Message from the Chairman **WE'LL MISS YOU DAVID**

Here was a man who epitomized the entrepreneur.

I was saddened last month to hear that my old friend David Ginfrida had died. David was a Chamber member and had recently been elected to our Board of Trustees. Dave's tragic passing is a loss to his family, to our town, his many friends and his numerous business customers.

I met Dave in the late 1970's at a Rahway Chamber of Commerce meeting that was held at the old King's Row Restaurant, now Patria, on West Main Street. Dave was an energetic young man who lived on Hazelwood Avenue and had a small roofing business. "Bob, I don't want to be just a roof monkey. I want to be bigger than that and grow a business that's not only roofing but also siding and additions and all types of construction". David did just that and much more.

David was small in stature but big in heart. His customers respected him and found him down to earth, responsible and fair. It made no difference to David whether he was doing a small bathroom repair for an elderly client or adding a 2nd story for a wealthy homeowner in Westfield. Big jobs or small jobs were handled alike and with the same good business practices: honesty and hard work were his foundation and those qualities served him well.

In more recent years David formed a foundation to assist needy people and organizations. He believed in teamwork, not only on the job site but also in working to help his community. "Ginfrida Community Counts" did just that, providing with his partner associates, substantial annual contributions to over a dozen local charities & non-profits.



WHAT IS CORN GLUTEN?

Corn gluten meal is a by-product or leftover from when companies make corn starch and corn syrup. When you get it at the store or local garden and lawn center you will find it in 40 or 50lb bags in pellet or granular form. Overall, it contains around 10% nitrogen. Nitrogen is pretty much the essential nutrient that turns grass green, and corn gluten meal has a very solid and stable amount naturally, making it a GREAT choice for an organic fertilizer.

HOW DOES CORN GLUTEN PREVENT CRAB GRASS?

Corn gluten meal, when applied early enough in the season, will build up in the soil line and prevent annual crab grass with some fairly good results. The key is you have to get it down just after the snow goes away. If you wait too long, you will not get very good control. I also recommend you NOT apply corn gluten in heavily shaded areas because crab grass does not usually grow in shady areas and the corn gluten will build up in the soil and actually thin out the grass in shaded areas. This grass is weak already from lack of sunlight. You also may make applications, in March, and again in April.

IS CORN GLUTEN MEAL A GOOD ORGANIC FERTILIZER?

Yes, it is! Corn gluten contains a very nice amount of nitrogen, and because it is organic, it is naturally slow releasing. This means that it feeds the lawn slowly over time, making a nice impact on plant growth without pushing the turf unhealthily. So many of today's synthetic fertilizers are full of quick release super hydrated nitrogen that pushes the growth of grass plants, almost like giving them a sugar rush that will end in a crash at some point. Organic fertilizers like corn gluten won't do this.



TOO MULCH OF A GOOD THING

By John Holtz Master Gardener with Rutgers Cooperative Research & Extension.

Mulch is a good thing for the garden. Too much mulch incorrectly placed around trees and shrubs is a bad thing.

Proper mulching reduces erosion, conserves moisture for plant roots and prevents damage from drought, regulates soil temperature, and suppresses unwanted weeds and grasses. Mulches derived from compost or cocoa bean shells add organic matter to the soil.

Besides dressing up the landscape, mulch also protects trunks and stems from getting whacked by power edgers or mauled by mowers.

On the other hand . . .

Mulch volcanoes are a leading cause of disease and death for mountain laurel, linden, spruce, holly, cherry, ash, birch, azalea, rhodos, dogwood and boxwood, according to Rutgers Cooperative Extension and Research.

Mice and voles love to make their homes in lessen the likelihood thick, cozy piles of mulch. Live tree bark of weeds.

becomes their food source, particularly in winter when the ground freezes making other garden snacks scarce.

Insects use mulch volcanoes as a jumping off point to infest live bark, transporting fungal, viral, and bacterial diseases. Fungi and bacteria thrive on moist decaying mulch. Once established in mulch it then enters bark.

Best practice is to purchase a natural wood mulch, not stone, and apply in a donut shape between 2 inches but no more than 4 inches deep around your tree and out to the drip line of the outer branches. Leave the donut hole in the center at the tree trunk so that no mulch touches

the trunk. You may use one layer of landscape fabric under the mulch to lessen the likelihood of weeds.





A COOL ANSWER TO RECOVERY AT TRINITAS

During a recent visit from Florida to see relatives and friends in Roselle Park, New Jersey, Alfred Colucci experienced a cardiac arrest that made him an excellent candidate to receive the latest treatment using therapeutic hypothermia at Trinitas Regional Medical Center. His remarkable recovery is attributed to the protocol that involved cooling his body temperature to 91 degrees.

Nicknamed "Code Frosty," the protocol involves staff in key areas, including the Mobile Intensive Care Unit, the Emergency Department, Intensive Care Unit, Respiratory Therapy, Pharmacy, Anesthesiology, and the Cardiac Catheterization Lab. For patients such as Mr. Colucci, therapeutic hypothermia relies

on the interaction of staff members in these departments who work rapidly to cool the patient in order to preserve brain function in the first minutes following a cardiac arrest.

"Therapeutic hypothermia, which involves bringing a patient's body temperature down to 91 degrees, is recommended for patients whose hearts have stopped, been restarted through CPR, and who remain unconscious," explains Trinitas Advance Practice Nurse Debbie Durand. "Therapeutic hypothermia helps to prevent damage to the brain which is dependent on a steady supply of oxygen from the heart. Since many patients do not even survive the original cardiac arrest, we want to give those that do every chance to maintain good brain function. If the supply of oxygen to the brain is interrupted, various processes can cause damage to brain cells that may result in an inability to communicate or interact with others. By chilling the whole body, we can slow brain damage or even prevent it from happening," she continues.

Therapeutic hypothermia begins in the field where Trinitas paramedics are equipped with icepacks and cooled IV solution. En route to the Emergency Department, work begins on the patient so that valuable time is not wasted. The process then continues in the Emergency Department where the patient is wrapped in a specialized vest and leg coverings.

The care of the patient continues while he or she is under sedation. For the next 24 hours, the patient is kept cool and cared for in the Intensive Care Unit. During this time, the patient's normal body functions are monitored and ultimately, the patient's body temperature is gradually warmed and returned to normal level.
