

At the completion of World War II, Doris met Albert Henel, a casual acquaintance in high school and a fellow life long resident of Linden, who was returning home from the War. He was a Staff Sergeant in the United States Air Force. They soon fell in love and were married on May 8, 1948. Doris and Al became the proud parents of Thomas, John, Bill and Jeanne and grandparents of Matthew, Tessa, Zachary, Andrew and twins: Celina and Alexander. Sadly, Albert passed away in 1999.

After marriage, Doris transformed from a stay at home mom to an accomplished volunteer and hasn't stopped since. From her work with the various PTA's in the schools her children attended to her 40 plus years of volunteering



with Girl Scouting in Linden and the Washington Rock Girl Scout Council of which she was President for three years and the recipient of the Emerald Award, the highest award given by the Council for Volunteer Community Service. 

ALLERGIC REACTIONS AND EMERGENCIES Submitted by Andrew T. Caruso, EMT - Linden EMS

The body's immune system contains white reaction; also known as "anaphylaxis." If the blood cells which produce antibodies. When the body is exposed to an antigen, a complex set of reactions begins. The white blood cells produce an antibody specific to that antigen. This is called "sensitization. "The job of the antibodies is to detect and destroy substances that cause disease and sickness. The antibodies promote production and release of chemicals and hormones called "mediators." One well-known mediator is Histamine. Mediators have effects on tissue and organs in addition to activating more white blood cell defenders. It is these effects that cause the symptoms of an allergic

Your allergic reactions are unique to you. For example, your body may have learned to be allergic to poison ivy from repeated exposure. Most people are aware of their particular allergy triggers and reactions.

Certain foods, vaccines and medications, latex rubber, shellfish, dust, pollen, insect bites/stings, mold, animal dander, and poison ivy are common allergens.

Bee stings, fire ant stings, penicillin, seafood and peanuts are known for causing dramatic reactions that can be serious and involve the whole body. In some cases, these severe reactions cause symptoms that require immediate medical care.

Unfortunately, the specific allergen often cannot be identified unless you have had a similar reaction in the past. There is no prevention for allergies other than not being exposed to begin with.

Allergies and the tendency to have allergic reactions run in some families. You may have allergies even if they do not run in your family. Many people who have one trigger tend to have other triggers as well.

People with certain medical conditions such as: sensitive skin, severe allergic reactions in the past, frequent infections, asthma and other respiratory problems are more likely to have allergic reactions than those without these problems.

Typical symptoms of allergic reactions are: sneezing, difficulty breathing, wheezing, cramps, itching, hives, vomiting, edema (swelling), and anxiety. Check with your physician about other symptoms that you might experience.

Some of these symptoms are little more than an annoyance that will go away, but extra caution must be paid to the symptoms that affect breathing. Any sign of trouble breathing should result in an immediate call to 9-1-1. While it might not seem so critical because at first the breathing problem is manageable, it could easily progress with swelling of the airway and suffocation. Your local EMS providers carry medication that will reverse your allergic reaction, but a trip to the hospital is still warranted.

Simple, over-the-counter medications such as Benadryl (diphenhydramine), Allegra (fexofenadine), Alavert (loratadine) or other antihistamines can help minor reactions such as hives, itching, rash, etc. People experiencing what they suspect to be allergic reactions for the first time should contact a physician before using any medications. People with known allergies might be prescribed an "Epi-Pen" or other automated device that injects epinephrine into the patient's leg. While this can be painful, it could save your life, and if you are prescribed it, carry it with you at all times. Critical medication such as this does no good when left at home.

As always, when in doubt, activate the 9-1-1 system and EMS will come to assist you.

"CLICK IT OR TICKET"

Linden Police officers will be cracking down on unbuckled motorists and passengers as part of the national "Click It or Ticket" campaign.

Running from May 23rd to June 5th, the annual initiative includes high-visibility law enforcement seat belt checkpoints and saturation patrols during the day and at night.

"Using a seat belt is the simplest way for a driver and his or her passengers to protect themselves when traveling," said Gary Poedubicky, Acting Director of the New Jersey Division of Highway Traffic Safety. "Motor vehicle occupants who buckle-up increase their chances of surviving a crash by as much as 75 percent."

For the second year in a row, the campaign will focus on rear seat passengers as well as the front seat passengers. New legislation that now requires adult rear seat passengers to be buckled up became law in 2010. Currently, adult backseat belt use stands at only 27%. Furthermore, last year's front-seat belt usage rate in New Jersey rose for the 14th consecutive year to 93.73%.

During the 2010 "Click it or Ticket" campaign, 406 police agencies in New Jersey participated in the two-week initiative. As a result of the effort, law enforcement officers issued 35,671 seat belt citations. In Linden, officers issued 614 tickets.

"We're looking for 100 compliance rate for both front and back seat passengers," said Linden Police Traffic Bureau Commander Sergeant Michael Babulski. "Whether you are a front seat or rear seat passenger, wearing seat belts saves lives. It's that simple."

EMERGENCY RESPONSE SYSTEM

Since December of 1983, the City of Linden condition exists and within minutes, an has administered the Linden Emergency Response System Program for the elderly, physically handicapped, medically disabled and the socially isolated of Linden. To date more than 600 Linden recipients have taken advantage of the 24 hour monitoring service and we presently serve approximately one hundred-fifty area residents.

The LERS unit is an easy to use wireless transmitter which becomes a 24 hour companion and a direct link to safeguarding one's health and safety. One press of the button is all it takes to notify the central station that an emergency

ambulance and emergency personnel are at the scene. Besides having the transmitter and emergency help immediately, your medical profile is kept on file and is at the disposal of emergency personnel.

AND THE GOLD MEDAL GOES TO . . .

This year in January, Linden High school participated in the National German Exam. Students who are in German II-V take this test every year. The test focuses on listening and reading comprehension, and also incorporates structure and vocabulary. The test is scored by percentile rankings; the rank is calculated separately for each test level. A score in the 90th percentile or above is awarded a gold medal, 80th percentile or above is awarded a silver medal and 70th percentile or above is awarded a bronze medal. Our students scored very well, we had five medal winners overall. The level IV medal winners were senior, Emmanuel Lomba (bronze) and junior, Nicholas Faria (silver). The level II winners were freshmen Nicole Tarnowski (bronze) and Allyson Dixon(silver). The only gold medal winner this year was junior, Maria Cruz, on the level III exam.

Scoring at the 90th percentile, made Maria eligible to qualify for a three-week exchange to Germany, however, she is already planning to participate in the GAPP exchange program at LHS next year. Maria scored the highest in level III in LHS and out of 322 students who belong to the Central Jersey chapter of the American Association of Teachers of German (AATG) she ranked number 37. Last year Maria also tied for the highest score in level II with Damian Kwiatkowski. Maria plans to take IB German next year, which is the most challenging level of German offered at LHS. She hopes to major in German in college and study abroad in order to ultimately become a German teacher.

ST. THERESA CHURCH CELEBRATES JOHN PAUL II'S BEAUTIFICATION

On the day of the beatification ceremony held in Rome for Pope John Paul II, St. Theresa of the Child Jesus Church located in Linden, had a special ceremony of blessing and unveiling of a place of remembrance of bl. John Paul II. The bi-lingual ceremony included the blessing, Devine Mercy devotions and an artistic program. Cardinal Stanislaw Dziwisz gave the parish a zucchetto (small white skullcap) which was worn by the Pope and upon his beatification became a second class relic. A Second Class Relic is an item or piece of an item used by the Saint while on the body. This relic will now be displayed in the blessed place in St. Theresa Church.






