ROBOTICS TEAM TAKES HOME EXCELLENCE IN ENGINEERING TROPHY

At the Mount Olive FIRST Robotics District Competition held March 23 and 24, Rahway High School Robotics Team1228, Robotribe, qualified for the quarter finals in a field of 35 teams. They also received the Excellence in Engineering Award, sponsored by Delphi, for demonstrating and describing two different chosen machine features, their very accurate shooter and their speed climbing mechanism.

The goal of the 2013 FIRST competition is to create a robot that can play a game called Ultimate Ascent, where two alliances made up of three teams each score points by throwing Frisbees into specified goals, then the robots must climb a pyramid, and finally in the final thirty seconds, humans throw the Frisbees into the goals.

Rahway's next FIRST competition will be at Bridgewater High School on April 6 and 7. Team 1228 coaches are teachers Adam Slack, John Marks, Pat Gailliot, and district administrator Ray Candiloro.

IMPATIENS PROBLEM IN NEW JERSEY DOWNEY MILDEW DISEASE

By mid-summer of 2012 gardeners across New Jersey helplessly watched as our beloved impatiens, the colorful backbone of shade gardens, weakened, turned yellow, dropped their leaves, wilted and died.

By October it was confirmed that Downey Mildew disease had been confirmed in our landscapes. From Massachusetts to Florida; New Jersey to Missouri and even Southern California the impatiens failed. By the end of last year, 32 states reported Downey Mildew.

This disease, known as a "water mold" (formerly called a fungus) was quickly spread by spores. Unfortunately these spores overwinter in garden bed soil and can remain viable for years.


IT IS NOT RECOMMENDED WE PLANT IMPATIENS THIS YEAR.

A few garden centers and big chain stores plan to grow and sell impatiens this year. They are able to control the disease with fungicides in greenhouses which will wear off quickly once moved away. Even potted plants are not safe from the air-born spores.

Find an alternative to plant in your garden. New Guinea impatiens and Sunpatiens (Hybrid of regular & New Guinea) have a higher resistance to downy mildew. Coleus with colorful leaves, Begonias or Caladium would be a few good choices.

Find more information in the March edition of 'Gardeners News'. If you cannot find a copy at your local garden center you can read it online. The article is entitled 'Time to Start Thinking About Annuals in NJ'.

Although this is very disappointing to gardeners, it is a disaster to landscapers,

greenhouses and seed companies. Researchers across the country and the Department of Agriculture are working to solve this problem as quickly as possible.

UNIVERSITY RESEARCHER COLLABORATES WITH HIGH SCHOOL STAFF

On March 27, Professor Rebecca Dedmond of George Washington University spent the day working with Guidance Counselors and Freshman Transition Teachers at Rahway High School. Dr. Dedmond is the author of course standards used in the Freshman Transition initiative in its second year at the high school, and she has visited and worked with staff previously.

She reviewed with the staff what research has to show about improving not just the rigor of high schools, but the success of its students. Research shows that building relationships with students helps them set goals both academically and with regard to career planning. Such relationships help them focus on their futures and become internally motivated, connecting current actions with future goals.

MUSIC THROUGH THE AGES WAX MUSEUM

Each year, the fourth graders participate in a Wax Museum. The fourth grade teachers get together to pick a topic for the Wax Museum. Once the theme is decided, a letter is sent home to the parents explaining the theme and what is required of their child. This year our theme is Music through the Ages. Some of the artists represented are Frank Sinatra, Madonna, the Supremes, Elvis Presley, and John Bon Jovi. The decades depicted began with the 1930s to present day.

Once the student's topic is assigned, students are given acceptable web sites to do their research. Research and participation in the Wax Museum is a cross-curricula activity, and locating information is a difficult skill for some fourth graders. Their research hones in on their technology skills and enhances their information gathering skills, as well as skills in reading in the content area. Once all the information is organized, the students write a short biography about their person. The ability to apply research information to their writing is an important skill for success on the NJASK.

After weeks of research, writing and memorizing, the day finally arrives. Students are dressed in their costumes, and the auditorium is decorated according to the theme. Parent involvement is very much in evidence. Parents, community members and school administrators are invited to the museum. Our students really shine, especially with their public speaking skills. Our annual Wax Museum is always a highlight of fourth grade.




