Message from the President PUTTING AWAY FOR OUR TOWN'S TOMORROW ... CREATING A "MUNICIPAL ENDOWMENT ACCOUNT"

A novel idea to help provide Property Tax Relief . . .

Over 62 of our country's colleges and universities have endowment accounts that each exceeds 1 billion dollars. The 2nd largest of these endowment accounts in America is held by our state's very own Princeton

University with assets last year exceeding 17 billion dollars. In all cases, these assets have come from a long history of ongoing donations that are then set aside in untouchable accounts and invested, with the principal to remain intact. The annual interest is then used to fund a host of things from providing financial aid to helping offset professor's salaries.

How about if we voted in favor of having our town's fathers set aside each year 5% of our city's municipal and public school tax revenue: these monies then to be placed into a "municipal endowment account". This account would be forever, untouchable and its income used just like a university's endowment; to help offset our annual city's expenses for the benefit of the citizens of Rahway. Couple the financial benefits generated by such a "municipal endowment account" with budget discipline: then place them both in our town's financial tool box and we're really cooking with gasoline!

I'm calculating that in 50 years we might have in our "municipal endowment account", about 100 million dollars in principal and during each of those years we would have interest generated to help provide more and more property tax relief for our town. No quick fix, just following sound financial principles that over the long term create wealth and bring solid results. I'm a real estate broker by trade and not schooled specifically in finance but this concept sure appeals to me. If I could be assured that our town's future "municipal endowment account" could not be raided nor sacked, I'd endorse it and vote for it in a heartbeat. Wow...maybe then our State of New Jersey might follow suit and then who knows...maybe our federal government might do the same. Hey Rahway, let's start local and lead the way in helping to restore sound financial practices in this country.







RAHWAY'S MEMORIAL TO DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING JR.

In preparing for this column and the topics I plan to cover in 2012, the thought came to mind to present information on the monuments which stand in many of our neighborhoods. Each monument, whether civic or military, pays tribute to groups and/or individuals who should be remembered, and I think it would be interesting to tell the stories behind them. Since February is designated "Black History Month," this column will feature the memorial to Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Dr. King was one of the main leaders of the

American civil rights movement and one of the great orators in American history. His "I Have a Dream" speech delivered during the 1963 March on Washington, was pivotal in raising the nation's consciousness concerning the issues of civil rights. In 1964, Dr. King was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for his efforts to end segregation and racial discrimination through civil disobedience and other non–violent means. Tragically, he was assassinated on April 4, 1968 while in Memphis, Tennessee.

After his death, cities across the country honored Dr. King's memory by naming streets, parks, schools and other civic buildings after the slain leader. Many towns, including Rahway, chose to erect a monument to serve as a lasting tribute. The Rahway monument for Dr. King was unveiled as part of a three day observance in January, 1992. Under the direction of John J. Robertson, Chairman of the Memorial Park Committee, a campaign was developed to celebrate and memorialize Dr. King's legacy.

The three day series of events, all held in the Union County Arts Center, began on Saturday evening, January 18, with a road company presentation of the award winning musical "Ain't Misbehavin." On Saturday afternoon, a documentary film based on the life and contributions of Dr. King was shown. The Memorial Dedication Ceremony, the highlight of the three day observance, was held on Monday, January 20. From nine A.M. to 11:30, a program of speakers and musical selections

was presented in the theater. Senator Bill Bradley and Congressman Donald Payne were among the dignitaries who addressed the audience. The keynote speaker was the Reverend Dr. W. P. Collier Jr., administrative assistant to the Presiding Bishop of the First Episcopal District of the A.M.E. Church, Philadelphia, Pa. At the conclusion of the program, the assembly organized outside the Arts Center for a march to the memorial site.

The morning was bitter cold, but a crowd of more than two hundred made the walk down Irving Street to Broad Street to the triangle behind the train station for the unveiling. Once at the site, Elder Robert L. Bragg led the ceremony which included the laying of wreaths. When the cover was removed, a beautiful bronze bust of Dr. King atop a granite pillar was revealed. The sculpture was the creation of artisan Stanley Sawyer. The prayer of dedication was led by the Reverend Gerry M. Guess, Director of Communications, NAACP.

At the conclusion of the ceremonies, Chairman Robertson said, "It is a fitting tribute to Dr. King. It is a job well done and we owe it all to the committee and citizens of Rahway. This park will serve as a focal point for conversation."

Now, some twenty years later, pedestrians who pass by and train passengers who look down from the elevated platform can still view the monument and pause to reflect on the important legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

RAHWAY HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS PREPARE FOR HIGH STAKES TESTING

On March 6, 7, and 8, juniors at Rahway High School and throughout New Jersey will take the High School Proficiency Assessment (HSPA) which measures the knowledge and skills needed to be able to be a productive citizen and to succeed on the job, in college, or in the military. Students are required to pass the HSPA to graduate from high school. Freshmen and sophomores take another test that predicts how likely it is that they will pass the HSPA as juniors.

