North Plainfield Parks and Recreation will be activities. There are a variety of activities having Summer Camp this year. There are two types of camp. The Summer Camp is a full day program - from 9 am to 3 pm - which will be open rain or shine and offers a before and after care option for an additional cost. The extended hours are 8am to 6 pm. North Plainfield Recreation is also offering Summer Playgrounds. The Summer Playgrounds is from 9 am to 1 pm – weather permitting.

Remaining Registration Dates are May 18 and June 1, 8, 22 at Vermuele from 9-11am and you can drop off the form to the Recreation office at 93 Greenbrook Road. All registrations for Summer Camp received after June 1 will be subject to a \$50 late fee. Eligibility: North Plainfield children ages 4 through 13.

The Summer Camp is an indoor/outdoor summer program. Campers can sign up for weekly field trips and will be placed in a campsite based on their age with age appropriate

including arts and crafts, board games, indoor and outdoor sports, and playground equipment. There will be weekly themes and field trips. There is a charge for the field trips. The program is a 7 week program starting on June 24th through August 9th. There is no camp on July 3rd and 4th due to Independence Day. The cost is \$475 plus \$25 Registration fee (cost includes 3 Major Trips/Events)

The Playgrounds is an outdoor summer playgrounds program that will be at East End School. This program is available to North Plainfield residents in grades Kindergarten through Eighth. This playground camp will have limited activities and will be 100% outdoors. The hours are 9 am to 1 pm. The session is 7 weeks starting June 23 through August 9th with no camp on July 3rd and 4th due to Independence Day. The cost is \$125.

STREET FAIR FIRE SAFETY GUIDE

Submitted by William F. Eaton, Fire Chief/Director North Plainfield Fire Dept.

The Borough's annual street fair is quickly upon us. As a reminder to all vendors that plan on cooking, you are required to fill out a permit through our division of Fire Prevention and Protection.

regarding this event:

Propane fuel target inspected by the Fire use and each time a Department persons.

Permits can be obtained either through the Mayor's office or downloaded from the Borough's website, under the "Fire Prevention Bureau" tab of the "Fire" section of the website and it is labeled - "Torch, Flame or Open Flame Producing Device."

Other important safety reminders for vendors

regarding this event:

Propane fuel tanks are required to be inspected by the Fire Department before initial use and each time a fuel tank is replaced. Fire Department personnel will be available to inspect tanks that are changed. A Fire Inspector will be assigned to walk up and down the street for vendor convenience and to also perform periodic safety inspections. An additional inspector will be available at the Fire Department booth on the corner of Somerset Street and Lincoln Place.

INSPECT YOUR COOKING EQUIPMENT

PRIOR TO FAIR DAY

- 1. All valves shall operate properly. (open & close without leakage)
- 2. Be sure all connections are clean and free of dirt, grease or oils.
- 3. Make sure all hoses and connections are in good condition.
- 4. Check "O" rings or gaskets for wear or leakage.
- 5. Do not use tanks that are out dated, severely rusted or pitted.
- 6. Be sure that all appliances are clean & functioning properly.
- 7. Only "DOT" approved cylinders of 20 lb. capacity or less shall be permitted.

ON FAIR DAY

- Set up cooking equipment away from combustible materials.
- Protect tank from being knocked over or damaged.
- Store spare cylinder(s) away from heat and secure from falling or damage.
- Keep all cooking appliances as clean as possible.
- Extinguish all flames before changing tanks.
- Do not start cooking until the Fire Department inspects equipment for use.
- An approved dry chemical fire extinguisher is required to be in plain view.
- Minimum fire extinguisher size of 2A.




