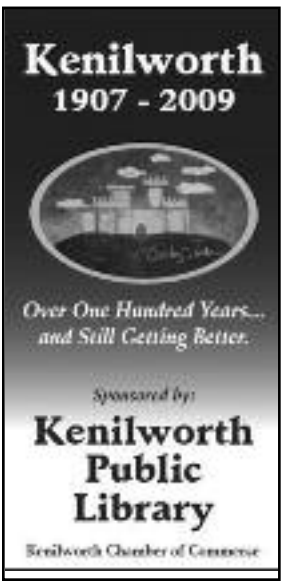

BICYCLE SAFETY STARTS AT HOME

Parents teach their children some of the most valuable lessons in life, and provide them with knowledge that will last a lifetime. Now that schools are out and summer has arrived, parents have the perfect opportunity to spend time with their children and reiterate the importance of safe bicycle riding. The Kenilworth Police Department offers the following information to help parents educate their children on key issues of bicycle safety.

Wearing a helmet is not only the most important safety issue regarding bicycle riding, it also the law. New Jersey state law requires all bicycle riders 17 years old and younger to wear a properly fitting helmet. A child who violates this law is warned of the violation and the child’s parent or guardian is subject to a fine of \$25 to \$100. Each year, many bicyclists are killed or injured in New Jersey due to bicycle crashes. Bicycle crashes can happen anywhere, including parks, bike paths and driveways. Even the most minor incidents can result in serious injury. Wearing a properly fitting helmet significantly reduces the risk of head injury, which is the most common cause of death among bicyclists.

In New Jersey, bicycles are considered vehicles and must follow the same laws as motorists. Bicyclists must ride on the right side of the road with the flow traffic and obey all traffic signals. Bicyclists should never attempt stunts or tricks, ride with more people on the bike than for what it was designed, “hitch” rides by holding onto moving vehicles, weave in and out of traffic or between cars, ride against the flow of traffic, or ride at night without lights. When crossing the street, bicyclists should cross at marked crosswalks, cross only when traffic is clear or when there is a “WALK” signal at an intersection with traffic lights, and should dismount their bicycle and walk it across the roadway.

Bicycles should also be routinely inspected/maintained to ensure they are in good working order and sized properly for the rider. The tires/wheels, brakes, chain, reflectors, and seat height should be checked before every use to help prevent malfunction.

KENILWORTH RESIDENTS COUNTY-WIDE EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

Kenilworth residents are encouraged to sign up for UCFirstAlert (www.UCFirstAlert.org) which is an emergency text and voice messaging system that communicates critical information to first responders and the public during a crisis.

UCFirstAlert enables Borough and County officials to send e-mail and text and voice messages to first responders and more than 500,000 citizens via cell phones, pagers, Blackberrys, computers and other mass notification media during an emergency. Alerts can be sent simultaneously to all of these devices, providing redundant communications for first responders and increasing the likelihood that each resident will receive the message no matter where they are located.

For the special needs community, UCFirstAlert features emergency message delivery via Telecommunications Device for the Deaf/Teletypewriter (TDD/TTY) without pre-registration or administrative configuration.

“Providing information to Kenilworth citizens as quickly as possible is one of the most critical factors in saving lives and preventing injuries during an emergency,” Mayor Kathi Fiamingo stated. Mayor Fiamingo was one of the first Mayors to sign on to this project with the county. She added, “Whether we are dealing with floods, winter storms or threats to homeland security, implementing UCFirstAlert will make our community better prepared for any kind of emergency.”

According to Police Chief/OEM Coordinator William Dowd, Kenilworth residents can sign

up for UCFirstAlert for free by texting UNION to 411911 on your cell phone or visiting www.UCFirstAlert.org or by picking up a flier at the front desk of Police Headquarters to mail in to the county. Through the website, users can customize their subscriptions and choose the types of alerts that they wish to receive such as severe weather alerts, traffic notifications, Amber Alerts and crime information. The public can also receive general news and event information such as event details for county parks and local government updates. Subscribers can select multiple municipalities, in addition to the one they reside in.

Emergency messages can be initiated by the Union County Office of Emergency Management to activate first responders, notify key government officials and alert the entire county or just the region affected by the threat. Alerts can also be sent by one of the counties cities, towns or townships to their residents and bordering towns for possible threats that cross city lines.

As an initiative of 2008, Freeholder Angel Estrada spearheaded the UCFirstAlert project for the county, a service funded through a grant from the U.S. Dept. of Homeland Security.

Both Mayor Fiamingo and Police Chief Dowd highly recommend residents sign on for this free service that they say will keep everyone fully informed of any type of situation that needs to be disseminated to the public. Standard text messaging rates from your carrier may apply for messages received.
