

In an effort to beautify the Borough, the Kenilworth Chamber of Commerce has embarked on an initiative to update the current street banners.



the world. To put the principles of representative governments into practice, the students of the 8th grade American History classes decided to initiate a class wide project. This project consisted of the students compiling a list of suggestions that their student council could implement to improve the quality of life for all David Brearley Middle/High School students, staff, and faculty. They composed a letter outlining their suggestions to the David Brearley Middle/High School Principal, Mr. Brian Luciani, and also copied the David Brearley Middle School Student Council Advisor, Mrs. Nancy Bechtler.

They developed a heightened understanding of the process needed to achieve a change oriented goal. The students were given the opportunity to have a firsthand experience of the functions of the David Brearley Middle School Student Council as their representative government at the David Brearley Middle School. It was an excellent civics experience. Kenilworth Police Chief Kenneth Grady recently worked with Sister Emy, Principal at St. Theresa's School, to vastly improve its camera security system to further safeguard its students, teachers and support staff. While the school had a system in place, it did not cover the entrance doors or hallways should an active shooter gain

Deeply concerned about security in her school following the Sandy Hook Elementary School shootings, Sister Emy approached Chief Grady for assistance. On the Monday following the Newtown tragedy, they conducted a safety and security walk-through at the school, and our Chief quickly determined the camera system needed to be upgraded.

Chief Grady then contacted Ben Felner, Co-Owner of Better Auto Care, who has experience in installing these types of cameras, and he agreed to help with the installation at the school along with his brother Eli. Next, Chief Grady gained approval from the Kenilworth P.B.A. to purchase a new \$2,400 system with eight extra cameras.

labor, and donated the cable needed to handle these cameras. He and Eli, along with two of their technicians, spent four weekends installing this new system in the school.

St. Theresa's now has a total of 12 surveillance cameras. The system is on a par with those in place at Harding and Brearley schools. The system is connected to police headquarters – they see what the school sees, and at the first hint of trouble can be dispatched immediately. New security mirrors were also installed on the staircases as an extra measure of



NEW JERSEY WATERCOLOR ARTIST JOAN MAZURKIEWICZ TO EXHIBIT HER WORK AT THE KENILWORTH LIBRARY THROUGH APRIL 29, 2013

New Jersey Artist Joan Mazurkiewicz will open a new water color exhibit beginning Saturday, March 2, 2013 at the Kenilworth Public Library. Her show is entitled "Nature is Awesome," The exhibit will run through April 29, 2013. In this Exhibit, Ms. Mazurkiewicz celebrates the beauty and wonder of nature.

The artist is self-taught and was inspired after attending an art show at Seton Hall University many years ago. Her techniques were developed through intense research using available art books, videos and immersion into the Essex Water Color Club classes, the Essex Water Color Club is New Jersey's oldest watercolor organization. It was founded in 1932 to stimulate interest in and advance the art of water media painting. Joan is also a member of the Livingston Arts Association where she met acclaimed landscape artist, Ann Taylor who further coached her and continues to inspire the artist's work.

Joan graduated Upsala College where she earned two BS degrees, one in Economics and the other in Geo Chemistry. She proudly proclaims that her avocation is her artwork and her vocation is in the financial sector. Joan enjoys the balance of both worlds.

Her subjects include "leaves" which come in a variety of shapes and sizes. In the fall, the leaves on the trees go from green, to red, then yellow and finally to brown. This was the inspiration behind "Autumn Leaves". Fall is also the theme of "Mountain in The Clouds" and "Jack-O-Lantern". "Ivy and Snow" which was first shown last year is one of Ms. Mazurkiewicz's favorite paintings because it reveals her personality. It is a bit eccentric but skillfully done and is a good example of her creativity.

Trees and rocks are the topics for "Sea Cliff", River of Ice and Rocks" and "Hidden Lake". All stem from her interest and studies in Geology.

Flowers comprise half of the exhibit. This is because "they bring happiness, color and joy to our world of steel and concrete buildings." The "Elephant Ear Cactus" is found in the desert and brings beauty and color to an otherwise dry, hot and barren landscape. "Tropical Flower" shows how delicate some flowers can be and "Horse Tails" shows us the variety that is within the plant kingdom.

The case received national attention as the fiery, three time unsuccessful presidential candidate, William Jennings Bryant, took up the cause of evolution in the courtroom, facing off

Inherit the Wind became permanently ensconced in American popular culture when it was later made into a movie starring Spencer Tracy and Frederick March taking on the fictionalized roles of Henry Drummond (Darrow) and Matthew Harrison Brady (Bryant).

While the play is based on real events of almost a century ago, the setup of the play takes on an almost timeless, anywhere quality, according to director Jon Ciccarelli. The centerpiece debate of the play, Creationism vs. Evolution, is still with us but the play is concerned with deeper themes and asks the profound question, "who are you?," continues Ciccarelli. Beyond the question of personal identity, the play also depicts families and friends being divided along the lines of this passionately felt and argued issue.

