### Message from the President EXCELLENT EVENT AT TOP SHELF

I would like to thank Gary and Gerry Levenduski for hosting the NPBA March networking event. There were 45 people in attendance. Some NPBA members, others that became members and members of the Tri-County Chamber of Commerce. There were old, well-established businesses and

some that are just getting started. We discussed the plans for how NPBA can help businesses, how businesses can help themselves and each other.

I was asked to attend the Planning Board meeting to discuss what can be done to improve the downtown business district. These recommendations were for the master plan and designed by Art Bernard, P.P. and Richard Scalia, Project Manager for Somerset Street and Watchung Avenue. We talked about replacing trash bins and keeping the side walks clean. Also, installing planters located by the cross walks that will help beautify the area. Making the cross walks more visible was also suggested. The need to establish more parking areas was brought up and the desire to create a central location to bring people downtown for nighttime entertainment.

The NPBA will team up with the Economic Development Committee to reach out to companies that would be interested in moving into vacancies along Rte 22.

I'm also inviting all civic groups, churches, scouting troops, senior citizens, sporting leagues and anyone else that wants to put an article in The Pride to do so. The newspaper is designed to promote community service programs while giving businesses an inexpensive advertising venue.

The NPBA is working hard to improve North Plainfield. I'd like to thank all those who have joined the group and support the effort.

### PUBLIC INVITED TO WATCH FILM FEATURING NORTH PLAINFIELD HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS


The documentary film "Walking Into the Light at Gettysburg" features ten North Plainfield High School students. It was filmed over a three day period in April 2012 in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania.

The Battle of Gettysburg was fought during the first three days of July in 1863. The film records the student's impressions on what happened there 150 years ago and how it relates to them today.

Tom Mazur, Supervisor of Fine, Practical and Performing Arts for the high school says "The documentary is in 'cinema verite' style, having no script. The student's ability to get the 'big picture' and eloquently relate to what happened at Gettysburg will stir pride in anyone who sees this documentary."

The citizens of Gettysburg gave the students and the producer, Dr. Anthony Mussari, a standing ovation at the conclusion of the film which they viewed on January 19, 2013 at the Visitors Center.

As Dr. Mussari has often said, "If anyone wants to see America's tomorrow today...go to North Plainfield, New Jersey." Mazur added "This film presents exactly this sentiment, and the picture of the future is bright.

Chief William G. Parenti announced Operation "15-45" Park and Walk Program.

"This initiative will have Police Officers walking a beat in North Plainfield. The program is aimed at improving our visibility and accessibility and increasing public confidence in community-based policing."

Chief Parenti explained an officer shall walk fifteen minutes and ride 45 minutes per hour. The operation, which was launched again this year on March 15, 2013, has put an officer on the beat during the hours of 4:00pm and 10:00pm each day.

Chief William Parenti announced that North Plainfield Police has partnered with Somerset County Prosecutor Geoffrey D. Soriano's "Put It Down" distracted driving campaign.

The program will began April 1, 2013 with the theme don't be a fool and text and drive. Last year the program was more about education. This year's focus will be to bring the motoring public into compliance. Chief Parenti said "To achieve that goal police officers are issuing summons to all those caught on a texting or on a cell phone without a hands free device."


#### **EDUCATION FOUNDATION PARTICIPATED IN READ ACROSS AMERICA DAY**




#### FIFTH GRADERS GET UNIVERSITY EXPERIENCE

The students had an amazing day of learning and made remarkable real-world connections to the classroom lessons we promote each day – work hard, help one another, set goals, believe in yourself, and never give up on your dreams!

We arrived on campus at 9:30 a.m. and began our day at the Math and Science Learning Center on the Busch Campus. As we approached our destination, students were encouraged to observe buildings, undergraduate students moving between classes, college transportation, and the overall "bustling" atmosphere of the campus. The fifth graders were surprised to discover that our initial journey took us only through science department buildings; they found it hard to imagine that so many large and different buildings could encompass just one academic discipline!

Our time spent at the MSLC was divided between two lectures, focusing on Biology and Physics. Each of the professors, Dr. Patricia Barreto and Dr. Suzanne Brahmia, presented their lessons with an incredible sense of accessibility to the fifth graders. They included fascinating interactive demonstrations on DNA and air pressure, respectively, and provided opportunities for the students to test the theories discussed. Following the lectures, the fifth graders engaged with undergraduate and graduate students as they tested various physics models and participated in hands-on learning activities.

Later that morning we departed the MSLC to visit the "home" of our pen pals, the Rutgers Men's Basketball Team, at the Rutgers Athletic Center for a tour of the indoor arena. Ms. Randi Larson, Senior Athletic Academic Advisor and Ms. Caroline Rafferty, Athletic Communications Assistant for the Men's Basketball Team, arranged our tour, which proved to be an enormous thrill for the students. We visited the



women's locker room (while the players were getting ready to leave for a weekend road game), met Mr. Gene Wells, equipment manager, who gave us a tour of the vast stockroom and passed around a size 18 shoe for the students to examine. We walked courtside and watched our pen pals as they completed their own final practice before a weekend contest against Georgetown. Caroline escorted the fifth graders to the Media Room where players are interviewed following a home game and students had a chance to sit and "pretend" to answer questions.

Throughout the tour we learned more and more about the student-athlete experience – the demands and rewards of building intellectual acumen and physical strength amid a climate of teamwork and personal responsibility.

As we prepared to leave the RAC, Jeremy Davis, of the Sports Marketing Department, gave each student a Rutgers Basketball tee shirt and coupon for a free ticket to an upcoming home game! Students were overwhelmed by the generosity of the people we met at Rutgers who demonstrated a sincere desire to teach and inspire all of us.
