

## **NUSTAR DONATES \$113,000** FOR VICTIMS OF SUPER STORM SANDY


To help those hardest hit by super storm Sandy, the United Way of Greater Union County (UWGUC) created the Community Recovery Fund to be used for near- and long-term recovery needs of Union County, North and South Plainfield residents.

## FEMA OPENS A DISASTER RECOVERY CENTER IN LINDEN

FEMA has opened a Disaster Recovery Center located at the Recreation Center, 330 Helen St. in Linden. The center is open seven days a week from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. until further notice.

"The first step for Hurricane Sandy disaster survivors is to call 1-800-FEMA (2262) to register for federal disaster assistance. Also they will receive an application from U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) and it is imperative that the affected individuals return that application, because if they don't, the process stops right there. Even if a person doesn't want a low-interest disaster loan, that is part of the process", says Maria Padron, spokeswoman for FEMA.

Once the survivor applies, then an inspector makes an appointment to verify the losses and after that, the applicant receives a letter in the mail and an application for an SBA loan, and may also receive the funding in their bank account.

The loans can go to homeowners, renters, business, and non-profit agencies to pay for disaster-caused damages not covered by insurance.

It is important that survivors return that application for their own benefit. They would have readily-available funds for hidden damages that may be discovered after the initial inspection. Also applicants automatically referred to other disaster assistance programs for which they may be eligible if they are turned down for a loan, the initial estimate of the cost of repair may prove inadequate for the work that is actually required,

and the loan funds could cover the difference. impacted by the hurricane. That includes people Sometimes an insurance policy or settlement may not cover all repairs, replacement or rebuilding costs and the loan funds could be used to fill that gap.

The SBA loans are low-interest, and longterm. In some cases, SBA can refinance all or part of an existing mortgage. SBA loan officers work to come up with a plan that fits a survivor's

Loans of up to \$200,000 are available to eligible homeowners to repair or replace disaster-damaged or destroyed real estate. Homeowners and renters may apply for loans of up to \$40,000 to cover for personal property, including clothing, furniture, cars or appliances. Loan amounts cannot exceed uninsured losses.

Businesses and private nonprofit organizations may borrow up to \$2 million to repair or replace real estate, machinery and equipment, inventory and other business assets that are not fully covered by insurance.

When a survivor qualifies for a grant from FEMA's Individuals and Households Program, the transaction is usually by direct deposit to the survivor's bank account. FEMA also can pay for temporary housing up to 18 months.

#### The last day to apply for FEMA aid is December 31, 2012.

"If a person receives a 'denial letter' the applicant should visit a Disaster Recovery Center to clarify, sometimes some information is missing or we might have a question regarding the insurance settlement".

Disaster Unemployment Assistance (DUA) benefits are available for those whose jobs were not normally eligible for unemployment benefits, such as self-employed persons and farm workers. Registration closes Feb. 4, 2013; applicants should contact a New Jersey Reemployment Call Center. Locations include Union City (201-601-4100), Freehold (732-761-2020), and Cumberland (856-507-2340).

DUA applicants who need copies of Federal Income Tax Returns can obtain them at IRS Tax Returns: 1-866-562-5227, Press "1" for Hurricane Sandy.

The Department of Health and Human Services has activated behavioral health professionals from the U.S. Public Health Service Commissioned Corps to provide mental health support in shelters and for first responders. The toll-free National Disaster Distress Helpline is 1-800-985-5990 or by texting 'TalkWithUs' to 66746. Multilingual support is available.

Disaster Legal Services provided by members of the Young Lawyers Division of the New Jersey Bar Association, are available to survivors at 1-888-541-1900, if they need assistance replacing lost legal documents, assistance with all insurance-related claims, counseling on mortgage-foreclosure problems, counseling on landlord/tenant problems, creditor/debtor matters and FEMA appeals.

Individuals can register for assistance and follow up on previous applications by registering online or by web-enabled mobile device at m.FEMA.gov. By phone or 711/VRS, you can call 1-800-621-FEMA (3362) or TTY 1-800-462-7585.

- 3. Any losses either uninsured or under-insured.

Interest rates can be as low as 1.688% for homeowners and renters, 4% for businesses and 3% private non-profit organizations. Terms may be up to 30 years, SBA determines loan amounts

and terms based on each applicant's financial condition.