To help students prepare for this testing, Rahway has instituted a number of practices. Students are being instructed in small-group

tutorial sessions once a week. Mathematics teachers start each class with a warm-up (Do Now) problem that emphasizes an HSPA skill. Science teachers focus on data analysis activities similar to what the HSPA contains. Math Club members are creating HSPA posters for bulletin boards, and the broadcast journalism class (Kudos) is making commercials to appeal to students' minds and hearts in the days immediately before the test. Even art students have helped out by creating a motivational banner. Finally, on the day on which students take the test, they will start their day with a school-provided breakfast.

PRESIDENTIAL INSPIRATIONS

As you know from reading previous columns in this series, I consider our town's library a treasure and a hugely convenient asset for anyone looking to improve their knowledge, find

entertainment, or simply take pleasure in reading. There was a time in this country's past, however, when libraries were anything but common and convenient, and those desiring to learn had to take matters into their own hands.

This month, we remember two great American presidents—George Washington and Abraham Lincoln—and it is inspiring to realize that these men who attained the highest office in the land were, for the most part, self educated.

There were almost no libraries in America in 1732 when George Washington was born, and only 9 colleges chartered prior to the American Revolution. Given the nature of colonial life, education was a much more haphazard affair. So it is not surprising that Washington received only the equivalent of an elementary school education from a variety of tutors, with plans for a further education in England shelved upon his father's death.

Abraham Lincoln, born in 1809 on what was the American frontier, obtained approximately a year's worth of elementary education classes from itinerant teachers. An avid reader, Lincoln was for the most part a selfeducated man.

Today, schooling is organized and mandatory,

and libraries exist in practically every town. And getting to school or the library is nowhere near as arduous as in days gone by. So it is not required that you be a supremely motivated individual to acquire learning; you can simply take advantage of our wonderful library and the information it contains.





Provided in part by Massachusetts Audubon. Feb. 10th – Skunks emerge to mate about this time of year

Feb. 14th - Starlings begin their early spring whistling. Listen also for the songs of chickadees and titmice.

Feb. 17th - On a warm, sunny winter day, take a look at the base of a tree for snowfleas. They look like a sprinkling of pepper on the surface of the snow. Each speck you see is a snow flea. Once you find them, watch closely and see what they're up to

Feb. 20th - Purple finches begin singing their spring songs

Feb. 21st - New Moon which causes our Rahway River's high tides to be very high and our low tides to be very low

Feb. 24th – Maple sap begins running. Watch for little icicles at the tips of sugar maple twigs

Feb. 28th - If there is a snow melt, look for traces of tunnels dug by voles and shrews

Take a winter walk and enjoy our town's beautiful parks.

SPECIAL CEMETERY TOUR TO MARK 125TH ANNIVERSARY OF UNSOLVED MURDER

On the cold, Friday evening of March 25, 1887, the life of a young woman, whose identity has never been established, was brutally snuffed out by a fiendish killer, who, like the victim, has never been named.

March 25, 2012 will mark the 125th Anniversary of the murder of the unfortunate soul who has become part of Rahway lore known as "Rahway's Unknown Woman." To observe the anniversary of the infamous crime, the Merchants and Drovers Tavern Museum Association will host a special tour in the Rahway Cemetery based on this intriguing mystery on Sunday, March 25th.

On the afternoon of the tour, visitors will be

escorted to the graves of more than a dozen persons who were in some way involved in the case. Costumed interpreters will be stationed at the sites to portray the individuals and tell their stories. Tour groups will meet Frank Worth, one of the brothers who found the body, Daniel Ryno, the undertaker, Dr. Cladek, who performed the autopsy, and Mayor Daily, whose city was unnerved by the murder. Reverend Gay will speak on the funeral, City Clerk Franklin Marsh will relate facts about the hearing, and Railroad Freight Agent Richard Feist will tell a story about a suspicious passenger. Visitors will also meet the editor of the local paper, a mother whose son was accused of the crime, a juror and

a witness, the town crier, and a young woman who will share the fears enveloping her community.

The Unknown Woman Murder Mystery Tour has been featured on two occasions over the past ten years during the association's two-day October Cemetery Program and has proven to be their most popular theme. Because a large crowd is anticipated, reservations are strongly recommended. Tours will start at noon and leave every fifteen minutes. The last tour will go off at 4 PM. Admission is \$10 for Adults, \$8 for seniors, and \$5 for students.
