NJ. Cpl. Reinhard, 25 years old and a resident of the Colonia section of Woodbridge, died on January 19 in a helicopter crash in Afghanistan. Veterans, citizens and government officials learned that The Westboro Baptist Church protesters planed to be outside

St. Agnes Church that Monday, holding up signs at the funeral of Cpl. Reinhard, (the signs declared his death in Afghanistan as a sign of God's judgment on America), the public became indignant that anyone could show such disrespect to this young Marine who made the supreme sacrifice for his country but especially to the entire Reinhard family who influenced a young man to love his family, country and friends.



BILL MANHARDT: AN AMERICAN PATRIOT

Bill Manhardt is an elected member of the Union County Democratic Committee, a notary public, a life member of the John Dawson Gilmary Shea Assembly of the Knights of Columbus -- but most of all, Bill is a true American patriot. Bill calls himself a "Promoter of Patriotism." His mobility is limited, but he still takes the time to design, print, and hand out flyers supporting active U.S. troops and veterans of past wars.

"I cannot walk or stand, but I get around in my power wheelchair," Bill says. Bill regularly crosses a highway on his wheelchair to get to the Linden Shopping Center, where he hands out his patriotic flyers. His wheelchair is not only a means of transportation, but a mobile office.

Bill is a twelve-year resident of the Delaire

Nursing & Rehabilitation Center in Linden, and he is a fixture in the community. A former president of the resident council at Delaire, Bill has made it his duty to ensure the American flag is Delaire continually flying.

Bill is an Elizabeth native, and a long-time member of the Knights of Columbus. Despite his limited mobility, he is committed to the community service principles of the Knights of Columbus, and he is currently the 'Patriotism Chairman' of the John Dawson Gilmary Shea Assembly. Bill is a man with a deep love for his country, who does whatever he can to raise support for all branches of the U.S. military in his community.

"What our country needs now," he writes in one of his flyers, "is more patriotism!"

MOTORISTS MUST STOP FOR A PEDESTRIAN

In an effort to make Linden's streets safer for pedestrians the Linden Police Department will begin an aggressive enforcement education campaign. Beginning immediately the Linden Police Department will be randomly but aggressively enforcing traffic laws related to pedestrian safety. This program will consist of several officers, some possibly in plain clothes acting as decoys. They will cross the streets in areas where there have been a rash of autopedestrian crashes.

Since October 2011 there have been six (6) crashes involving pedestrians that were struck by vehicles in the area surrounding the Linden

train station. Two resulted in fatalities. "The Linden Police Department has seen too many auto-ped crashes recently; we plan on engaging in a campaign to end this trend immediately! The public will most definitely see a large police presence in the area of Wood Avenue specifically around the Linden train station." stated Sgt. Michael Babulski, Traffic Bureau Commander.

Beginning on April 1, 2010 the law in NJ changed for motorists who come upon a pedestrian.

Motorists must STOP for a pedestrian in a marked cross walk. The prior version required

only the vehicle to yield. The penalties for violating this statute will be 2 points and a \$200 fine. Insurance surcharges and/or community service can also be levied upon violators. (39:4-36).

Pedestrians are also warned to follow the law. All pedestrians must use crosswalks and obey pedestrian signals at signalized intersections or face a \$54 fine. (39:4-32 & 33).

In addition to issuing summonses the Linden Police Department will also be handing out fliers in an effort to educate the pedestrians and motorists of these laws and how they are designed to make the streets safer.

CITY PROGRAM MAKES HOME IMPROVEMENT GRANTS AVAILABLE

The City of Linden has been awarded funds for renovations and repairs of single and two family owner occupied homes for low and moderate income families. Under this program homeowners may be eligible to receive up to \$24, 999 in zero interest loans and senior citizens 60 and older may be eligible to receive \$5,000 in senior grants.

These funds can be used to make home improvements such as repair or replacement of substandard heating, plumbing and electrical, roof, structural repairs, correction of code violations, siding, windows and other energy saving repairs.

Eligibility will be based on income limits published by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Potential applicants will be screened by staff which will also explain the program guidelines and benefits; complete the program application and schedule an inspection of the property. Contractor estimates will be reviewed and work write ups that include the scope of work that will be completed. Inprogress inspections will be done to assure that the work is being properly completed as well as a final inspection of the work.

