

HEALTH FAIR WILL BE HELD ON SEPTEMBER 26

The Michael L. Vitale, Sr. Health Fair will be held on Saturday, September 26, 2009 at Schering-Plough Corporation, 2000 Galloping Hill Road, Kenilworth from 9 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Parking is available in the adjacent parking deck and there will be signs to direct you to this area. Please enter the campus at the main gate off Galloping Hill Rd

Health Professionals will be providing screening services and educational materials for the following health concerns: Vision, Hypertension, Respiratory ailments, Dental, Colorectal cancer, Hearing, Vascular Educator, Prostate cancer, Posture, Scoliosis, Breast self-exam, Podiatry, Diabetes and other Blood abnormalities (SMAC/CBC).

NOTE: If you are taking the SMAC/CBC blood test You Must Fast after 12 midnight the night before. DO NOT TAKE THE DIABETES TEST. The following IMMUNIZATIONS will also be provided at no cost: DPT for ages one to seven years old; MMR-ages 15 months to six years old (three in one Vaccine provides protection against Measles, Mumps, and Rubella), Polio vaccine ages one to eighteen years; Tetanus for adults.

The SMAC & CBC Blood test will be offered FREE of charge to Kenilworth Residents. Non-Residents will be charged a \$28.00 fee for this test. There will also be a \$25 charge to all residents taking PSA (Prostate Cancer) test. A \$30.00 fee will be charged to Non-Residents for this test.

The Kenilworth Board of Health has announced that it will provide **FLU VACCINE INOCULATIONS** on SEPTEMBER 30, 2009 from 9a.m. to noon at the KENILWORTH SENIOR CITIZENS BUILDING, 526 Boulevard.

The program is specifically for Kenilworth residents 65 years of age and older; residents over 18 years of age with a chronic illness, pregnant women, and health-care personnel who provide direct patient care. Residents should be prepared to present their Medicare Part B card and/or a doctor's note (those 18 to 64 with a chronic illness) on the day of the vaccination. There will be an \$10.00 fee for those residents who do not have Medicare Part B. Vaccinations will be given out on a first come first serve basis.

Residents who are allergic to eggs, egg products, feathers or chickens are advised not to participate in this program.

August was a fairly busy month for our community. The Library held its tricky tray at Schering Plough, hosting over 215 children who were rewarded for having joined the summer reading program. Once again the community chipped in by donating hundreds of gifts for the children's benefit. Library Director Dale Spindel and her staff, especially Robin Koerner and Kathleen Czarnecki deserve many thanks for their hard work, along with the dozens of volunteers who helped make the evening work for the children.

The same night as the Library Tricky Tray, the Borough auctioned the seven lots at the end of 18th and 19th Streets, receiving bids totaling \$1,540,000.00. As a result, we have applied a portion of the proceeds to reduce the municipal tax levy and pay down the pension contribution due for the police and other borough employees. Final tax bills will be sent to reflect the reduction in the Borough taxes in the next month. An additional \$600,000 from the sale is being reserved for use in next year's budget.

At the end of the month the annual Volunteer Fire Department and Rescue Squad Carnival took place. Despite the heat, crowds of people came to enjoy the rides, games and food each evening. Dozens of volunteers from the community manned the various game booths to help with the success of the week-long carnival.

On September 11, 2009, we will hold our annual memorial service to recall the lives of those who were murdered at the World Trade Center in 2001. Our service will be held on the steps of Borough Hall and will commence at 7:00 P.M. Everyone is invited to attend and join together as a community to briefly commemorate the tragedy of September 11, 2001.

KENILWORTH KIDS CAN ENTER FREE DRAWING FOR GIANTS STADIUM TOUR

In celebration of September being "Library Card Sign Up Month" the Kenilworth Public Library invites Kenilworth residents, ages 5-18 to visit the library from September 1-19 to enter a free drawing for two ticket vouchers for a tour of Giants Stadium. To be eligible to enter, children and teens must be cardholders in good standing at the Kenilworth Public Library. Giants Stadium, currently in its final season, is located at the Izod Center in East Rutherford. Home to the Giants football team since 1976 it is scheduled for demolition in 2010 with the opening of the new Meadowlands Stadium. Rich in history and nostalgia, Giants Stadium has been home to numerous other professional, college and high school sporting events in addition to being a prime venue for such show business legends as Bruce Springstein, the Jacksons, Madonna, Paul McCartney, the Beach Boys, the Rolling Stones, and Billy Joel. The largest crowd ever to attend Giants Stadium was for a mass celebrated by Pope John Paul II in October of 1995.

