The Kenilworth Public Library is pleased to announce that Kenilworth residents now have free home access to more than 900 downloadable videos through the library's new subscription to MyLibraryDV. Library patrons wishing to get started with this service can visit the library's website at www.kenilworthlibrary.org and click on the tan box with the "MyLibraryDV" logo. To access the service, patrons will need a computer CPU with at least 1GHz and one GB of free disk space along with either a Windows XP with SP2 or Windows 2000 with SP4. The MyLibraryDV website will also provide a free download of Windows Media Player 10 for those who do not already have this software installed on their computers.

MyLibraryDV offers eight different categories or "channels" to choose from, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Each library patron may download up to 10 video titles per week per Kenilworth Public Library card bar code, and all titles are available to all patrons at all times, regardless of the number of patrons wishing to download and view a video at any one time.

The movie channel of MyLibraryDV offers downloads of more than 400 videos, including feature films, documentaries, independent and foreign films. The "how to" channel includes guitar instruction along with episodes of "Antique Road Show" and "Today's Homeowner" home repair videos. The travel channel offers more than 100 episodes from the series "Globe Trekker" and "Rick Steves' Europe" while the food channel includes more than 70 episodes from "America's Test Kitchen", "Michael Chiaullo's Napa" and "Julia and Jacques Cooking at Home." Rounding out MYLibraryDV are more than 50 videos on the health and fitness channel, a literature channel that features special resources for students and author interviews for book lovers and a "Kids" channel that offers a number of popular children's series, including "Boohbah", "Caillou", "Kraft's Creatures" and "Liberty's Kids".

## **MEMO FROM THE MAYOR**

It is that time of year again, the flowers are blooming and the weather is heating up. It is also the time of year that the Borough puts together its budget for the current year and introduces it to the taxpayers.

The budget itself is extremely reasonable. It increased a mere 2.5% on the spending side. The minimal increase is the result of the good work of our various department heads who kept spending to a minimum and our finance committee chaired by Councilman Joho. All of their hard work has resulted in a budget with no fat.

The bad news is the revenue side. In 2008 the Borough's state aid was reduced by almost \$400,000. In 2009, an additional \$43,000 was cut by Trenton. In less than two years the Borough had to make up almost \$450,000 in lost revenues in the worst economic downturn most of us have ever experienced.

In the final analysis, even though the sending side of the budget has been kept to a minimum, the amount the Borough needs to raise from taxes under the current scenario would increase by almost 9 tax points, or more than \$150 per average assessed home. Neither I nor your council finds that acceptable. We have instituted a number of cost saving measures to help in this crisis, including the institution of a hiring freeze, the elimination of all but emergency overtime, and the limitation of part time employees work hours.

In addition, we have made a decision to sell the property at the end of North 18th and 19th Streets, commonly known as the Girl Scout property. This property will be subdivided into seven residential building lots and will be sold to generate funds to add to the budget to reduce the property tax burden.

Your Mayor and council believe that it is irresponsible of us to keep this property as unproductive land at a time when the Borough's taxpayers will be called upon to shoulder an unacceptable tax increase. We believe that the sale of the property is in the best interest of all of our residents.

## TEAMWORK IS HEART OF COUNTY VETERANS BUSINESS ASSOCIATION

Teamwork was a staple of life in the military for former Marine Corps Major Richard Vaill, and now he is bringing that mindset to New Jersey where he hosted the inaugural meeting of the Veteran's Business Association (VBA) in conjunction with the Gateway Regional Chamber of Commerce.

"I wanted to help build a support system for veterans," said Vaill, business development officer at The Provident Bank. "This association allows veterans the opportunity to get together and help each other out."

The VBA was created by Vaill to help make all veterans working throughout New Jersey feel comfortable and connected.

Vaill graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy, Annapolis, MD in 1988 a 2nd Lieutenant in the Marine Corps. He served on active duty from 1988-1993 and was a Logistics Officer with the 2nd Marine Division in Desert Storm.

Following his service, he spent more than 10 years working in the financial industry while remaining a reservist. He then returned to active duty in 2003-2004 as a "hometown link" for the Marine for Life program. His duty was to help recently discharged Marines get settled into civilian life.

"These young Marines have a lot of skill, but they would need assistance with their transition once they left the service," said Vaill. "I would use my resources to get them going."

Vaill would reach out to businesses, arrange introductions and continually network. He found that the law enforcement community was extremely receptive to the placement program, and would hire many of the Marines he

The VBA is a natural extension of the duty he performed as a "hometown link." Vaill, who served in Spain, France, Italy, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait and Liberia while in the military, would like to see the VBA meet at least once a month.

"The mission is twofold, to help veterans network and grow their business, and also help veterans transition out of the armed forces," said Vaill, who had about 40 people turn out for the VBA's inaugural event.

The VBA's next meeting is set for Thursday, May 28 from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Clark.

This is accomplished by periodically conducting a comprehensive selfevaluation of the total school. Through the accreditation process, the school seeks the validation of its self-evaluation by obtaining professional judgment from impartial outsiders on the effectiveness of the total school operation. The intent throughout the process is more than to focus on shortcomings; the chief goal is to seek remedies for inadequacies and to identify and nurture good practices.

Accreditation of a secondary school is on an institutional basis. It should be noted that the whole school, not just one program such as the college preparatory courses, is covered by the accreditation.