CONFUCIUS CLASSROOM IS DEDICATED

Linden High School officially opened its Confucius Classroom with a plaque unveiling ceremony in the school auditorium on Wednesday, February 8, 2012.

Faculty and staff from the supervising Confucius Institute at Rutgers University were in attendance, along with other local dignitaries.

The Confucius Institute at Rutgers University promotes quality Chinese language and culture education, and serves as a resource center for Chinese studies in New Jersey.

The Confucius Institute at Rutgers was formed in partnership with Jilin University in China, with the support from the Office of Chinese Language Council International (Hanban). Linden High School and Xiamen Foreign Language School in Xiamen China are partner high schools and joint Confucius Classrooms under the Confucius Institute at Rutgers University. Together they have carried on a host of activities including joint student exchanges, teacher training in China and the United States, as well as hosting joint exchanges of educators. The Linden Public Schools is also a model district for the use of the Great Wall Chinese Program in the United States, an educational program endorsed by Hanban.

The Linden Public School District is in its fifth year of teaching Chinese, providing instruction at all levels from grades 1 to 12, including the high school International Baccalaureate Program. Twenty-five percent of the students in grades 1 through 12 are currently studying Chinese, which represents nearly 975 students. There are four Chinese teachers in the district.



The unveiling ceremony featured the Linden High School Chinese dragon teams and the Chinese lions from the school's Navy Junior ROTC unit. The Chinese drum team from the school's band was also present. Linden High School recently held its celebration Ceremony for Chinese New Year during the visit of twentysix visiting Chinese high School students from the Xiamen Foreign Language School and Fuzhou High School No. 3 of Fujian Province, China.

Activities of the Confucius Classroom are fully funded through grants from Hanban. Future activities will include support for the teaching of Chinese in the schools, assisting with cultural celebrations and student-to-student Chinese-American exchanges. There is also an initiative planned to conduct free Chinese classes in the evening for adults.

UNITED WAY HONORS EDUCATOR ESTHER PADEN

High School student, and Douglass College, Rutgers University graduate, returned to her alma mater 26 years ago to teach English and Reading . In 1990, she created Union County's first, "Youth for United Way" organization by joining forces with the United Way of Greater Eastern Union County.

Her goal was to increase community service opportunities by establishing a communitybased partnership to educate students on the role non-profits play in meeting the needs of the community. Through working with the United Way, student volunteers established a special relationship with the Cerebral Palsy League of Union County (presently Jardine Academy).

Esther Paden sought out grant funds to provide a horticulture therapy program for the Cerebral Palsy League. A grant was written in collaboration with Roselle Park High School, and both schools created a beautiful garden area for the children attending the Union Campus of the Cerebral Palsy League.

Esther Paden established the Learn and Serve America program (national school-based program through the Corporation for National Service) at Linden High School in 1993 and since that time, the program, along with the school's "Youth for United Way" volunteers, has provided more than one thousand students the opportunity to serve both regular and special needs children throughout the Linden school district and the Union County area.

Student volunteers have provided yearly donations for three Union County homeless shelters, including "Project Protect", and have served as classroom volunteers at; the Cerebral

Linden teacher Esther Paden, a former Linden Palsy League (Jardine Academy), The ARC of Union County's Kohler School, Children's Specialized Hospital's educational childhood program (presently First Children of Fanwood), and in the past, Regional Day Training School in Scotch Plains.

> Additional teacher-led projects included; renovation of playground equipment, the building and donation of garden planters, creating art murals for special needs schools, and since 1993, Learn and Serve volunteers have been serving as prom escorts for special needs teens at their annual Cerebral Palsy League Prom. In addition, over the course of 18 years, her programs have raised over \$15,000 for the March of Dimes. Mrs. Paden's efforts brought national recognition to Linden High School in 2000 when Linden High School was conferred as a National Service Learning Leader School by the White House and Congress. In addition, Linden High School's Learn and Serve program received the Department of Education's Best Practice's award, and The New Jersey Governor's Volunteer Recognition Award in Citizenship and Education.

> The program is presently in its nineteenth year at Linden High School. Many former Learn and Serve students are college graduates who have chosen to work in the field of education, health, or social services. The Union County Human Relations Commission will recognize Mrs. Paden in May by presenting her with the 2012 Unity Award for Achievement by an Educator. Esther Paden is a former Union County Teacher of the Year and a recipient of the New Jersey Governor's Teacher Recognition Award.

