LINDEN AMERICAN LEGION AUXILIARY 102 Sponsors president of Girls Nation

A Cranford High School Senior has been elected president at the 64th annual Girls Nation Conference. Carrie Bilenker was sponsored by Linden's American Legion Auxiliary Unit 102.

Margret Kube, Union County President of the American Legion Auxiliary, noted that this is only the second time in the program's 64 year history that a New Jersey participant was elected president.

Founded in 1947 the program's goals is to develop leadership and pride in American citizens, educate participants about our system of government, instill in participants a greater understanding of American traditions and to stimulate a desire to maintain our government processes.

The American Legion Auxiliary believes that training youth about the basic ideals and principles of our system of government will help to ensure the survival of our republic. Through this highly effective citizenship training program, Auxiliary members and other expert volunteers teach the youth of our nation to understand, comprehend, and appreciate their roles as United States Citizens.

In order to attend this unique "hands on" Federal Government training session, one must first have attended a Girls State session and been selected by that state to represent them at Girls Nation. The Girls Nation "senators" are divided into two political "parties". The parties do not reflect the two major political parties in today's system, but allow citizens to gain a special knowledge of how the system works.

Carrie was nominated to attend Girl's State by Cranford High School Academic Advisor John Arlotta who stated "Carrie is the best public speaker I have ever seen in my career at Cranford High School." Carrie enjoys debate and discussion about national topics and meeting new people. She studied abroad in Israel last summer. She called the experience "life changing".

Asked if she thought women have more opportunities to advance in politics today Carrie replied "I'm hopeful that we will break the glass ceiling". Carrie likes participating in the political process and enjoys debate and discussions, listening to other points of view and exchanging ideas to create common ground.

Carrie participated in Cranford High School's Model U.N. club where she credits the experience she garnered there with helping to propel her success at Girl's State and Girl's

Nation. Carrie also participates in Youth In Government, a program sponsored by the YMCA, she was elected to serve as governor for the 2010 - 2011 term.

She will now be a dual office holder serving both as Governor of Youth In Government and President of Girls Nation. She is learning her responsibilities as she goes along. The Girls Nation program is designed so that the bulk of activities happen in the spring and summer when school is out.

Her first public appearance will be speaking at the American Legion National Convention in Milwaukee Wisconsin in August.

Carrie's plans for the future include attending college, preferably in the Washington, D.C. area, and majoring in International Studies and/or Public Policy. She plans to stay involved in the American Legion. She would like to help explain what the Girls Nation program is which she summed up as "teaching us a sense of responsibility for the community and general patriotism."

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES HOLDS CAMP 911

Linden Emergency Medical Services held their fifth annual Camp 911 in July. A record 60 campers participated.

Camp 911 is a week-long program offered to Linden students. The camp is a comprehensive program in conjunction with the Linden Fire Department, Linden Police Department and other outside public safety agencies.

The students spent the week experiencing life as an EMT, Firefighter and Police Officer. They participated in CPR and First Aid as well as live demonstrations with the Jaws of Life, tour a smoke filled house and learned fingerprinting techniques. The goal of the program was to help students obtain the necessary knowledge of the public safety agencies in their community as well as learn team building skills and the value of community service and volunteerism.

Through the generosity of local businesses the program was delivered at no charge to the students or their parents. Businesses donated financial contributions as well as provided inkind services such as bus transportation and lunches.

This year the Safety N.E.T. Kids program was

added to the curriculum. This program is designed to build positive safety habits by raising the level of awareness in the three largest threats facing children today, that of child sexual abuse and abduction (child safety), bullying and childhood obesity. The program incorporates educational videos along with hands on instruction.

Campers took a day trip to Linden Airport for a hands-on tour of Northstar, one of the helicopters maintained by the New Jersey air medical program. Campers got to climb aboard and ask questions to the hospital-based advanced life support paramedics who act as medical crew and New Jersey State Police Officers who are the pilots.

The Sikorsky S76-B helicopters are capable of flying at speeds up to 175 miles per hour. They are generally called to an emergency scene that is more than 30 minutes by ground from a trauma center.

As if on cue, the campers were posing for a picture with the Crew of Northstar when they were called into service. The children ran to a nearby hanger to clear the way for takeoff.




