






They will present their work consisting of a video presentation and their opinions, followed by a town hall type discussion with the public on Sunday, April 14, 2013 at St. Mary and Elizabeth Academy, located at 170 Hussa Street, Linden, NJ at the gymnasium. Everyone is welcome to attend this public event. There is no admission charge for this presentation. Law Explorer Post 629 will also present their project to the Linden High School on April 25, 2012 for the High School students and their parents.

During their after school hours, the youth Explorers from Law Explorer Post 629 ages 11 - 17, have been working very diligently to create this project with the hopes to voice their concerns and ideas as to how more school safety policies can be put in place so that other vicious massacres will never happen again. Law Post 629 has been meeting twice to three times a week so that this project will go on without a hitch. The Post is also hard at work trying to get children to interview so that we can put this project together successfully. Every Post member has their own job to do including interviewing, writing press releases, editing videos, designing fliers, contacting the community and so on. This project is very important for the Post not only to start a discussion among students on how to help prevent school massacres but it will also help Law Explorer Post 629 reach out to the community.

This project was prompted by the tragic events that took place December 14, 2012 at Sandy Hook Elementary School where 26 students and educators were viciously massacred by a young individual. The Post looks forward to empowering youth and helping them feel relevant by providing them with a forum to discuss issues that matter to them. The Post feels that this project is a very good dedication to the young lives which were taken because it will focus on what the youth believes should be done to prevent these school shootings. What better way to get schools to change their policies on school violence than by other students joining the discussion on what can be done to make them safer so something like the Sandy Hook Elementary School Massacre will never happen again.


LINDEN AUTHOR RETURNS TO LIBRARY WITH DEBUT NOVEL



Hurricane Sandy was, by many accounts, the lives. But in a "Teachable Moment", an English singularly worst storm to hit the Eastern seaboard in recent memory. The immeasurable destruction to lives and property in the New Jersey and New York metropolitan areas will leave scars and unpleasant memories for the residents of these areas for years to come. Even now, many communities along the Jersey Shore and in NY at Breezy Point and the Rockaways are still rebuilding after the massive devastation that Hurricane Sandy brought to their homes, their families. And right here in Linden, in Tremley Point, hundreds of people were without power, food and gasoline for days on end.

For many of the students at Linden High school, this terrifying event remained foremost in their minds, even as they returned to the normalcy of classes at Linden High School, and the schedule dependability of their everyday


teacher at Linden High School had the students record their harrowing accounts of their time at home during the super storm as day-by-day journal entries, in the hopes that their written testimonies could live on in their memories as a time that, at least for several days during October/November of 2012, they were witnesses to great heroism and sacrifice in their own homes and neighborhoods.

While the Juniors and Seniors in all periods taught by the English teacher were given this assignment, and every single student responded and told their tales very articulately and with great compassion and empathy for others caught in the storm, there were seventeen essays that were singled out by the LHS administration as having the ability to relay their "Hurricane Sandy Story" with the most experiential and

insightful qualities that brought the stories into clearer focus to the reader. These students had their efforts honored by the installation of their work on a bulletin board in the third floor hallway of the LHS building.



LINDEN VETERAN ORGANIZATIONS SEARCH FOR THE FAMILY OF MARINE VETERAN EUGENE LAW, KILLED IN VIETNAM IN 1968. Submitted by: Ron Stefanowicz, Linden's Veterans Council



Pfc. Eugene Law

It was discovered and brought to the attention of the Linden Veterans Council that a young Marine from Linden was killed in action in Vietnam, and for some unexplained reason his name was not placed on the Vietnam War Monument in front of Linden City Hall. The Linden Veterans organizations has raised funds to place his name on the monument and we are asking Linden Citizens to assist in finding members of his family to join the Linden Veterans in honoring this fallen hero.

The veteran Marine Infantryman is Pfc. Eugene Law, 3rd Battalion, 9th Marine Regiment. On

January 13th, 1968, he was killed in Quang Tri Province. January 1968 was the start of the Tet offensive as the North Vietnam Army crossed the DMZ and attacked the far northern province of South Vietnam which was defended by US Marines, Army Airborne and South Vietnam newly organized Infantry unit. The Tet offensive, the year of the Monkey in the Asian Calendar brought North Vietnam Regulars army into the War.

Shortly before noon on Jan 13, 1968 a convoy en route from Thon Son Lam to Ca Lu in Quang Tri Province encountered a company unit of North Vietnamese soldiers, who promptly attacked the convoy with mortar fire, rocket propelled grenades, and small arms fire.

In the initial moments of the contact one of the trucks carrying 81mm mortar ammunition exploded, scattering smoldering ammunition along the road and surrounding area. Simultaneously, another truck was disabled by a rocket propelled grenade, blocking the road and halting the rear portion of the convoy. The convoy escort, India 3/9, dismounted and engaged the enemy force. The forward part of the convoy continued to Ca Lu, picked up Lima 3/9, and returned to the site of the meeting engagement. Artillery and air strikes were directed against the NVA, while additional ground forces began moving toward the area. As the Marine firepower built up, the NVA withdrew into the hills on either side of Highway 9 but by the time the fighting stopped eighteen Marines and one sailor were dead, including PFC Eugene Law of Mike Co. His remains were returned to Linden, services were held at the First Baptist Church in Linden and he was buried in Rosedale Cemetery.

It was by sheer coincidence that it was discovered that PFC Eugene Law was never included on the Linden monument. Linden's Mayor Gerbounka attended a Vietnam memorial service at NJ Vietnam Monument in Holmdel, and brought back a list of names of all Linden Veterans killed in action. Comparing the Holmdel list of names against the names listed on the City of Linden monument, it was discovered that PFC Law's name was not listed.

Upon learning of the omission, The Linden Veteran Council (American Legion Post # 102, Catholic War Veterans, Post # 497, Linden Marine League, Martin Danowski Detachment, Polish Legion of American Veterans Post # 91, Vietnam Veterans of America, Chapter # 779, Veterans of Foreign Wars Post # 1397) decided to honor PFC Law by placing his name on the Linden City Hall Vietnam Monument. His name will be enshrined with other Brave Linden Veterans who made the supreme sacrifice for their country.







The 4-H Youth Development Program uses a learn-by-doing approach to enable youth to develop the knowledge, attitudes and skills they need to become competent, caring and contributing citizens of the world. This is accomplished by using the knowledge and resources of caring adults.

The goals of the 4-H Youth Development Program are to: Provide informal, educational programs for youth in grades K-13 (one year out of high school; Encourage responsibility, community awareness and character development in youth; Strengthen skills for adults working with youth through publications and training; Improve community partnerships and collaborations

The Seeing Eye, Inc. is the oldest existing guide dog school in the world. Since 1929, The Seeing Eye has partnered with people who are blind who seek to enhance their independence, dignity, and self-confidence through the use of Seeing Eye dogs. For the first 18 months of their lives, Seeing Eye puppies are raised by local families, primarily 4-H members, an affiliation that began in 1942. After that, the dogs undergo 4 months of training and the ones who pass enter The Seeing Eye program. Then twelve times a year, as many as 24 students at a time visit the Morristown campus to discover the exhilarating experience of traveling with a Seeing Eye dog. Their training can last up to 20 days. The total cost to the blind people receiving a dog, including airfare, the dog, vet bills, etc., is \$150. 