Before her teaching career began, Barbara was a professional dancer, who was on replacement for the Broadway shows Cats and Jerome Robbins' Broadway; and performed with the New Jersey Ballet Company, the Joffrey Ballet (NYC), and the NJ State Opera. She also performed and choreographed for the Cumberland County Playhouse in Tennessee. In NJ, Barbara has produced directed and/or choreographed over 65 shows since 1992 and is a Co-founder and President of Mystic Vision Players, a Union County based non-profit community Theater Company. A BRAVE YOUNG PATRIOT & WARRIOR

I felt it an Honor to participate with my Linden Veteran Council brothers in Cpl. Reinhard's Funeral mass. We all joined to form the "Wall of Honor" on Inman Ave., to show our respect to Cpl. Reinhard and his family. The wall had over 2,500 people including veterans from all branches of the service, elected officials, policemen, firemen and families. Adults and children stood in the chilly weather holding American flags and posters.

I personally felt a strong affinity toward Cpl. Reinhard and his family. As the parent of a son who was a young Marine officer of 24 years serving with the 2nd Battalion of the 8th Marine Expeditionary Force, participating in Iraq Desert Storm, Desert Sword and later in Afghanistan, I could feel the anxiety and concern for their son in harm's way. Yet, I was able to understand and respect the soldier's patriotic desire to serve his country. As Cpl. Reinhard, my son Rob was a Marine helicopter pilot. He also served with the 3rd Marines Expeditionary Force in Hawaii.

The Funeral Mass for Cpl. Reinhard was a moving and emotional experience attended by hundreds of people who stood outside the church and lined up Madison Hill Road with a sea of American Flags. There were veterans, fireman. policeman, adults and children that stood directly in front of the entrance of St. Agnes Church along with a large contingent of my American Legion comrades, members of the Marine Corp, friends of Cpl. Reinhard and many other people standing quietly in anticipation of the arrival of the funeral procession.

When Cpl. Reinhard's funeral procession arrived at the Church it was led, at the invitation of his family, by the Patriot Guard Forum, a motorcycle club that attends funerals of soldiers, firefighters, and police. After the Patriot Guard was a large bagpiper band followed by Cpl. Reinhard and his family.

The Honor Guard of veterans, police, fireman, elected officials and residents, standing on Madison Hill Road and in front of the Church, were called to attention and saluted Cpl. Reinhard and his family members as they arrived at the Church.

As the procession entered St. Agnes Church behind the Reinhard family, there were people packed in the foyer, veterans and active military personnel standing at attention and saluting the procession. The main chapel of the church was full to near capacity. The Funeral Mass was a very solemn and emotional service.

Family members did the readings, Rev. Dennis Cohan, church pastor, presented the homily and talked about Kevin's character and how he touched many people "He (Kevin Reinhard) embraced the Marines and their spirit of enthusiasm and pride, and their spirit embraced him." Reflections were given by Cpl. Reinhard, Kevin's uncle Michael Gerrity and his sister Kathleen Reinhard.

Kevin's Uncle Michael Gerrity, reflected on how Kevin had been tinkering with engines with his father for years, "Kevin could connect anything with wires and then add sound. Kevin and his fellow Marines represent all the good the United States stands for." Gerrity also spoke proudly about Kevin's ability to get along with a new group of kids and his visits to his diabetic grandmother, Gerrity's mother, to give her insulin shots almost every night. As a son, grandson, brother, nephew and a family member, Kevin touched everyone with his respectful and loving way.

The most emotional tribute came from Kathleen, who called her brother, "a white knight from childhood to manhood and into death". Kathleen shared her relationship with her brother, "My brother and I were very close. We loved each other because of that," she said. "He loved his family dearly. He could not wait to come home to us," she said, adding that her brother had been on Facebook talking about returning home. "He wanted to come home and spend time with his family."

Kathleen spoke of her brother's love for

everyone and everything, including the family gold fish that as a boy he would take out of the water to kiss goodnight at bedtime, not realizing he was killing the fish with his kindness. She said her parents had to replace the fish on a regular basis.