GENERAL HOUSEHOLD CLEAN UP

NORTH SIDE OF TOWN WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 16TH (UNTIL COMPLETED)

SOUTH SIDE OF TOWN WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 23TH (UNTIL COMPLETED)

Clean-up will be held during the months of APRIL and SEPTEMBER.

Collections will be conducted by the City of Rahway on behalf of Kenilworth.

The City of Rahway will be responsible for the collection of general household clean-up (Type 13 bulky waste) including the following materials: furniture, toys, storm windows, car tires (without rims), rugs, storm doors, doors, clothing, windows, wood fencing, lawn furniture and carpeting. Every effort must be made to properly and safely containerize or bundle materials for collection wherever possible.

Items Not Picked up on Clean-up:

The City of Rahway will not be responsible for the collection of household garbage (food waste), recyclables, ashes, dirt, grass, leaves, tree trunks, stumps, branches, pool filters, car tires with rims, railroad ties, rocks, stones, asphalt, concrete, closed top drums, automobile parts, appliances (white goods), paint, chemicals; and materials resulting from demolition, alterations or repairs to building or other structures, and any other materials not prepared as properly defined above.

Please be aware that metal items are picked up by the Kenilworth Department of Public Works during clean-up.

Bulky waste must be placed at curbside after 5:00pm on the night before regularly scheduled pick-up. Once your street has been picked up, no further items can be put out.

No White Goods (Refrigerators, Stoves, etc) will be picked up on these Cleanup Days.

FREEDOM RUN AND WALK SEPT. 27

A Kenilworth Freedom Run and Walk, hosted Historical Society. by the Kenilworth Historical Society, will be held on Sunday, Sept. 27, 2009 (rain or shine). The 5K Freedom Run and 2K Freedom Walk will each start at 10 a.m. from the North 22nd/21st Street municipal parking lot behind the Kenilworth Seniors' Center. The events are being held in conjunction with the national "America Supports You" program, which recognizes residents' support for U.S. military men and women and communicates such support to members of the Armed Forces at home and abroad.

The fee to take part in the noncompetitive 2K Freedom Walk is \$8 in advance (by Sept. 18) and \$10 after Sept. 18. Children, youths and adults of all ages are invited to participate individually or as part of a group/organization. All participants must register in order to receive a commemorative T-shirt.

The registration fees for the 5K Run, a USATF (U.S.A. Track & Field)-sanctioned event, are as follows:

Advance registration (by Sept. 18): \$20; after Sept. 18, \$23;

Registration for USATF members

(by Sept. 18): \$18; after Sept. 18, \$23.

Advance registration for the Freedom Walk and the Freedom Run is encouraged to ensure Tshirt availability.

Optional monetary donations to purchase items needed by U.S. troops may be made at the time of registration, in care of the Kenilworth

Awards for the 5K Freedom Run will be given to the top male and female finisher in the overall race and to the top three male and female finishers in each of the designated 10-year age groups (14 and under to 75 and over). Same-day race scoring and recording will be handled by CompuScore Computer Services.





AMERICAN RED CROSS URGES RESIDENTS TO BUILD A KIT AND BE PREPARED

The Colonial Crossroads Chapter of the American Red Cross Reminds Residents That September is National Preparedness Month. September not only signifies the official back-to-school season, it's also National Preparedness Month. The Colonial Crossroads Chapter of the American Red Cross is joining the U.S. Department of Homeland Security and a coalition for more than 1,500 organizations in reminding everyone to have a home emergency plan. Preparedness Month is a nationwide effort to raise public awareness about the importance of preparing for all types of emergencies – whether at home, in school, at the workplace or in the community.

"There are three simple things each resident can do to be prepared," says Barb Chestnut, Colonial Crossroads Chapter director of response:

• Get a kit • Make a plan • Be informed

Every household should have a preparedness kit with at least three days worth of essential items needed by every household member.

