KENILWORTH FREEDOM RUN/WALK SLATED FOR SEPT. 26. EVENT WILL HONOR U.S. ARMED FORCES

A Kenilworth Freedom Run and Walk, hosted by the Kenilworth Historical Society, will be held on Sunday, Sept. 26, 2010 (rain or shine). The 5K Freedom Run and 2K Freedom Walk will each start at 10 a.m. from the North 22nd/21st Street municipal parking lot behind the Kenilworth Seniors' Center. The events are being held in conjunction with the national "America Supports You" program, which recognizes residents' support for U.S. military men and women and communicates such support to members of the Armed Forces at home and abroad.

Awards for the 5K Freedom Run will be given to the top male and female finisher in the overall race and to the top three male and female finishers in each of eight designated age groups (14 and under to 70 and over). Same-day race scoring and recording will be handled by CompuScore Computer Services.

The fee to take part in the noncompetitive 2K Freedom Walk is \$8 in advance (by Sept. 17) and \$10 after Sept. 17. Children, youths and adults of all ages are invited to participate individually or as part of a group/organization. All participants must register in order to receive a commemorative T-shirt.

The registration fees for the 5K Run, a



USATF (U.S.A. Track & Field)-sanctioned event, are as follows: Advance registration (by Sept. 17): \$20; after Sept. 17, \$25; Registration for USATF members (by Sept. 17): \$18; after Sept. 17, \$25.

Interested participants are strongly encouraged to register in advance, as early as possible, to ensure T-shirt availability.

Noted author and historian Walter E. Boright, Ed.D., will present a program on Thurs., Sept. 16, 2010, highlighting the contributions and of late-19th-century Jewish influence philanthropist and pioneer Baron de Hirsch on the early development of New Orange, the area now known as Kenilworth.

"Recent research has revealed new data about the vastness of the Jewish population who settled in New Orange in the late 1800s," noted Boright. "Baron Maurice de Hirsch had a fund that brought many of those settlers here," he added.

The Sept. 16 tribute to local Jewish heritage will be presented at a meeting of the Kenilworth Historical Society at 7 p.m. at the Kenilworth Seniors' Center, 526 Boulevard, Kenilworth, N.J. The general public is invited to attend. Admission is free. Light refreshments will be served following the program.

Boright, a native of Kenilworth who now resides elsewhere in New Jersey, has authored three popular books about Kenilworth history; i.e.: "A History of Kenilworth as Told Through its Streets and Street Signs," "Kenilworth: Houses, People, Pictures, and Stories" and "Women of Kenilworth." He currently writes a monthly Kenilworth history column -"Remembering" -- for the Cranford Chronicle.

Boright is a retired superintendent of schools and a retired director at Kean University. He earned his bachelor's degree at Kean, and

master's and doctoral degrees at Seton Hall University. He has taught New Jersey and American history. Additionally, he has held elected office as a councilman and as a member of the Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders. His father, Walter, Sr., was a Kenilworth mayor in the 1950s and 1960s.

for the back to school crowd, busy parents might overlook one of the most important tools they can get for their children - a card at the Kenilworth Public Library. September, in addition to being the traditional "back to school" time, is also National Library Card Sign-Up Month. Although Kenilworth is fortunate to have excellent libraries and librarians in its schools, the public library also plays an important role in the academic success of local students. Studies have shown that children who are read to in the home and use the library do better in school than children who do not have this important advantage. The Kenilworth Public Library offers an opportunity for parents to participate in their children's reading experiences and reinforce the message that reading is important.

Through its webpage, www.kenilworthlibrary.org, the library provides access to its online catalog, giving cardholders the ability to check the library's holdings and place reserves on items from home. The webpage also provides access to online databases, including a student version of The Encyclopedia Britannica, which can be accessed at home through the Internet at no cost to the user. Additionally, the webpage is the place where parents can stay on top of the library's full schedule of exciting activities and special programs that can be enjoyed by children and their families, including crafts, bingo, toddler time, story times, musical performances, a Friday evening Halloween celebration and even,

Activities specifically for adults include the library's popular book discussion group and writers groups as well as occasional movie nights, musical programs and guest speakers.

> An excellent new service available to Kenilworth Library patrons is the ability to sign up for Wowbrary, a weekly online subscription that provides current information regarding the newest books, audio books, DVDs and CDs that are being added to the library's collection. The library's webpage prominently features a link to the most current Wowbrary issue, along with a link to get you started with your own subscription. Additionally, patrons wishing to subscribe to the library's email updates of upcoming events and acquisitions of the children's department can do so by contacting Robin Koerner, the library's Coordinator of Children's Services at rkoerner@lmxac.org.

> In addition to its excellent collection of books for everyone from babies to seniors, the library currently owns approximately 2,300 DVDs which can be checked out, at no charge, for a three day period. There are also more than 1,000 CDs covering every musical taste imaginable and an ever growing collection of popular audio books in CD format. Through the website, cardholders also have access, through the ListenNJ icon, to hundreds of current and classic downloadable audio books.

> But that's not all!!! The library also provides free high speed access to the Internet as well as two computers that serve as dedicated word

processors, and the extremely popular AWE computer which is specially loaded with fun and educational software for children ages 2 to 9.

Best of all, the Kenilworth Public Library is proud of its people, with a staff that is friendly, knowledgeable and second to none. The library staff stands at the ready to help people find the information they need and the books that they want to read next, regardless of how off the beaten path these requests might be. To see just how helpful and friendly we are, Kenilworth residents who wish to apply for a library card can do so by coming to the library and presenting a current driver's license or other document which provides proof of residency such as a rental agreement or utility bill which includes both the applicant's name and address.

For children under age 18, a parent or legal guardian must present any of the above mentioned forms of identification for themselves and co-sign their child's card. Anyone not residing in Kenilworth but who either works or goes to school with the Borough is also eligible for library borrowing privileges as is anyone residing in any community within Union County with the exception of Summit and Winfield Park.

The recent completion of the library's elevator makes the library even more welcoming to people with disabilities and babies traveling in strollers.


