

MAYOR AND RESIDENT HONORED BY OPEN GOVERNMENT GROUP

The New Jersey Foundation for Open Government (NJFOG) recognized their 2012 NJFOG LIFT Award recipients at an event held in September. NJFOG is statewide non-profit, non-partisan coalition of individuals and civic, community and journalistic organizations founded in January 2001 that advocates for open government and helped win unanimous legislative approval for the Open Public Records Act and the creation of the Government Records Council in 2002.

Nominations for the NJFOG Lift Award were considered in three categories: Journalists, Political Leaders and Citizen Activists, all of whom contributed meaningful efforts to encourage a government entity to conduct its business in a more transparent way.

This year's recipients in the category of political leaders were Kenilworth Mayor Kathi Fiamingo, South Orange Mayor Alex Torpey and New Jersey State Senator Loretta Weinberg (D-Bergen).

Mayor Fiamingo was recognized for making Kenilworth a role model for government transparency on the internet. Her administration worked with NJFOG and the New Jersey Taxpayers Association to design kenilworthborough.com, at no cost to the Borough.

This year's recipients in the category of citizen activists with ties to Kenilworth included: John Bury of Kenilworth, and Michael Pierone of Warren County.

Michael Pierone is a computer programmer and owner of Lattice Designs, he was recognized for his design of Kenilworth's website. The website went live in July and there are many public records visitors can freely search and download. Pierone is an open government advocate and a board member of NJFOG. He volunteered his time on this project in hopes that once Kenilworth set an example of how government websites should be done, the thousands of other public entities across the state will follow. Good government groups plan to use the Borough of Kenilworth site as a showcase for best practices in open government.

John Bury is a local citizen activist who uses the Open Public Records Act to monitor government pension issues and Union County government. He is an Enrolled Actuary with his own pension consulting firm, Bury Associates, in Union Township, servicing over 400 clients. He is a longtime political observer having had over 200 published letters in the Star-Ledger for which he received a Silver Pen Award in 2008.

He blogs on County Watchers and Bury Pensions primarily on actuarial issues with an emphasis on public pension plans. He has been quoted on pension issues in national publications and other media.

The award recipients were recognized at an Open Government Workshop held at Raritan Valley Community College on Saturday, September 22nd where Senator Loretta Weinberg was a keynote speaker. Weinberg was also given a NJFOG Lift Award, she has been working on updating the Open Public Meetings Act and the Open Public Records Act. Her bills are expected to be put to a vote in the very near future.

WHAT DO ASSESSMENT TOOLS TELL US ABOUT ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE?

I talked in my September article about ways Harding Elementary and David Brearley Middle-High Schools will be performance stories" about children. I mentioned the Kenilworth School District's use of an assessment tool called Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) and explained that teachers will be able to see student data from this assessment as well as from other tools like the New Jersey Assessment of Skills and Knowledge (NJASK) and High School Proficiency Assessment (HSPA) by going to the digital "warehouse" the district has designed.

MAP is a computer-based assessment that changes the complexity of test questions



according to the test-taker's responses in realtime. In other words, students who answer series of questions correctly will be peppered with more challenging questions, and when students struggle with questions, the level of difficulty is adjusted so the test-taker can tackle less sophisticated questions. This adaptive procedure provides the students, their parents, teachers, and school administrators with very accurate information about students' ability to apply skills and concepts they've learned. Teachers will use this information to individualize their students' learning experiences by pinpointing the child's remedial, mastery and challenge needs.

The NJASK and HSPA are not computerbased tests and unfortunately only provide a snapshot of a child's progress. Given over the course of three to four days, depending on the grade-level, these "summative assessments" of a student's performance are a test of a his ability to apply a store of knowledge built up over time. While the NJASK and HSPA serve to determine whether or not kids have met certain benchmarks, they are not on their own indicators of a child's academic growth.

NJASK and HSPA are standardized tests; they are assessments of a child's school progress based on a set of learning expectations. The test scores are often compared to the score results of other children around New Jersey. MAP is not a standardized test: it is an assessment of a child's growth over time and results are not compared to the results of that child's peers. Teachers use the NJASK and HSPA to get a "ballpark" idea how a child may perform in class, while MAP is used to differentiate instruction in order to accommodate specific learning needs. Teachers use MAP scores to group students by ability and provide one to one assistance using skill lists called Descartes (these skills lists can be downloaded from the school district website; a parent can correlate the lists to a child's MAP

Though the Kenilworth School District uses NJASK and HSPA scores as frames of reference of a student's progress, the teachers and administrators at Harding and Brearley are relying on MAP to "tell the story of a child", so they can plot a course of instruction that is highly individualized and targeted to meet each of his or her needs.