Essential items should include one gallon of water per day for each person, non-perishable food, a flashlight, a battery-operated or crankoperated radio, extra batteries, a manual can opener, cash and important medications. "Preparedness is the key. The biggest mistake residents can make is to think "it can't happen here", then they don't prepare and when something happens they aren't ready," says John Cottage, Emergency Management Coordinator, Springfield, N.J.

Household members should discuss a place to meet in case of an emergency - one right outside the home and one outside the neighborhood. The name and number of an animal shelter should be written down if there is a household pet. Each member of the family should have an emergency contact card with people to call. In addition, the Red Cross is pointing families to its "Safe and Well" web site, accessible at www.redcross.org. The Red Cross calls the "Safe and Well" website a tool that allows people directly affected by disaster to let their loved ones know their status.

"This is a time of year that we urge members of our community to learn a life-saving skill such as CPR and AED," says Colonial Crossroads Chapter Director of Preparedness Rhonda Zampetti. "If someone has stopped breathing, is choking or is bleeding from a deep wound, the first two minutes are the most critical."





IS OUR CARD IN YOUR WALLET? KENILWORTH LIBRARY CELEBRATES LIBRARY CARD SIGN-UP MONTH

In the rush to buy pens, pencils and notebooks for the back to school crowd, busy parents might overlook one of the most important tools they can get for their children - a card at the Kenilworth Public Library. September, in addition to being the traditional "back to school" time, is also National Library Card Sign-Up Month. Although Kenilworth is fortunate to have excellent libraries and librarians in its schools, the public library also plays an important role in the academic success of local students. Studies have shown that children who are read to in the home and use the library do better in school than children who do not have this important advantage. The Kenilworth Public Library offers an opportunity for parents to participate in their children's reading experiences and reinforce the message that reading is important.

Through its webpage, www.kenilworthlibrary.org, the library provides access to its online catalog, providing cardholders with the ability to check the library's holdings and place reserves on items from home. The webpage also provides access to online databases, including a student version of The Encyclopedia Britannica, which can be accessed at home through the Internet at no cost to the user. Additionally, the webpage is the place where parents can stay on top of the library's full schedule of exciting activities and special programs that can be enjoyed by children and their families, including crafts, bingo, toddler time, storytimes, musical performances, a Friday evening Halloween celebration and even, on occasion, visits to the library by live animals and their handlers.

Activities specifically for adults include the library's popular book discussion group and separate writers group as well as occasional movie nights, musical programs and guest speakers.

In addition to its excellent collection of books for everyone from babies to seniors, the library currently owns approximately 1,900 DVDs which can be checked out, at no charge, for a three day period. There are also more than 1,000 CDs covering every musical taste imaginable and an ever growing collection of popular audio

books in CD format. The library is also proud to offer to Kenilworth residents, through MyLibraryDV on the library's webpage, a collection of nearly 900 downloadable videos including Sony movie classics, travelogues, "how-to" videos, "Rocketbook" videos that complement high school and college literature curriculums, as well as fun and educational programs for younger children. Through the website, cardholders also have access, through the ListenNJ icon, to hundreds of current and classic downloadable audiobooks.

But that's not all!!! The library also provides free high speed access to the Internet as well as two computers that serve as dedicated word processors as well as the recently acquired AWE computer which is specially loaded with fun and educational software for children ages 2 through 9.

Best of all, the Kenilworth Public Library is proud of its people, with a staff that is friendly, knowledgeable and second to none. The library staff stands ready to help people find the information they need and the books that they want to read next, regardless of how off the beaten path these requests might be. To see just how helpful and friendly we are, Kenilworth residents who wish to apply for a library card can do so by coming to the library and presenting a current driver's license or other document which provides proof of residency such as a rental agreement or utility bill which includes both the applicant's name and address. For children under age 18, a parent or legal guardian must present any of the above mentioned forms of identification for themselves and co-sign their child's car. Anyone not residing in Kenilworth but who either works or goes to school with the Borough is also eligible for library borrowing privileges as is anyone residing in any community within Union County with the exception of Summit and Winfield Park. The recent completion of the library's elevator makes the library even more welcoming to people with disabilities and babies traveling in strollers.
