

She loves the adrenaline of walking into a home and being able to help someone. "That smile, that thank you, that hug, that's everything you need to make it worth it," she said.

Isabel has two daughters, Jenennia Colanos is a Junior at David Brearley High School and will be turning 17 in June. Jenennia wants to volunteer as an EMT cadet and ride with her mother. Isabel's other daughter, Kristina Franko, is an

Isabel wants to enroll in classes this summer to learn sign-language to service her deaf customers. The Kenilworth Police Department has Isabel on their call list in case they should need a Spanish or Portuguese translator.

Isabel is passionate about her community service. When President Obama called for citizens to volunteer she signed up for "Renew America Together" (website found at usaservice.org). This presidential initiative is meant to help citizens build communities, find opportunities to serve and share their results. 

With Christ as the example, the Saint Theresa Community grows in a family atmosphere in which each individual experiences respect, challenge, responsibility and exceptional love.

In June 1950, due to the rapid expansion of the newly formed parish the need for a school was more pressing than ever before, plans to build an elementary school, combination church-auditorium, and convent were announced by Father McVeigh in October 1953. Sunday, December 13, 1953, groundbreaking ceremonies were held for the new buildings.

In September 1954 the first nuns of the Dominican order took residence in the newly completed convent.

Within 5 years after the completion of the new school, it was found that more room was needed. The total enrollment in the school was 675. In November 1961 Father McVeigh announced plans were being made to temporarily lease the old Borough Hall on the Boulevard for classrooms, once the new municipal building was completed.

by the parochial school, which results in a saving to the Borough at large, the Town Council agreed to lease the old borough hall.

In September 1962 the work of converting the building into four classrooms was completed. With the total school enrollment in excess of 700 students, the classrooms were utilized immediately, and the split sessions eliminated.

In May 1963, groundbreaking ceremonies were held. The new addition, a 2 story wing, was designed to house 8 additional classrooms and a library, eliminating the need for classrooms in other buildings.

On April 16, 1964 classes were transferred from the old Borough Hall to the newly completed school addition.

In 1978 The Salesian Sisters of St. Don Bosco took over from the Dominicans and the next 30 years saw many technological changes such as a state of the art completer lab.

In 2008 a new playground was opened. Over \$175,00 was donated from very generous supporters throughout the community.
