IN TRIBUTE TO WANDA ANITA GREEN

Wanda Anita Green, 49, was a Flight Pennsylvania, about 150 miles (240 km) Attendant with United Airlines for twenty-nine years, fulfilling a dream of flying and seeing the world. According to her mother, Wanda was one of the first African American flight attendants with United Airlines. Wanda was a dedicated mother to her children, Jennifer and Joe Benjamin, a deacon in her church, and active in her local community of Linden, New Jersey. She earned her real estate license and planned to open her own real estate office after retiring from United. Wanda planned to visit her family in Oakland, California during her layover following the September 11 flight to the West Coast.

Wanda was among the 40 people on board Flight 93 which took off from Newark, New Jersey en route to San Francisco, California. The members' quick thinking resourcefulness, along with that of their passengers, were ultimately responsible for preventing the hijacked plane from reaching the nation's capital.

Flight 93 was one of four planes hijacked as It was the only one of the four planes that did not reach its intended target, instead crashing in an just outside Shanksville,

northwest of Washington, D.C. The 9/11 Commission (through testimony, tapes of passengers' phone calls, and the flight data recorders recovered from the crash) determined that crew and passengers, alerted through phone calls to loved ones, had attempted to overtake the hijackers. The Commission concluded that the hijackers crashed the plane to keep the crew and passengers from gaining control. Message from the Mayor

The City of Linden faced Hurricane Irene and came out of it relatively well considering the damage sustained by other municipalities and states. Of course if you are one of our residents that suffered storm damage due to flooding or loss of electrical power you won't agree with my assessment, and I understand that. But, let me assure you that Linden's damage equaled only a small percentage of what Rahway or Cranford

sustained and we should count our blessings for that.

During the Hurricane our emergency services handled over 500 calls from the public approx. 250 calls were received for flooded basements with varying degrees of water ranging from several inches to over 6 feet. Unfortunately 3 homes had their basement walls collapsed and are now inhabitable. There were 16 boat rescues from residents stranded in their house after they decided it was wise to leave. Our police department was also a victim of the flood waters. Two radio cars responded to a live wire down and a stranded motorist in flood waters and both wound up stalling out their vehicles in high waters. Two of the officers had to exit their vehicle through the windows to avoid the rising flood waters. Both vehicles are a total loss.

During the height of the storm numerous vehicles were disabled in flood waters and abandoned on city streets and Rt. 1 & 9. When the water receded they were all towed. When the drivers come to pick up their vehicles they will be issued summons for driving during an emergency. There was one serious accident on Rt. 1 & 9 and the driver was arrested for driving under the influence. As can be seen, advisories are given to protect the public and when people don't heed them they not only jeopardize themselves but also first responders who have to put themselves in harms way to protect the public.

I would like to take this opportunity on behalf of the City of Linden to thank the members of Linden's Emergency Management Team, specifically Deputy Coordinator's Capt. Dave Hart, Sgt. Ed Chabak and Kathy Colgan. Also, our Police Department, Fire Department, Linden Emergency Medical Services, Public Works and everyone that contributed to minimizing the damage that was done to our great city and residents.

Unfortunately people have to realize that during disasters such as this there is only a limited amount of labor and resources available and everyone's needs cannot be addressed at once. Priorities have to be established whether it is cutting down fallen trees pumping flooded basements, or PSE&G restoring electricity. Residents should have patience and realize that they will be inconvenienced for a while. I know all our employees and the public utilities are working extremely hard to restore the services Linden residents had prior to this hurricane. Fortunately, no lives were lost and as devastating as it is to sustain property damage at least that can be replaced, lives cannot.

I would like to publicly thank all our residents for their cooperation during this storm. We should consider ourselves blessed that Linden was spared the devastation that many other municipalities experience from Hurricane Irene.







SAFETY TIP FROM LINDEN EMS

The summer has ended and it is now the beginning of a new school year. When this comes to mind we will typically think about purchasing books, pencils, and other various school supplies. But how many of us consider adding hand sanitizer to that list? Do you worry about how easily your children may get sick while sitting in a classroom and why it seems that infections spread so easily? Is it possible to teach children simple steps to help avoid becoming ill?

Many childhood illnesses are caused by viruses. It only takes one sick child at school to start the spreading. Think about the following scenarios which are not only possible but probable; a child comes to school with a cough and/or sneeze and other children sitting nearby begin to inhale infectious material or a child with diarrhea does not wash his or her hands after using the restroom and touches the railing or door knob that other children come in contact With the viruses being so easily transmittable, we need to be sure to talk to our children about staying healthy.



The first subject that should be emphasized is the importance of hand washing. Hand washing will kill most viruses present on the hands; however, we must wash our hands properly. Have them wet their hands, then use plenty of soap and lather for the amount of time it takes them to sing the alphabet. Instruct them to use paper towels to turn off the faucet. Water does not have to be hot to effectively eliminate any germs present, cool or cold water can be used just as effectively. Furthermore, children should not bring their hands near their faces and should avoid touching their face with dirty or unwashed hands. If your child is not feeling well they should be reminded not to touch their face and then touch other objects. The face has many areas that are extremely susceptible to the transmission of viruses, such as eyes, nares of the nose, and the mouth.

Early on in a child's school career, their immune systems are put to the test regularly. To keep our children healthy we should ensure that they are maintaining a healthy diet. Studies prove that children who eat a well balanced diet are less likely to become ill. Also, make sure that your children get enough sleep. Children expend so much energy throughout the course of the day that they need more rest than adults to allow their bodies to replenish themselves. Lastly, if your child is sick please do not send them to school, allow them to rest and fully recover before returning to school. This will help limit the spread of infection but will also allow your child's immune system to combat the illness more effectively.


