



MULTIPLE OPPORTUNITIES TO SUPPORT KENILWORTH HISTORICAL SOCIETY

A beautiful commemorative coverlet (throw) featuring many of Kenilworth's prominent historic sites; a 2010 Kenilworth calendarplanner illustrated with art work, photographs and writings by David Brearley Middle/High School students; and a commemorative paver in the "Kenilworth Heritage Walkway" at the Oswald J. Nitschke House are available from the Kenilworth Historical Society for your holiday gift-giving needs.

The Kenilworth Commemorative Coverlet is a wonderful heirloom gift that can be enjoyed and treasured from generation to generation.

Its 48" x 68" colored woven design was created in honor of Kenilworth's 2007 Centennial Celebration. It bears the borough's official Centennial logo and features such familiar sites as the Kenilworth Municipal Building (1962); Sayre-Shallcross House; Kenilworth Boulevard and trolley (early 1900s); New York and New Orange Railroad Station (c. 1903); Upsala College (c. 1898); McKinley School (c. 1903); Kenilworth Public Library (c. 1936); Shallcross Pond (Black Brook Park); Kenilworth Police and Fire/Rescue; Kenilworth Inn (c. 1903) and James Arthur residence (c. 1910). The cost is \$60.

The 2010 "Kenilworth 360° + 5" calendar/planner is illustrated with local student-rendered images and writings that provide a

"360-degree view" of everyday life in the community over the course of a 365-day year. The illustrations depict numerous familiar faces and places in Kenilworth. "Kenilworth $360^{\circ} + 5$ " is being sold for \$12 as a fundraiser for the David Brearley art department and the Kenilworth Historical Society, who assisted with the project.

The "Kenilworth Heritage Walkway" offers residents, businesses, and organizations an opportunity to preserve their names in engraved brick pavers leading to the entrances of Kenilworth's foremost historic site, the Oswald J. Nitschke House. The cost of an engraved 6- by 9-inch paver is \$100. Order forms are available at the Kenilworth Borough Clerk's Office (Borough Hall), the Kenilworth Public Library and Especially Yours Florist (13 N. 20th Street).

Proceeds from the sale of the aforementioned items will benefit the Kenilworth Historical Society's ongoing project to restore the local 19th-century Nitschke House and transform it into a "living history" museum and cultural arts center. 



HAPPY MOLE DAY! WHAT IS MOLE DAY?

In order to reinforce learning and demonstrate understanding of the concept of the mole, Mr. Novak's chemistry classes at David Brearley Middle and High School are all invited to participate in the celebration of Mole Day. Celebrated annually on October 23 from 6:02 a.m. to 6:02 p.m., Mole Day commemorates Avogadro's Number (6.02 x 10^23), which is a basic measuring unit in chemistry. The mole is the Le Systeme International d'Unites, abbreviated SI, base unit for the amount of a substance. It is similar to the concept of a dozen equaling the quantity 12. A mole equals the quantity 6.02 x 10²3. Mole Day was created as a way to foster interest in chemistry. Schools throughout the United States and around the world celebrate Mole Day with various activities related to chemistry and/or moles.

For a given molecule, one mole is a mass (in grams) whose number is equal to the atomic mass of the molecule. For example, the water molecule has an atomic mass of 18; therefore one mole of water weighs 18 grams. An atom of neon has an atomic mass of 20; therefore one mole of neon weighs 20 grams. In general, one mole of any substance contains Avogadro's Number of molecules or atoms of that substance. This relationship was first discovered by Amadeo Avogadro (1776-1858) and he received credit for this after his death.

LIBRARY TO SHOW KIDS SHAKESPEARE CAN BE FUN

Looking for something to do when the kids are home from school for teachers' convention? Ms Carter will read from her recently released novel, The Puzzle King, a book which was inspired by the real life experiences of her great uncle Morris, the inventor of the process that allowed for the cheap manufacture of cardboard jigsaw puzzles. The novel, set both in New York City and Kaiserslautern, a small town in Germany, covers the time span from 1892 to 1936 and describes the burgeoning anti-Semitism that was apparent on both sides of the Atlantic in the years leading up to the Holocaust. It is a story of love, family, heartbreak and heroism.

Betsy Carter's previous novels include the critically acclaimed Swim to Me, the coming of age story of a young woman whose quest for independence leads her to a job as a swimming mermaid in an early Florida amusement park. Her other books include The Orange Blossom Special and her national best selling memoir, Nothing to Fall Back On. Additionally, she is a contributing editor for O: The Oprah Magazine and also writes for Good Housekeeping, New York, and AARP, among others. She previously served as an editor at Esquire, Newsweek, and Harper's Bazaar and was the founding editor of

KENILWORTH'S LEAF COLLECTION PROGRAM

The Borough of Kenilworth's Leaf Collection leaf pile(s) onto streets where they will impede Program will commence operation on or about November 2nd, 2009. All leaves must be raked to the curb by December 13th for final removal. Our final pass will be made the week of December 13th. Leaf removal and disposal is a huge undertaking, the successful completion of which is dependent upon the cooperation of each homeowner.

Starting December 14th, 2009 through January 2010, all leaves must be placed in a covered 32 gallon trash receptacle and placed at curbside for pick-up. Leaves will not be picked up after January 31st, 2010.

Leaves must be raked into the street, leaving a space between the curb and leaves to allow for drainage. Residents who do not wish to rake their leaves to the curb may put them in a covered 32 gallon trash receptacle placed at curbside. Do not rake leaf

pile(s) onto or around any handicapdisignated areas or fire hydrants. Do not rake

traffic or cover any painted street markings, i.e., crosswalks, stop-bars and lettering. Leaves MUST NOT CONTAIN branches, shrub clippings, or other foreign matter. DO NOT RAKE LEAVES INTO OR ON TOP OF STORM WATER CATCH BASINS. In addition, do not bag leaves for street pick-up.

Three working units will be collecting leaves within individual districts in an orderly, predetermined pattern. Adherence to these patterns is the only effective method of assuring a fair and successful operation. Residents shall not rake their leaves into the street immediately after the collectors have passed. As always, all leaves will eventually be collected. Residents who live along the Boulevard and Michigan Avenue should be aware that their curbside leaf removal is done by the Union County Department of Public Works. In order to prevent the possibility of fire, do not park vehicles on leaves that are piled in the street.
