

Parking prohibited and tickets issued for 20 years in downtown for Saturday street sweeping. Guess what? Street sweeper never works weekends.

It's time for our city fathers to amend the ordinance that prohibits Saturday morning parking

on downtown streets. The intent of the ordinance was noble; in fact I helped spearhead the introduction of it some 20 years ago at a time when tenants were prohibited from parking in front of their homes every night.



"How can we expect to improve our residential tenant base in downtown when we won't even let them park in front of their own homes at night" was

what I asked City Council those many years ago. So we created an alternate side of street parking ordinance which provided one side of the street overnight parking for tenants on alternate days and thus providing sufficient times for street sweeping to take place as well.

All initially seemed well except that the anticipated Saturday sweeping never occurred because the sweeper doesn't work on weekends. Parking, however, is still prohibited Saturday mornings and tickets have been routinely issued for the last 20 years for no real reason.

It's certainly not the cops' fault because they're just doing their jobs and we shouldn't expect our DPW to add the costs of another day of sweeping when our city budget is all ready so stressed. So let's get this ordinance changed, right things, and by doing so our town becomes more fair and friendly and supportive of its downtown residents.







"A CUT ABOVE" DISTINGUISHES RAHWAY RESIDENT ANTONIO GARAY

Antonio never gave up hope nor lost sight of his dream

Ready.... Set Most NFL centers cringe at what comes next. What may you ask? Oh just a 6' 4", 320 lbs defensive linemen named Antonio Garay. Forget his imposing size and strength, Antonio is a San Diego Charger and personifies the lightning bolt image not only in quickness but hairstyle as well. Once penalized for a cat like hurdle over two offensive linemen, he's no ordinary defensive nose tackle. But who is Antonio Garay and how did he become a rising NFL star? In order to find out, we'll have to start from the beginning.

Born November 30th, 1979, Antonio is the first of three children. Marsha and Tony are the loving parents that raised Antonio, Daniel and Francesca here in Rahway. Both parents were two sport athletes at Hofstra University in New York: Tony wrestled and played football while Marsha played softball and was captain of the tennis team. Tony went on to play in the NFL for the Los Angeles Rams, Oakland Raiders, New England Patriots and New York Jets before ending his professional career.

Antonio was athletic from an early age but the first sport he entered wasn't football, it was soccer. Since he was over the youth football weight limit, Antonio gained most of his foot speed and stamina from playing fullback on Rahway soccer teams. The only chance Antonio had to play football was early mornings before middle school. "Antonio would get to Madison School early to play football on the front lawn with friends" recalls his dad Tony. It wasn't until Antonio's freshman year at Rahway High School that he began playing organized football and decided his soccer days were over. By his senior year, Antonio had won All State and Blue Chip All American honors for his performance on the football field.

Wrestling is another sport in which the Garay family has dominated. In 1955 Antonio's uncle Louie won the New Jersey state championship, uncle Carlos finished second two years later and in 1966 Tony Garay finished third. Antonio had a perfect record his senior year in the 275 pound weight class and was the New Jersey state and national champion.

Not to let athletic achievement overshadow academics, Antonio performed so well he was offered scholarships by 25 different universities. Deciding to attend Boston College on a football and wrestling scholarship he continued his dominance on the football field as well as the mat. Antonio remains the only Boston College NCAA All American in football and wrestling in school history. But the time Antonio spent at BC wasn't all glory. During his junior year he sprained his ACL and suffered a season ending spinal injury the next year.

Once dubbed a top ten first round draft pick by many NFL scouts, injuries pushed Antonio into the sixth round of the NFL draft. Never the less, on April 27th, 2003 the dream of playing in the NFL became a reality. He was selected by the Cleveland Browns where he'd serve as an insurance policy to first rounder Gerald Warren. When Antonio tore his ACL again during his second year with the Browns, the term injury





prone began to surface. Despite the rumors, the Chicago Bears signed him to their practice squad in 2005 where he'd back up another NFL Pro Bowler, Tommy Harris. Antonio was a member of the Bears 2006 Super Bowl team and was having a great start to the 2007 season when an illegal chop block broke his leg and shattered his ankle. After the game Jerry Angelo the Bears general manager called Antonio to ask if he was going to retire, Antonio told him "no way". Unfortunately he was heading into a year of free agency and had no hope for assignment given his injuries. But Antonio didn't give up hope or lose sight of his dream. This was a long journey and fighting through injuries early on may have prepared him mentally for what was to come. Fifteen months later Antonio was back in uniform, this time with the New York Jets. Months of hard work rehabbing and strength training all while completing a master's degree had paid off. Antonio had sent a workout tape to the Jets who thought it had been doctored up somehow. They called him to their practice facility for a one day workout and were taken back by what they saw. Rex Ryan assured Antonio he'd be a part of the practice squad by game six. With an injury to defensive lineman Chris Jenkins just before game six, he was signed. The Jets never called Antonio up so an old defensive coach from his Chicago days Ron Rivera decided to bring Antonio to San Diego where he currently served as defensive coordinator. On December 9th, 2009 Antonio was signed by the San Diego Chargers and has been an integral part of the team's defense. In 2010 he recorded 48 tackles, 5.5 sacks and barely missed making the pro bowl.

Antonio also made headlines this year with his unique hairstyles that included patterns and colors that ran into his beard. Trips to the barber are anywhere from four to six hours long and normally includes a healthy nap in the chair while stylist Sergio works his magic. But Antonio also used his fascination with hair to help someone that needed a break from their troubles. 


Garden Club to Meet next on February 17th




