### Issue 23 • October 2011 **CITY OF LINDEN OF LINDEN CONSTRUCTS A 9-11 MONUMENT**

On Saturday, September 10th, the City of Linden conducted a dedication of a 9-11 monument located in front of the City Hall. The monument consists of a piece of twisted steel girder from the World Trade Center buildings. It was given to the City of Linden by NY NJ Port Authority.

A committee was organized to build the monument. Councilman Jack Sheehy and Councilman Bob Sadowski co shared chairmanship of the committee. The Monument was designed and built by Charlie Dulko a member of Linden Public works. Cooper Electric Supply in Linden donated electric parts for the monument.

There were over 200 attendees at the unveiling of Linden's 9-11 monument. In attendance were the Linden Police Department and Honor Guard, Linden Fire Department and Honor Guard, elected county and city officials, Veterans of American Legion Post # 102, Catholic War Veterans, Post # 497, Marine League, Martin Danowski Detachment, Post # 91 American Legion of Polish Veterans, Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter #779, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Post # 1397, members of Linden Business Fraternal clubs and residents.

The unveiling of the monument was very emotional and moving it concluded with residents being invited to reach out and touch the monument to honor all the victims of the 9-11 terror attack.

Donations to the project construction were given by The Linden Industrial Association, Linden Chamber of Commerce, Catholic War Veterans Post # 497 and Linden Veteran Council members (American Legion Post # 102, Linden Marine league, Martin Danowski Detachment, Polish Legion of American Veterans Past # 91, Veterans of Foreign Wars Post # 1397and Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter #779.

#### Message from the Mayor

In the aftermath of Hurricane Irene the entire State of New Jersey has been declared a disaster area. Residents and businesses affected by this hurricane may be eligible for assistance from Federal Emergency Management Agency.

Registration and information is available at the www.DisasterAssistance.gov website, 24 hours a day seven days a week. There is also a telephone number available by

calling 1-800-621-3362 between the hours of 6 a.m. to 10 p.m. seven days a week. Whether you register on line or by phone have the following items available. Paper and pen, social security number, address you are calling about, new address if you vacated this property, your phone number, insurance information and a description of your loss.

#### FEMA

Upon successful registration you will be given a FEMA application number. Keep it in a safe location for future use. In selected area's of Linden FEMA personnel will be going door to door but will not enter your residence and not ask you for personal information. All FEMA personnel will be in a proper uniform and have proper identification. FEMA has opened a Disaster Recovery Center (DRC) at the Cranford Community Center 220 Walnut Avenue, Cranford, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. but you must be registered and have your application claim number before being helped at this DRC.

U.S. Small Business Administration

This Federal Agency is accepting applications for disaster loans whether you rent or own your home or business. The law authorizes loan terms up to 30 years at a low interest rate. They also have available economic injury disaster loans, the application dead line for physical damage is 10/31/11 and economic injury 5/31/12.

#### **CITY OF LINDEN**

If you have to purchase new hot water heaters, boilers, refrigerators or other appliances go to www.njcleanenergy.com for possible rebate information. Remember a permit from the City of Linden through the Construction Code Department is required prior to installation. However all fees have been waived for flood damaged appliances. Also, Linden has a program identified as Linden Home Improvement Program. This allows individuals with low annual income to receive a NO interest loan for serious construction code repairs. Your Responsibility is that upon the sale of your home by either you or your estate, the City of Linden has to be paid back upon closing.





Literacy Volunteers of Union County (LV-UC) is a non-profit organization that recruits and trains volunteers to work with adults seeking to improve their reading, writing or English conversation skills. New Tutor Training Workshops provide new volunteers with the skills needed to work with adult learners in Union County. ## AGGRESSIVE **ENFORCEMENT DETAIL**

Beginning September 12th, 2011, the Linden Police Department will begin aggressively

enforcing motor vehicle violations on Route 1&9, a state mandated Safe Corridor. The Safe Corridor Enforcement Detail is being funded through a grant from the NJDepartment of Transportation Highway Safety Fund.

"We will be looking for any and all violations, and there will be zero tolerance" stated Linden Police Traffic Commander Michael Babulski. "We are focused on making the roads safer by cutting down on accidents and injuries, and hopefully aggressive enforcement will help us reach that goal."

The Safe Corridor Enforcement Detail will begin on Monday, September 12, 2011, and will include roving patrols. "Our officers will be focusing on all violations, especially ones that distract drivers," said Babulski. "The technology of today is making it all too easy for drivers to get distracted, so driving while texting and talking on the cell phone is a big concern that we plan on addressing."

## LINDEN POLICE INTRODUCE A NEW CRIME MAP

The Linden Police Department recently Information sharing and increased positive partnered with BAIR Analytics Inc. to provide a new public crime mapping website called RAIDS Online (www.raidsonline.com) to make it easier for Linden citizens to keep track of crime in their area.

RAIDS Online maps and analyzes crime data, alerts Linden citizens about crimes in their area, and allows the Linden Police Department to quickly alert the public about crimes as they occur. Citizens can easily move between the map, data grid and analytics to learn about the crime that concerns them the most.