The EIDL assistance is to help meet working capital needs caused by the disaster.

Small businesses, small agriculture cooperatives and small businesses engaged in aquaculture, as well as, most private, non-profit organizations of any size may borrow to help meet working capital needs caused by the disaster (regardless of whether the business suffered any physical property damage)

The maximum business disaster loan is \$2 million, for any combination of physical property losses and working capital needs.

- 1. Apply in person at any Disaster Recovery Center or Business Recovery Center (see below for locations)
- 2. Apply online using SBA's secure Web site at https://disasterloan.sba.gov/ela
- 3. Apply by mailing your application to SBA at 14925 Kingsport Rd., Ft. Worth, TX 76155-2243

SBA disaster representatives are at the Disaster Recovery Centers and the Business Recovery Centers meet individually with Louisiana residents and business owners, explain how an SBA low-interest disaster loan can help pay for their disaster losses, answer questions, and help each individual complete their application.





## MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR: AFTERMATH OF SUPER STORM SANDY

Irene and the Halloween Snowstorm, I felt we couldn't experience any worse weather. Boy was I wrong! Super storm Sandy hit Linden twice as hard as both of these storms put together.

All Monday night into Tuesday morning I rode our streets with the Police Department, Fire Department and Emergency Management. Around 9:00 p.m. the weather started getting real ugly. Soon thereafter trees were being toppled throughout Linden falling on houses and knocking down power lines. Transformers started blowing up making it appear at first that this was lighting, and numerous telephone poles crashed to the ground. Needless to say at a certain point there were no street lights and only one traffic light in the entire city was functional. Ninety percent of Linden residents lost their electricity and debris such as aluminum sheds and awnings were blowing about our streets. Then Mother Nature hit us with the 2nd punch. A fifteen-foot storm surge generating from the Arthur Kill hit the Tremley Point area of our city.

Within 25 minutes four members of our Public Works crew went from working on a dry Public Works Building and floor to 4 foot of water. After saving the majority of our vehicles they exited the area driving out in a front end loader with three men riding in the bucket. Considerable damage has been done to our Public Works building including the loss of a one-year-old boiler, two dump trucks and three pickup trucks. All the electrical wiring in the offices have to be replaced and that is why many members of the public thought someone was

After last year's weather involving Hurricane hanging up on them when they called for waters receded. She is okay. assistance after the storm. The old Public works number 908-474-8666 has been reinstalled at their new location and you can now call the Public Works Dispatch directly again.

> Unfortunately, the storm surge also affected about 25 homes in Tremley Point with water flooding their first floors and some homes lost foundations. Many homes are currently uninhabitable and homeowners have thrown out all their belongings besides ripping off the sheet rock to the studs. Several homes also sustain damage from 500 lb wooden 12' x 12' x 10' railroad ties that were literally tossed around like toothpicks into people's backyards and foundations. Spectra Energy, the corporation responsible for putting in a new 48" gas pipeline, is assuming responsibility for any damage caused by their equipment.

> I personally witnessed two of these railroad ties sitting in a homeowner's backyard right next to but not touching their foundation. This property was surrounded by a four foot fence and there was absolutely no damage to any section of it.

> On Emma Place, homes along this two block area all had flooded basements and 1st floors. One home lost the side of its foundation by the force of the storm surge. During the night of the storm a woman suffered a heart attack but emergency personnel could not reach her. There was 4 feet of water in the roadway besides being blocked by a 2 foot wide downed tree which also knocked down a live power wire. Fortunately, she was able to sustain herself until the flood

As if all of these problems weren't enough, an odor of oil permeated the area the next day. Phillips 66 discovered a spill of "slop oil" from a regulated DEP permitted holding area which was on their property. The storm surge created a surface oil spill in the Rose Hill Cemetery property and covered tombstones. Some oil seeped into the yards of homeowners and cellars that bordered the rear cemetery lots. Phillips 66 quickly acknowledged responsibility and they have cleaned up the spill.

What added "insult to injury" to these poor homeowners is that they just returned to normalcy after sustaining severe flood damage from Hurricane Irene 14 months ago.

All of the Corporations in our heavy industrial section of Tremley Point were hit extremely hard by the storm surge. Phillips 66, CITGO, NuStar, Bulk Transport and the PSE&G generating station all sustained considerable damage. At this writing most are up and running on a limited basis.

