

STREET MAP OF KENILWORTH WILL PAY FOR STREET FAIR

Because of budgetary constraints the 2012 Kenilworth Street Fair was going to be cancelled. In the past the Borough covered the cost of police, firefighters and public works employees that were needed to produce the event. Cissy Gialanella, owner of JC Promotions, offered a solution on how the costs could be covered and the Street Fair will run as planned on October 21, 2012.

Cissy is publishing a map of Kenilworth that will raise the money needed to pay for the security and clean up services. She called on Renna Media to do the production and distribution. 10,000 maps will be printed with 3,500 to be

mailed to every household and business in Kenilworth; the balance will be given to advertisers so that they may distribute them to customers.



KENILWORTH PUBLIC LIBRARY TO PRESENT **GETTING PUBLISHED: 10 THINGS EVERY WRITER SHOULD KNOW**

The Kenilworth Public Library will offer Lakehurst Elementary School. A member of "Getting Published: 10 Things Every Writer Should Know," a presentation by New Jersey author Jon Gibbs, at 7:00 PM on Thursday evening, September 20, in the library's activity room. The program will focus on the rapid rate of change in the publishing world and on how the development of e-books, e-zines and selfpublishing have led to more opportunities for writers than ever before. Gibbs will focus on ways writers can make the path from creation to publication easier for themselves, including ways to improve your work and, for those looking to follow the traditional publishing route, ways to get that acceptance letter much faster.

Born in England, Jon Gibbs now lives in New Jersey, where he is "author in residence" at several writing groups, including Society of Children's Book Writers and Illustrators, he's also the founder of NJAuthorsNetwork.com and FindAWritingGroup.com His blog, An Englishman New Jersey (http://jongibbs.livejournal.com) is read in more than thirty countries. His debut novel, Fur-Face (Echelon Press) a middle grade fantasy about unusual friendships, unlikely alliances, and wanting to fit in, was nominated for a Crystal Kite Award. The sequel, Barnum's Revenge, is scheduled for publication in 2012.

LIBRARY CELEBRATES 10-YEAR BOOK CLUB ANNIVERSARY


Ten years ago a Kenilworth Library patron suggested to Library Director Dale Spindel that a book discussion group be formed. The roots were planted when three participants met to discuss the group's first book, Tell Me a Riddle, by Tillie Olsen in August 2002. The group soon blossomed. The group read two books in 2002, 7 in 2003 and has been holding steady with 9 books annually in recent years. The group, which consists of both Kenilworth residents and out of towners, is currently reading their 89th book. Participation fluctuates with each book, anywhere between 8 and 18 people show up to meetings, which are held about every six weeks.

Participation in the book group is free and open to all members of the public age 18 and up. Previous experience in a book group is not required and new members are always welcome.

The book group of the Kenilworth Public Library will meet at 7:15 PM on Tuesday, October 2, in the library's activity room. Book title: We Need to Talk About Kevin, by Lionel Shriver

Published in 2003 and winner of the 2005 UK-based Orange Prize for best English language novel by a female writer, Shriver's book was adapted into a feature film of the same name in 2011. Told from the point of view of Kevin's mother through a series of letters written to her husband, the details of Kevin's difficult childhood, culminating in a massacre he perpetrates at his high school, are gradually revealed to the reader. Like Kevin's mother, readers will be left pondering the underlying motivations for Kevin's actions.



KENILWORTH LIBRARY IS PARTNERING TO SERVE THE PRINT DISABLED

The Kenilworth Public Library and The New Jersey State Library Talking Book & Braille Center (TBBC) have partnered to bring TBBC's no-cost services to the residents of Kenilworth. Anyone who has difficulty reading standard print or has trouble either holding a book or turning the pages of a book may be eligible. Once registered for the program with TBBC, residents will be able to select from a variety of no-cost services that includes audiobook player, audiobooks, braille books, downloadable audiobooks and audio magazines, and news reading services such as audiovision and Newsline.

As part of this partnership, the Kenilworth Public Library is offering free, pre-loaded flash drives of digital audiobooks to eligible residents. Those eligible can choose from a flash drive of bestsellers, mysteries or romances.

"This initiative will help us expand the services of the Talking Book and Braille Center to new, underserved populations in New Jersey," said Adam Szczepaniak, director of TBBC. "It will help to make a difference for those who, for whatever reason, have difficulty reading printed





Library staff will be available to help explain the eligibility criteria for TBBC's services, provide applications and explain the application

provide applications and explain the application process. They will offer a flash drive to those eligible and instruct them on how to use it on the digital audiobook player provided by TBBC.

"It is important that people who love to read

are made to understand that a loss of vision or physical dexterity is no longer something that has to stand between them and the enjoyment of their favorite authors," said Kenilworth Public Library Director Dale Spindel. "The staff of TBBC has effectively deputized us in their efforts to reach out to everyone whose lives can be made better through access to their services."



