

BOATING SAFETY CERTIFICATION COURSE

It is now the law that all boat operators must have a New Jersey State approved Boating Safety Certificate. A one day Boat Safety Certification Course, approved by the U.S. Coast Guard, will be offered on Saturday, June 1, 2013 beginning at 8:00am at the JTG Recreation Center, located at 330 Helen Street, Linden. The course takes approximately eight hours to complete. This includes break and exam time; please bring your lunch. Registration fee is \$75.00. You must register for the course by May 1, 2013 at any one of Linden's Recreation Centers or on-line at www.linden-nj.org by clicking onto community pass and following the instructions.





VACANT HOME BURGLARIES