During the night of the surge it was impossible to proceed over the Turnpike Bridge and five employees from the PSE&G generating station were trapped on high ground unable to be rescued until the waters receded. The next day I surveyed the damage with our Emergency Management personnel. On South Wood Avenue between the entrance to NuStar and the Arthur Kill everything imaginable was blocking the roadway. Whether it was industrial debris or anything that floated in the Arthur Kill, it was there! Included in the debris were twenty-one 30

foot boats belonging to Clear Venture. They removed them from the Kill onto dry dock only to have the storm surge wash them away.

One railcar parked on the Chemical Coast rail line was actually visible from our Turnpike Bridge laying in the slow lane of the North Bound lanes of the N.J. Turnpike. This roadway was closed due to flooding that night between exits 12 & 13. A 10 acre ground mounted solar panel farm survived the surge but as the panels started producing electricity from the suns ray's, fires started breaking out in various electrical box connections due to the salt water.

So one can see Linden not only suffered heavy tree damage and severe power outages throughout our city, but many homes were damaged due to the 15-foot storm surge.

In the aftermath of Super storm Sandy Crisis Relief Centers were originally opened up in our J.T.G. Center and P.A.L. Building but we soon realized the need was more urgent in the 7th and 8th Wards. The Sinai Christian Academy (old school # 3 on Grier Ave), volunteered their buildings and Councilwoman Yamakaitis worked closely with them to serve the 8th ward residents. Councilman Sheehy opened up the 7th ward Recreation Center for Tremley Point residents and Councilwoman Cosby-Hurling did the same at the John St. Multi-Purpose Center. All of these Crisis Centers and Councilpersons were assisted by neighborhood volunteers.

During this crisis Governor Christie held daily conference calls with the Mayors. He and his department heads from the DEP to the State Police kept us informed of the State's efforts and what was available from Trenton. The Union County Freeholders, County Department Heads and PSE&G had conference calls periodically to update Mayors on their emergency efforts also. Many of our major traffic intersections had County and Linden generators powering the traffic control lights. Senator Scutari, Freeholder Hudak and Assemblywoman Stender kept in contact with my office during the entire crisis offering their help in any way they could.

Even though everyone was prepared for this Super storm our entire State was hit extremely hard and no one imagined the enormous devastation that Sandy would bring to us. This Super storm definitely tested our emergency response services and through this experience we learned some valuable lessons, which will be addressed once everyone is debriefed and their suggestions analyzed. Some of the most apparent problems that quickly surfaced are that we need a better way to communicate with our residents without relying on electricity. Without electricity Linden TV and computers were all down. Cell phone numbers and AM battery radios are an alternative among other options. We also learned Linden needs more emergency generators located in strategic buildings besides the Police and Fire Department and residents on the South Side of RT 1 & 9 need flood relief on both a short and long-term basis.

As your Mayor, I can honestly say I have never been more proud of all our employees and the residents that pitched in to work for the common good. Our Police, Fire and Public Works crews removed hazards and protected property at times putting themselves in harm's way. Central Dispatch and the Police

Department fielded volumes of calls, sometimes from very irate and demanding residents who did not realize the gravity of the situation. City Hall workers serviced our residents the best they could even though they did so without power. Department Heads rolled up their sleeves contributing not only leadership but hands on participation.

To the families that suffered severe damage to their homes there is nothing I can say that will ease the hurt and pain other than we will help you as much as humanly possible to rebound from this tragedy.

Most Linden residents were inconvenienced by Super Storm Sandy but we should count our blessings. No one was killed or injured due to the storm. All one has to do is look across the Arthur Kill to the severe damage done by the surge on Staten Island or farther south to the Jersey Shore.

To assist Linden victims of Sandy we have set up a relief fund through a non-profit 501 c 3 organization that operates Linden's food pantry. You can make a check out to Linden Interfaith Network of Churches (LINCS). Somewhere on the check list Hurricane Sandy. Please mail it to the Mayor's Office at 301 North Wood Avenue.

Linden is slowly returning to normal. We are a resilient blue collar community that will pick ourselves up and dust each other off. Everyone should know that this experience showed the best of our city.

I am proud to be the Mayor of Linden and represent employees and residents that care and love their community and this great city. It is an honor to serve you.