BAIR offers RAIDS Online as a free service to any law enforcement agency who wishes to participate. At present, most agencies spend thousands of dollars annually to provide even the most basic crime map to their community. The Linden Police Department is providing this service to the public at absolutely no cost to the department. "We wanted to do something to help law enforcement in these tough economic times. We consider this a basic service that we provide to the public and our law enforcement friends," says company founder, Sean Bair, a former police officer and crime analyst.

Chief Salvatore Bivona, who introduced the Intelligence-Led Policing concept to the Linden Police Department upon his appointment as Chief states, "Our goal is to provide citizens a way to get information about crime in their community so that they can be better informed. Having an awareness of the true nature and volume of crime in one's community is the first step to its prevention and suppression.

police-citizen interaction foster Community Policing, which is something we strongly believe in."

#### **HOW IT WORKS**

RAIDS Online syncs with Linden Police Department's records system to automatically upload crime information and keep it updated on the map, a big plus for community members.

#### **MAPPING FEATURES**

RAIDS Online uses Google Maps to display the location and basic information for crimes in any area of interest to the user. RAIDS Online's vibrant colored maps, icons and symbols work together to deliver easy-to-read crime information at all zoom levels, from a national level down to the citizen's neighborhood.

#### **ANALYTIC FEATURES**

Linden citizens can use RAIDS Online to find patterns and trends of crimes in their community - or even across the nation. Graphs automatically update based on the data that is displayed on the map, giving the user full control over what data is analyzed. Citizens who use RAIDS Online to become aware of crime trends can make more informed decisions regarding where they live, shop, play, send their kids to school and other important choices regarding their personal safety.

#### **EMAIL REPORTS OF RECENT CRIME ACTIVITY**

Linden citizens can sign up for neighborhood crime alerts to receive daily, weekly or monthly emails with a breakdown of crimes in their area.

## **EMERGENCY VEHICLE SAFETY AND COURTESY**

At Linden EMS, it is our mission to deliver the highest quality of pre-hospital emergency medical care to the residents and visitors of the City of Linden through a unified team effort of caring and highly trained medical professionals. We do this with the highest regard for our own safety and the safety of the community we serve.

In order for us to be as protected as possible, we must rely on everyone to have the same concern and courtesy for others. For example, one of the most dangerous parts of our job, as well as all other emergency service providers, is actually getting to the call for help in a safe and expeditious manner. Unfortunately, motor vehicle collisions remain the most common cause for fatalities among emergency services providers, and are the most preventable.

We rely on other motorists to be attentive to their surroundings at all times; listening for sirens, and watching for emergency lights. Based on the training that all drivers in New Jersey have received in order to possess a valid license to operate a motor vehicle, it is the expectation of emergency vehicle operators that when approaching other vehicles, that they will yield to the right.

This means that if you see a police car, ambulance, fire truck, or any other vehicle sounding its siren with any kind of flashing red, blue, white, or amber lights behind you that you should immediately look for a safe place to move to your right and come to a stop until all emergency vehicles have passed. You should be especially attentive to ensure that the ambulance

At Linden EMS, it is our mission to deliver or other emergency vehicle that passes is the highest quality of pre-hospital emergency only one coming.

At times, you may notice several vehicles traveling in the same direction to get to the same call for help, or to get a critically sick or injured patient to the hospital.

Some examples of this would be if you or a loved one were experiencing some type of lifethreatening emergency such as a heart attack, stroke, seizure, etc. Often not only will Linden EMS respond in an ambulance with emergency medical technicians, but a mobile intensive care unit (MICU) with paramedics from one of the area hospitals will respond as well.

You might also be surprised to find that depending on the type of emergency, a fire engine and a police car may be at the same address for a medical emergency. In this case, it is important that you give as much space as possible for all of these vehicles and personnel to perform their duties.

Once it is time to leave for the hospital, it is most likely that only the ambulance, or the ambulance and the MICU will actually go to the hospital, leaving the police and fire department units available for other emergencies.

While we understand that you might want to follow directly behind the ambulance to the hospital to be close to your loved one, we ask that you do not. If needed, we will provide you with written directions to the hospital we are transporting to so that you can get there safely. We may be using our lights and siren to go through intersections controlled with traffic signals, and following closely behind us poses a very large danger to you and other motorists.

It is unlikely that your traveling to the hospital obeying all traffic laws will get you there any more than a few minutes behind the ambulance. In this time, you would most likely be asked to wait for the patient to be moved to the hospital bed and be given a preliminary check by the medical team in the emergency department.

You should also be aware that when you are driving and approaching stationary vehicles, that a similar courtesy is not only expected, but is the law. More specifically, NJ 39:4-92.2, The "Move Over Law" has been enacted.

The law, which can be reviewed at www.moveoverlaw.com, requires motorists to "reduce their speed and change lanes when approaching authorized vehicles that are displaying flashing lights.

Vehicles included in the list are police, fire and medical services as well as highway maintenance, tow trucks and official motorist aid vehicles when they display flashing lights. This includes situations where motorists must move over to give officers conducting traffic stops or tow truck drivers assisting broken-down motorists additional room to maneuver safely on foot near the shoulders of the road. Violators of this important law can be fined up to \$500.

We look forward to serving the community and aiding you in the time of your emergency and hope that while we may not be responding to your home, that you will assist us in arriving safely at all calls for help.


antique cars, bands and floats. Approximately 10,000 people attended the parade two years ago.