KENILWORTH LIBRARY TO SCREEN DOCUMENTARY, IN SEARCH OF HAYDN

In a continuing series of documentaries by British filmmaker Phil Grabstein, the Kenilworth Public Library is pleased to host one of the only US screenings of his latest film, In Search of Haydn, at 6:30 PM on Thursday, September 27, in the library's activity room. Although less of a household name today than either Mozart and Beethoven (the subjects of two previous films by Grabstein), Franz Josef

Haydn achieved more critical acclaim and financial success during his lifetime than either of these two younger composers, both of whom were acquainted with Haydn during their lifetimes. Credited as the father of both the modern string quartet and symphony, Haydn's status as a giant of classical music is secure, even in spite of the fact that his music remains mostly unknown to the general public.

Admission to this showing of In Search of Haydn is free and open to all members of the general public. However, because space is limited, preference in registration will be given to residents of Kenilworth; if space permits, registration will open to residents of other communities on Tuesday, September 25. WITH THE OPENING OF THE NEW SCHOOL YEAR COMES PROGRESS

Dr. Scott Taylor, Assistant Superintendent, Kenilworth Public Schools

The start of the 2012-2013 academic year is a marker of how far the Kenilworth School District has come in promoting positive change that is focused on student achievement. This is what students and parents can expect to see when they come back to school on September 6:

The "story" of a child told-

Student performance information, culled from standardized test scores, an in-house assessment tool called Measures of Academic Progress (MAP), and end-of-year unit tests are now warehoused in the district's student information system. Every teacher has access to his/her student's performance since the data has been collected. Ultimately, the warehouse will be populated with years worth of performance information that will enable teachers to look at the history of the child's abilities over vast periods of time.

implementation of high quality curricula now aligned to the rigorous national standards-

Harding Elementary School teachers will be using a new math program called Go Math that is aligned to the Common Core Standards. A school-wide emphasis will be on providing individualized instruction in small group settings which will allow for the differentiation of instruction on a much greater scale. The high school's math and language arts curricula have been aligned to the national standards as well. Students served in both subject areas will be using new textbooks and a more diverse collection of high-interest novels. In the area of history, a greater focus will be placed on

Kenilworth history as the social studies department in the district revised its Grades 7-11 program. The capstone course for this program will have every Kenilworth young adult engaged in critical analysis of current issues around the world in a class called "Global Studies." Other curricula revised this year are the middle school's Quest Program (a social-emotional skills building class) and the Harding Elementary School gifted and talented program.

Start of two important programs to meet individual student needs-

The Brearley Middle-High School will launch two programs that target young adults' specific learning requirements and career interests. The Alternative Classroom Experience (ACE) will help adolescents recover high school credit they did not acquire during the regular school day. The Kenilworth Scholars' Academy will enroll Grades 7-9 students looking for a "university-level" experience with a focus on the science, technology, engineering, mathematics and art fields (STEM-A).

Deployment of iPads and document cameras throughout the district-


To ensure Kenilworth's children and young adults are prepared to enter the 21st Century workforce, the school district will be engaging them with the same technology they'll use "on the job" when they graduate Brearley High School. Over 100 iPads are being distributed to classrooms in all three schools and more than 60 document cameras (devices that project anything placed under a high resolution digital

camera) will be given to teachers and students so that the visual learning experience is greatly enhanced in all content areas.

I invite Kenilworth's residents to call my office or email me to learn more about the long-range plans the district has put in place to turn the town's schools into world class institutions.

HEALTH FAIR – SEPTEMBER 29TH

Kenilworth Board of Health President, Randy M. Moscaritolo, announced that the Michael L. Vitale, Sr. Health Fair will be held on Saturday, September 29th, 2012 at St. Theresa's Elementary School, 540 Washington Avenue, Kenilworth, NJ from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m.

Health Professionals will be providing screenings and educational materials for: Vision, Hypertension, Dental, Colorectal cancer, Hearing, Vascular Educator, Prostate Health, Posture, Scoliosis, Breast self-exam, Podiatry, Diabetes and Blood Chemistry (SMAC/CBC).

NOTE: If you are taking the SMAC/CBC blood test, You Must Fast after 12AM the night before. DO NOT TAKE THE DIABETES TEST.

The following IMMUNIZATIONS will also be provided at no cost: DPT for ages one to seven years old; MMR-ages 15 months to six years old (three in one Vaccine provides protection against Measles, Mumps, and Rubella), Polio vaccine-ages one to eighteen years; Tetanus booster shots for adults.

The SMAC & CBC Blood test will be offered FREE of charge to Kenilworth Residents and a \$22.00 fee for non-residents. There will also be a \$30.00 charge to residents taking PSA (Prostate Screening) and \$35.00 to Non-Residents.

FLU SHOTS will be available at a cost of \$20.00.

The Blood Centers of New Jersey will be accepting blood donations in their mobile unit located in the parking-lot area. Anyone planning to donate blood should eat prior to donating.

Fees may be subject to change by the Laboratory. Snacks provided for blood donors and individuals having had blood work.



Edith S. Bird September 30, 1918 -August 3, 2012