The presentation of Inherit the Wind marks the first time that The Hudson Shakespeare Company will be returning to the Kenilworth municipal courtroom since its 2006 performance of A Few Good Men and also marks the first performance of The Hudson Shakespeare Company's 22nd season of touring plays.



KENILWORTH SCHOOL DISTRICT NOW MOVES TO REFORM PRINCIPAL EVALUATION

Phase Two of the Kenilworth Public Schools' evaluation reform plan has had the district examining its performance review of the principals who lead Harding Elementary and Brearley Middle-High Schools. The first phase of the evaluation revamp led to a major change in the way teacher performance will be assessed. Instructors will now be evaluated based on a four-point scale, relying on 20 components that include aspects like lesson planning, instruction, professional growth, and others.

Principals' performance will now be determined by progress on six broad domains created by educator Kim Marshall that cover the following elements of leadership: diagnosis and planning, priority management and communication, curriculum and data, supervision and evaluation aligned with professional development, discipline and family environment, management and external

relations with the community.

Teachers and principals will be evaluated throughout the year as administrators conduct "walkthroughs" in classrooms, hallways and administrative offices. Walkthrough observations take place for five to 10 minutes. Supervisors, principals, or superintendents record notes about what they see and then debrief with the person being observed a few days later.

Walkthrough observation information will be documented using a web-based software program called T-Eval. Administrators will use laptops or electronic tablets to check appropriate indicators on a computerized form and add narrative that summarizes the lesson. Every administrator will have access to colleagues' teacher evaluation forms in order to foster collaboration among school leaders who will

work together to help individual teachers. In addition, teachers will have immediate access to their evaluations by logging in to the T-Eval system from any electronic device so they can promptly use feedback to make planning or instruction improvements.

Kenilworth's school leaders will be conducting between three and five evaluations for each member of the faculty every year. This will be an approximate 40% increase in the number of performance reviews currently being conducted. It will be our goal to further elevate the quality of instruction and improve student achievement by giving teachers and administrators more constructive performance feedback than ever before. The new evaluation systems are just one more way the Kenilworth School District is striving to be a world class, dynamic community of learners.



A PLAYGROUND LIKE NO OTHER

Toni Giordano, Kenilworth Councilwoman and President of Giordano Construction, has become involved in a most special and enduring construction project: creating playgrounds that will serve as living memorials to all children who have become victims of violence or illness while creating safe places to have fun.

On one recent Saturday morning, Giordano sat in a crowded meeting room at the Fireman's Benevolent Association (FMBA) headquarters in Rahway, along with New Jersey and New York firefighters and police officers, and was visibly moved while watching a video of sevenyear old rapper Baby Kaely performing a song she wrote that honored each victim of the Sandy Hook Elementary School tragedy. Others attending included other business owners, elected officials, corporate VIPs, members of the Reaching All in Need Every day (R.A.I.N.E.) Foundation and Restore The Shore, lawyers, accountants, brothers and sisters. They all stood united and pledged whatever is needed to build playgrounds across the Tri-State area. And as an email from the mother of one of the Newtown victims appeared on FMBA President Bill Lavin's cell phone just in time to emphasize his heartfelt presentation, the Sandy Ground Project was underway.

The project will encompass the building of 26 playgrounds and will require \$2.1 million in fundraising. Countless thousands of children will benefit from this effort. The goals of Sandy Ground are six-fold: restore the shore; remember the fallen; involve the communities; build lasting memorials; coordinate a uniform project and raise funds to do it all.

Giordano Construction has built over 2,900 playgrounds and will lead the building of the 26 for Sandy Ground. The company donated funds to back the first playground, which will be built in Sea Bright. Giordano developed pricing

estimates for everything from the playground equipment down to the refuse containers that will be needed at each site. Each playground will cost approximately \$75,000 to build but through the support of Giordano, the Sea Bright location will be completed for less than half that amount.

The twin tragedies of Hurricane Sandy and Newtown moved many different people and organizations to immediate action. "I'll never forget talking with my daughter on the computer," said Giordano, referring to Newtown, "and my two-and-a-half year old granddaughter was saying, 'they're killing kids."" The emotions being felt and even tears being shed in the conference room that Saturday was palpable. "It was just one thing after another," Giordano continued. "So when Bill said 'it's a crazy idea,' I said it's not crazy, let's do it."

Each playground will have a uniform design with custom colors to honor the victims' families and community preference, and will be fully handicapped accessible. Each site will have a memorial plaque to a victim and will feature a personalized reflection area.

The workforce to build each park will be all-volunteers with 26 chairmen and supervisors – one for each site. And keeping in theme, ideally there will be 26 volunteers per project.

Locations will be chosen by need, support and funding. Criteria for deciding where they go will consider connection to the tragedy, support of the community and support of the local government. Besides Sea Bright, other likely sites include the Highlands, Long Branch, Atlantic City, Union Beach and Stratford, CT (in honor of Victoria Soto, one of the Sandy Hook teachers killed).




