fire Chief Giordino and the tireless. volunteers in the fire department came to our rescue and pumped over six feet of water out of our home. The Police Department kept giving us advice and told us to drive our cars around to get the water out when the water subsided. Officers Lenny Hudak and Brian Pickton came around to see if we needed anything, gave us FEMA information and said they would try to get someone from FEMA to access our damaged home. The Department of Public Works cleaned up all our destroyed belongings during the flood which was a blessing.

We still have no heating or air conditioning and are trying very hard to dry out our home and slowly fix and rebuild everything. Without the use of our telephone it makes it hard to communicate. We pray that this will all be over soon and we will get some assistance from the FEMA.

We thank everyone for your assistance at these difficult times. ## **BOOK GROUP TO DISCUSS THIEVES OF MANHATTAN**

The book group of the Kenilworth Public Library will meet at 7:15 PM on Tuesday, October 11, to discuss the novel Thieves of Manhattan, by Adam Langer. Published in 2010, Thieves of Manhattan is described by Academy Award nominated author and screenwriter Nicholas Meyer as "a richly twisted narrative" and that skewers the competitive and eccentric world of book publishing in a way that is both hip and funny. Part farce, part crime caper, and with a nod to recent literary controversies, the book shines a spotlight on the temptation of some to play fast and loose with the truth in the hope of coming up with a best selling and financially rewarding memoir.

Participation in the book discussion group is free and open to all members of the general public, including people who reside in communities other than Kenilworth. No previous experience with a book group is required and new members are always welcome. ## **MYSTERIOUS BOOK DONATIONS BURDEN KENILWORTH LIBRARY**

Many librarians are known to enjoy a good mystery now and then, but Kenilworth Library Director Dale Spindel, is currently dealing with one she'd just as soon close the book on. On two separate occasions over the past several weeks, an unknown benefactor has left piles of used books on the library's front steps during weekend hours when the library was closed. One of those occasions, the books were drenched by a passing rain storm, leaving a soggy mess for the library's part-time custodian to deal with when he reported to work on Monday morning. Although the intention of the benefactor had undoubtedly been to help the library, the end result was just the opposite.

While there are some public libraries that will accept used books on a limited basis in anticipation of a used book sale, the Kenilworth Public Library does not have enough space available to hold an event of this type. The library is also not able to add to its collection the large number of items that people seek to donate each year. According to Spindel, "there is something repellent to people about the idea of throwing books out, especially expensive ones like college textbooks, but the library just does not have the space to accept everyone's donations and not all of the books that people wish to donate are appropriate for the collection of a small public library." "People who want to donate their used books to the library invariably mean well and may perceive that their donations are helping to fill our shelves but that is really not the case." "We are fortunate that, at the present time, we are still able to maintain a well rounded collection with the budget resources

available to us," she added.

Spindel pointed out that books pertaining to local history are one very important exception to the "no donations" rule. She requests that anyone wishing to make a donation of particular items to the library call her at 908 276-2451 or stop by the library to discuss the nature of the potential donation before dropping anything off.






