





## DEEP FREEZE EXPERIENCED BY DAVID BREARLEY MIDDLE SCHOOL

Mr. Milton Peabody, an engineer from Alcatel-Lucent in Murray Hill, NJ visited the David Brearley Middle School 8th grade classes in Kenilworth, NJ. These 8th grade science honors classes are taught by Mrs. Candace Grimaldi and Mr. Curtis Cerillo. The presentation and demonstration topic was on cryogenics, the study of cold. Mr. Peabody used containers of dry ice(solid CO2)and liquid nitrogen(N2) to create very cold temperature environments(-78.5 °C or -109.3 °F and -196 °C or -320.5 °F, respectively) in the classroom. He used these very cold environments to

demonstrate how gases, liquids, and solids behave at very low temperatures. The liquid Nitrogen was used to freeze flowers. He visited the classes on Friday, November 13th, 2009 for the entire period so that each student could take a turn with the liquid nitrogen and freeze their flowers. Then the students were allowed to smash the frozen flowers and they shattered like glass. The students were amazed by the demonstration and excited to experience "the chemistry beyond the textbook" first hand. Hands on experiences and experimentation guarantee student understanding and learning.



Literacy Volunteers of Union County is a nonprofit, volunteer driven organization that improves the lives of adults by teaching them to read, write and speak English so they can participate more fully in family, workplace and community life.

Tutors meet with their students one hour a week at public libraries throughout Union You do not need any teaching experience and it is not necessary to know a foreign language to become a volunteer. Through the program, adult learners have been able to obtain a driver's license, earn a high school equivalency diploma, and increase their ability to get better jobs and be more productive workers.

Other adult learners are giving back to the community by facilitating a support group, teaching a computer skills class at a local library to adult learners and conducting conversation groups to enable students to become more comfortable in speaking and writing English.

Registration has begun for the Winter Session of the New Tutors Training Workshop Series. This 15-hour workshop will be conducted over three Saturdays. The three sessions will take place at the Rahway Public Library located at 2 City Hall Plaza, Rahway, on January 30, February 6, and February 13, 2010. This is a change to previously announced dates and locations. All three sessions begin at 9:30 am and conclude at 2:30 pm. There is a \$40 Registration Fee to cover the cost of materials used for training. Need based scholarships are available to cover the registration fee.

Because of the current economic situation, the possibility that people are going to bed hungry here in New Jersey is a cause for real concern. According to a 2008 report by the Food Research and Action Center, 1.6 million people in our state can be counted as being among the working poor, with 729,211 living at or below the federal poverty level. According to America's Second Harvest Study: Hunger in America 2006, even before the recession, 40% of the households that received food from Community FoodBank of New Jersey had to choose between paying for food and paying their rent while forty-one percent had to choose between paying for food and paying their utilities or heating fuel and thirty-one percent had to choose between paying for food and paying for medicine or medical care.
