LINDEN 150TH ANNIVERSARY KICKS OFF WITH 5K RACE

The City of Linden kicked off the celebration celebrate Linden's 150th Anniversary. of the City's 150th anniversary with a 5K Race & Fun Walk, held at Tiger Stadium on Sunday, May 8th (Mothers Day). About 130 runners and 25 fun walkers participated. All proceeds from the race benefited the Linden Cultural & Heritage Committee and will help fund events to

"We have lots of plans in the works for the anniversary including planting Linden trees, a poster contest for grammar school students and displays at the beautiful new Linen Library," said Lauren Yeats, President of the Linden Society for Historic Preservation. The organization is an offshoot of the Linden Cultural and Heritage Committee. Visit them on Facebook (Linden Society for Historic Preservation) to learn more about the City's history and share your stories about your Linden experiences and memories.

The first place men's overall winner Brian Kopnicki's (age: 25) winning time was 16 minutes and ten seconds. Second place was Rufino Mendez (29) and Rodrigo Caceres (50) three seconds behind him.

The first place women's overall winner was Aya Takeichi (34), who ran the 5K (3.2 miles) in 20 minutes, 42 seconds. Second place winner Brigid Alvarado (15) trailed Aya by 30 seconds, and third place winner Gizette Perez (9) just five seconds after that.

Gold, silver and bronze medals were awarded to male and female runners in fifteen age groups. Among the Linden notables who ran, Mayor Richard J. Gerbounka finished in 32 minutes, 17 seconds, Councilman Robert Sadowski came in at 45 minutes even, and Dennis Purves, Director of the Linden Public Library finished at 34:48. A special medal was awarded in the canine division to Mr. Beauregard, a Great Dane who ran with his owner, Jessica Girttleman, from Carlstadt. 

The program will take place on June 20th, 2011, at 7:00 P.M. It's open to everyone, but Linden residents will get priority.



TICKET TO READING REWARDS PROGRAM MOTIVATES LINDEN STUDENTS

Duke University basketball coach Mike Krzyzewski and U.S. Secretary of Education Arne Duncan lead a contingent of dignitaries for the National Association of Basketball Coaches Foundation TTRR (Ticket to Reading Rewards) program recently held an assembly at the Myles J. McManus Middle School

The Linden schools, aided by a grant from The Merck Company Foundation, have been participating this year in TTRR, a highly successful supplemental middle school literacy program that targets high-risk student populations. TTRR uses external motivations, including role models and incentives, to motivate students to read significantly more

books outside the curriculum. TTRR strives to create an atmosphere where reading and academic achievement is celebrated by all students. The program is provided at no charge to schools or students; with funding provided through grants, gifts and the support of the National Association of Basketball Coaches Foundation (NABCF).

Krzyzewski will be joined by other college coaches, including Mike Rice of Rutgers, who has worked with the Linden schools in the program. Several representatives from the NCAA, led by President Mark Emmert, are also expected to attend with NABCF Executive Director Jim Haney; several members of the

NABCF board of directors; representatives from Merck; Sports Illustrated KIDS editor Bob Der; and senior executives of Nike, Inc.

The NABCF coordinates visits to middle schools by college basketball coaches, who speak on the importance of reading and academic achievement to motivate students to internalize the educational values of our college coaches and student-athletes. Participating students receive tickets to attend collegiate basketball games and invitations to watch team practices, in addition to reading-oriented incentives, for reading books outside the classroom. The rewards, along with the motivation of these role models and peers, help these middle school students identify with the goals and achievements of TTRR.




