HELP THE LIONS HELP THE BLIND!

The North Plainfield Lions Club has been active in the borough since the 1950's. With a motto of "We Serve", the main mission of Lions Clubs International is to raise money to aid those who have sight and hearing disabilities. Founded in 1917, Lions Clubs International has grown to become the largest service organization in the world, with 1.3 million members, in 46,000 clubs, in 207 nations. In keeping with their mission, Lions Clubs often collect used eyeglasses and hearing aids for refurbishment and distribution to the poor. A repainted former postal drop-box can be found at the North Plainfield Public Library, for collection of these items.

Locally, the Lions raise money for projects around town and actively participate in annual events held throughout the borough. Some events where the North Plainfield Lions can be seen include: the Senior Citizens' Picnic, the 4th of July parade, Memorial Day ceremonies and of course, at the club's own annual Palm Sunday Pancake Breakfast. Monies from the breakfast fund scholarships the Lions give each year to two graduating seniors from NPHS. Lions can also be seen collecting money for the blind, in front of local stores, during their White Cane Days. As a major project, the North Plainfield Lions recently partnered with the Food Bank Network of Somerset County. The club has made quarterly financial donations or given collections of food and personal hygiene items to the food bank.

"KEEPING FOOTBALL AND CHEER HERE IN NORTH PLAINFIELD"

Plainfield Jr. Canucks (NPJC) are in the midst of preparing and planning a Youth Football & Cheer program to serve children grades K-8 in the North Plainfield community. The NPJC organization operates as a NJ public Non-Profit Corporation aimed at shaping young boys and girls into well rounded student-athletes before entering high school. The NPJC organization inclusively teaches the fundamentals of football and cheer while integrating philosophies derived directly from North Plainfield High School coaches. Board Member President, Chris Stowers, Jr. of North Plainfield, noted that "Our 'feeder' philosophy will ensure student-athletes will be prepared to play football and cheer at North Plainfield High School." Coaches have been attending clinic training sessions since the beginning of March to ensure that instructional schema is consistent at all levels of competition.

The North Plainfield Jr. Canucks is affiliated with the New Jersey Jr. Skyland Football Conference (JSFC) and was unanimously awarded acceptance into the http://www.jrskylandfootball.org/, as its 11th member on 2/4/2013. ADVISE TO HELP AVOID BEING A VICTIM OF A SCAM

The old adage, if something is too good to be true, it probably is, is something all of us should take pause and remember. Police Departments are increasingly receiving complaints from citizens that report they have lost money, often thousands of dollars, and often because of their own action. These incidents are part of highly organized criminal enterprises often operating outside of the United States. The criminals conducting these operations don't use weapons or robbery but appeal to the part in all of us that like something for nothing. Unfortunately, these incidents seem to be more frequent; are difficult to investigate; and are even more difficult to prosecute.

Victims usually receive an official envelope in the mail often from organizations with official sounding names such as Sweepstakes Finder, or Lottery Locator. An official looking letter will indicate that the recipient has won a lottery or sweepstakes, and this company has been authorized to locate and facilitate payment of the prize. The next step should set off alarm bells, the letter will often ask for payment of a processing fee, often several thousand dollars. In order to secure payment the victim is asked to forward the organization a certified or cashier's check. Anxious to receive their share of a huge lottery award, (although less common other variations include vacations, jewelry or automobiles), the victim does so. Later the victim will become suspicious when they don't receive the award and contact the police.

A recently reported incident involved the victim being called by the "New Jersey Lotto Sweepstakes". The victim was told she had won several million dollars but in order to collect would have to pay a fee with prepaid debit cards. The victim purchased the cards and provided the card numbers to the caller. Using mail drops which can anonymously forward letters, the criminals can stay one step ahead of law enforcement locating them. Compounding this is that it involves multiple law enforcement agencies, not only of different jurisdictions but often of different countries. Some agencies have to concentrate on violent incidents, or incidents that have a high probability of being solved. That makes these scams an attractive and lucrative venture for clever but morally challenged individuals.

These practices are not just confined to regular mail but are also practiced on the internet as well. The internet also provides almost unlimited resources to personal individual data on all of us. Your data could be "mined", and then used in an official looking document; email; or phone call informing you "you're the lucky winner". On line incidents may vary with an angle that your bank or credit card wants to verify your account or alert to a new service. Another variation includes phone calls in which someone may claim to be from a government office or agency attempting to provide you with a service or a benefit; they just need to verify your social security number.

The best practice is to trust no one or organization that has made an unsolicited contact with you, especially if they are asking you for money including a processing fee, good faith fee, or certain personal information. Should you receive solicitations, in any form, notify your local law enforcement. It may aid them in an ongoing investigation or assist in preventing others from being taken advantage of.