As a child, when he went to the bank and they would give him a lollipop, he'd always ask for one for his sister. "My brother never once thought only of himself, even as a little boy," she said. "He'd get the lollipop and bring it home to me." "He was not the kind of person to gloat about what he did for others," she said. "He did it without expecting to be paid back," his sister said, adding her brother probably would have refused any repayment. "Kevin was selfless in his generosity," she said. She said he appreciated the sacrifices the family made on his behalf. He knew his father worked overtime so he could attend St. Joseph High School in Metuchen, where he enjoyed some of the best days of his life and graduated in 2005.

And while their parents might wonder if they have been good parents, Kathleen, who occasionally choked up as she spoke, said their answer came in the support everyone has shown them. "If you and dad had not done as good a job with Kevin, he could not be as loved as he is," she said.

Kathleen Reinhard said her brother's memory is not being buried, because he will live on in each and everyone at the service. "Kevin has gone to God from me," she said. "He's asked for a lollipop for his sister and is waiting for my time to join him so he can give it to me."

Kathleen Reinhard and her brother, Kevin, had such a close bond that they promised each other that if something were to happen to the other, they would never leave the other's side. Kathleen Reinhard upheld her part of that promise to her only sibling by serving as a pallbearer at the funeral for her brother, a Marine corporal who died when his helicopter crashed in Afghanistan on Jan. 19. He was one of six Marines killed in the crash, which came just weeks before his deployment was to end.

Following the reflections of Kevin's sister and uncle, the bagpipers entered the church with a slow drum roll for the fallen hero. A solo piper started "Amazing Grace", then the remainder of the group joined in raising the sound to stereo levels, the beat of the drums sounding like thunder. When the song finished the pipers exited in a military march.

At the conclusion of the mass, the choir soloist sang the "Marine Corp Hymn", the entire church stood, many covering their hearts as the hymn was sung. The veterans left the chapel to form the Honor Guard, joining the hundreds of people who stood outside the church during the funeral service, waiting for the Cpl. Reinhard procession to leave for St. Gertrude's Cemetery.

We left St. Agnes Church to join other Linden Veterans Council members (American Legion Post # 102, Catholic War Veterans, Post 497, Linden Marine League, Martin Danowski Detachment, Polish Legion of American Veterans, Post # 91, Linden Vietnam Veterans, Chapter 669 and Veterans of Foreign Wars, Post 1397), all participating in the "Wall of Honor" on Inman Ave. As we turned on to Inman Ave., it was an awesome sight of people who turned out in the chilly weather to Honor Cpl. Reinhard and his family. As the procession drove passed, veterans, police, firemen and military personnel saluted while adults stood solemnly by with children waving American Flags.

The reverential blasts of a rifle fire and the





sound of taps echoed through Saint Gertrude's Cemetery in Colonia as mourners paid their final respects to a fallen hero.

In retrospect, at each of our meetings, the members of the Linden Veterans Council take the oath to continue to serve our country, fellow veterans and their families and our communities. It was a personal honor being part of the several thousand people participating in laying a young patriot to rest. As veterans, we personally know of those from our military service and military branches who made the ultimate sacrifice. These things we very rarely discuss in public.

We understand the importance of honoring these patriots during our Memorial Day services when we place over 4,500 flags on veterans' graves in Linden cemeteries, and visit Linden's 14 Veteran Monuments to place wreaths and to conduct prayer services on Memorial Day and Veterans Day. Cpl. Kevin Reinhard's name will be inscribed in the list of fallen patriots; he will be remembered by all veterans along with all those brave American patriots who preceded him.

MARINE CPL. KEVIN REINHARD

Kevin Reinhard attended Saint John Vianney Elementary School, Colonia Middle School, and Saint Joseph's High School in Metuchen. After attending Ramapo College, he transferred to Middlesex County College in Edison where he majored in criminal science. In the spring of 2008 he enlisted in the United States Marine Corps and attained the rank of corporal. He was a crew chief, flying on a Sikorsky Sea Stallion with HMH 363 – the Lucky Red Lions, stationed out of Hawaii. Kevin only had a few short weeks left to his deployment when his helicopter crashed in

Afghanistan. It was his second deployment.





UNSIGHTLY ROOF STAINS CAN BE REMOVED SAFELY AND INEXPENSIVELY

All over New Jersey, the appearance of black streaks on roofs is becoming more and more evident. Dark streaking and staining make a perfectly good roof appear to be in need of replacement as well as unattractive.
